
District Membership

What a great finish to the 2010 - 2011 year. Congratulations to all the clubs for their efforts to support the Childhood Cancer Campaign. At the district convention donations from the Optimist Club of Raleigh, Whiteville Optimist Club,



Golden Circle Optimist Club, Duplin Optimist Club, Greenville Optimist Club, Roxboro Optimist Club and the new Northern Wake Optimist Club a totaled \$2252. Cash donations from individuals was \$84. The Mighty Duck Race raised another \$504. Our total from the district meeting was \$2840.

The ducks set off at race time and began their journey around the treacherous turns with Tom Lamont and his sidekicks cheering them on. Several clubs have begun their 2011 - 2012 Childhood Cancer fundraisers this fall. The Raleigh Optimist Club raised \$443.46, their best weekend collection



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yet. To schedule a fundraiser at Harris-Teeter stores, clubs need to go on-line and keep in mind that the months of March and May are blocked out because of in-store fundraisers. Dates need to be selected at least six weeks in advance.

I had the pleasure of taking donations of doctor kits, hand crocheted blankets, panda bears, and a couple \$1,000 checks to the Childhood Cancer Clinics at Duke and UNC. The Chapel Hill

Optimist Club raised \$1558.47 this year from their Kisses For Childhood Cancer collections. It has been my privilege to deliver this support for my club and also for those clubs in the district that donated the panda bears.

Thanks again for your support and generosity to the staff, the families and especially to the children being treated for childhood cancer. Your support makes a big difference in their lives and the success of their treatments.

Best Wishes to all of you! You will always have a special place in our hearts! I would like to thank each of you for the opportunity to serve as your Governor for 2010-2011.


