What is CPA?

Community Projects Award

Most of our Clubs are already working in our individual communities to make things better and this is a great way to share some of the wonderful things that we do to make our world a little better. A Community Project Award is simply a way to document what we are doing, place it on a CD and submit it to Optimist International for a chance to win \$500 for our Club. Maybe the chance to win money is not an incentive for your club to create a CPA – but listed below are some other reasons a CPA may be beneficial for your club.

- The CPA can be used as a reference or a procedure for your projects, so that newer members will be better prepared to help lead club projects in the future.
- The CPA can help to publicize the projects your club is doing in the community and therefore will help to enhance the image of your club and Optimism.
- The CPA can stimulate membership involvement in meaningful club activities, thereby providing greater opportunity for individual involvement, which should enhance the desirability of memberships.
- The CPA will give other clubs in our District and also Nationwide an opportunity to learn of projects that they may like to perform in their own communities.

As your 2014-2015 Chairman, I am asking each club to work on submitting at least one CPA during the coming year. Each year the CPA has to be submitted to OI by December 15th. So we have until 12-15-2015 to complete CPAs and have them submitted. Clubs may submit in two new categories:

- 1. Best Film (with a video clip of 10 minutes or less on CD). Don't worry all you need it is a "Smart Phone" to create a film.
- 2. Best Writing in a CPA Entry (all documents submitted in .pdf form on CD).

"How My Optimism Will Help Me Press On To 'Greater Achievements of the Future'"

Fellow Optimists, can you name a single meaningful occupation that doesn't require the ability to speak in public? Not really, right? From the janitor to the judge, we must communicate verbally with those below, around, and above us at home, on the job, in the church and even in our own Optimist clubs. Yes, we MUST. Did you learn this early in life or as an adult?

Well, what if we could encourage youth in our community to develop their skills early in life. Moreover, what if we could give them recognition and even scholarships for developing their skills? What if we could spread the word in the schools and in the community that we are strongly supporting the social and intellectual development of their young people? Well, the longest standing (1928) Optimist project, the Oratorical Contest, does all this and more.

The club Oratorical Contest requires a few dedicated and informed members. You need to spread the word in the schools, through the newspapers, in the churches, and in the families. You need to arm yourself with the well thought-out suggestions on the Optimist International Website. You can go directly to the Oratorical information by loading this address in your computer's search engine: http://www.optimist.org/e/member/scholarships4.cfm. On the right side of this page is a box containing "Oratorical Contest Quick Links," and this will lead you to all the information you need to get started. Print the files out and study them...hard. On the one page Rules and Application (<a href="http://www.optimist.org/Form/Oratorical_RULES_PAD-www.optimist.org/Form/Oratorical_RULE

E_14_15.pdf) you can enter your club's information

and deadline with your computer. The other sites

included in this box give you detailed guidelines to

host a contest.

Hints for finding Oratorical Candidates

- 1. <u>Start Early</u> to make these contests known to the faculty and staff at or before this time. Note that the Optimist Oratorical Contest is recommended by both the National Association of Secondary School Principals and the American Association of School Administrators. This endorsement can go a long way when your Club is requesting that principals and teachers offer this program to their students.
- 2. <u>Use the Internet</u>: Contacts for each of the North Carolina public schools, charter schools, or private schools can be easily found by doing a search (Google, Bing, Yahoo search, or whatever you use on your computer). For example: search NC Public Schools, NC Charter Schools, or NC Private Schools. Or you can search more locally by typing in something such as Wake County, NC Public Schools (or your Local County or city) into your search engine. The directory for North Carolina public schools is located at: www.ncpublicschools.org/nceddirectory. Some Clubs have even given information and applications to local churches to share in their Sunday school classes and youth organizations.
- 3. <u>Contact Home Schoolers:</u> Many clubs have had success in getting contest candidates through their home school organizations. Because the families who home school their children are usually more flexible in their curriculums, they are often open to trying something new. Their website is located at: <u>www.nche.com</u> and there are many local home school sites.
- 4. Contact contestants who DID NOT WIN IN YEARS PAST. Keep names, addresses and ages of previous entrants. They may not have won in the past, but they now know how the contest works and

what winners sound like. (*Sorry, first, second, and third place winners in the District Contest in years gone by are not eligible*. I checked with OI about this.)

- 5. News releases are a good way to announce your upcoming contest and to recognize the winners (and publicize your Club's efforts) after the contest. A variety of sample news releases are available on the O.I. website. All you have to do is fill in the blanks! Newspaper releases can be found at the following location: www.optimist.org/e/member/marketing3.cfm.
- 6. <u>PSA's</u>: You can inform the public of the availability of the contest through a Public Service Announcement (PSA) on your local community radio station. A 30-second very professional PSA announcing the Oratorical Contest can be downloaded from the O.I. website and delivered to the station. See: www.optimist.org/e/member/marketing4.cfm.
- 7. <u>Awards:</u> For Club and Zone Contests order medallions and certificates of participation from Opti-

mist Supply (<u>www.optimistsupply.com</u>). Since you will have two representatives from your club advance to the Zone contest level it is recommended that two gold medals be awarded at the local club. Also, it is suggested that you order a silver and bronze medal for the next highest finishers. Therefore, the advancing contestants will be identified only as the gold medal winners and not identified as first and second place. This also applies to Zone Contests from which two contestants will advance to the District Oratorical Contest.



