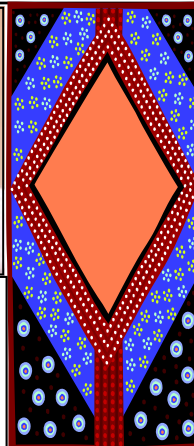

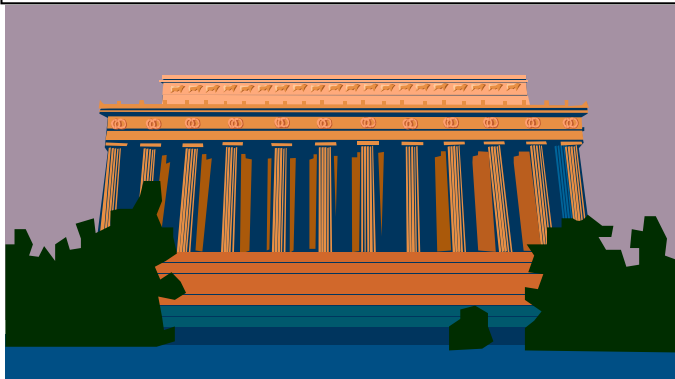

OI Foundation

This year we are celebrating the 40th anniversary of the Foundation. It took ten years for the Foundation to get its first \$1,000,000. Now we give about \$1,000,000 each year. The Foundation also gives back in many ways. It provides all the funding for the four scholarships in each district of Optimist International. It also provides funding to help with all the program materials that we use in our clubs. It has a pass through program that allows clubs to get donations where the money goes to the Foundation and then back to the club that secured the donation. In this way, the donor can get a tax deduction since most of our clubs do not have a 501-C3 status. There are many different levels of giving for the individual, from the Dime-a-Day Plus (\$40.) to the Christian D. Larson Award (\$1,000.). I am asking anyone that can to give at the President's Club level (\$250.) I know this is a significant level of giving, but the Foundation has a sig-

- Any Adult Club served by OIF is eligible to apply for a \$500 grant for a NEW project of the Club.

- Grants are for one year only.
- Club dues must be current.

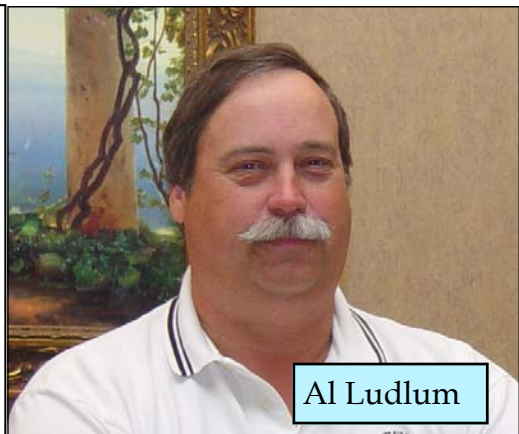