N.C. East District Essay Contest

"OPPORTUNITY SHOULD BE A Priority"

It's that time....time to reach out to kids in our communities and get them excited about participating in the District Essay Contest.....it's really EASY...connect with kids at county and city schools, your church, a neighbor, a relative, girl scouts, boy scouts, girl's and boy's clubs, sport teams, J.O.O.I. clubs, band members. There are plenty of OPPORTUNITIES. Make it a PRIORITY in your clubs to obtain participants.

The Essay Contest is sponsored by Optimist International to give young people the opportunity to write about their own opinions regarding the world in which they live. The approach can encompass a young person's personal experience, the experience of their country or a more historical perspective. In additional to developing skills for written expression, participants also have the opportunity to win a college scholarship!

Interested students prepare an essay on the preassigned topic and submit it to their local Optimist Club.

The essays are judged at the Club level, District level and the International level.

Applications, official rules and a program guide are available from the Optimist International website.

The official Club Essay Contest program planning guide (Club Chair Packet) contains full instructions, forms and planning materials for organizing and conducting your Club's Essay Contest. The planning guide includes a copy of the entry application and official rules. It is available on the Optimist International website at: www.optimist.org/Documents/

A package of materials on how to plan for the Essay Contest is available on the Package Programs page of the OI website: www.optimist.org/e/member/programs5.cfm. Here, Clubs can find useful materials that will help them organize and run their Essay Contest program.

Eligibility: Contestants must be under the age of 19 years who have not yet graduated from high school or the equivalent, regardless of when the Club, Zone, or District contest is held.

There is no minimum age. See the official contest rules for additional eligibility requirements. Students attending school on military installations outside the United States are eligible to enter in their last home of record. Students who have previously won an Optimist International Essay Scholarship are not eligible to compete in this competition again.

Topic: "Optimism Should be a Priority"

Length of Essay: The essay must be between 700 and 800 words in length.

Prizes: Club level – medallion. Clubs are allowed to give monetary awards of up to \$500 per winner for the Essay contest in addition to the official medallions. The Club level awards may be given in the form of a scholarship, savings bond or cash prize but are completely discretionary.

District level – Plaque and a \$2,500 college scholarship for the first-place winner.

International level – First-place: Winner's plaque and recognition in The Optimist magazine.

• Clubs entries must be delivered or mailed to the District chair and be postmarked no later than February 28, 2015. Entries must include all of the following four documents:

PERSONAL GROWTH AND IN-VOLVEMENT PROGRAM INSTRUCTIONS

The following instructions are only meant to be suggestions and it is not mandatory that you follow these procedures. PGI Achievements are now listed on the Club Rosters.

When a Member enrolls in the PGI Program they receive a Passport and enters his/her name, Club name and Club number on the front.

When an entire level is completed, the Club Director of Personal Growth, Club President or Secretary-Treasurer should sign and date the bottom

2014-15 Presidential Incentives

Points will be accumulated on a quarterly basis. The Districts and Region that have the most points will receive a paid registration for the New Orleans Convention for the first and second quarters and for the Quebec City Convention for the third and fourth quarters.

A. QUARTERLY DISTRICT & REGION AWARDS-Top District in Each Region & the Top Region

- (1) 10 points per New Club Built (Adult or JOOI)
- (2) One point per New Adult Member added including Charter Members (does not include JOOI members)
- (3) 120 Day List-10 points each District that has two or less Clubs on the list at Quarter end. Bonus: 15 points for each

District with no Clubs on the list at Quarter end.

(4) Foundations-One Point for every \$200 of unrestricted funds donated to either the OIF or CCOF during the Quarter with a limit of five points.



B. BANNER AWARD PROGRAM

- (1) Club level
- a. One new roll-up Creed banner per Adult Club Built
- b. One new roll-up Creed or Purposes banner for adding 15 New Adult Members (JOOI and Friends not included). Bonus: One additional new roll-up Creed or Purposes banner for adding another 15 New Adult Members (total of 30 New Adult Members).
- (2) District level

a. One new roll-up Creed or Purposes banner for having built three New Adult Clubs.

C. BUILDERS OF EXCELLENCE

New Clubs may be sponsored by two existing Clubs and up to **four** Builders of Excellence may be named.

D. 30 UNDER 30 PROGRAM

The 30 Under 30 Membership program will continue during the 2014-15 Optimist year. A New Member that is aged 30 or under may join Optimist for \$30 International dues and Registration fee for one year. When the year is over, the Member pays full International dues.

The Foundation's motto is "Helping Optimist Help Kids". That's a very simple statement, but it says a lot. The Foundation really does help Optimist help kids. First, all of the scholarships, a total of \$10,000, comes directly from the Foundation and back to the youth in our district. They also provide funding to help defray the cost of all the Optimist materials we receive from Optimist International. With Childhood Cancer being a major emphasis with our organization, the Foundation donated \$500,000 to John Hopkins Hospital for Childhood Cancer research.

Many of the clubs in our district are great contributors to the Foundation. There are also many individuals that support the Foundation very well. We have close to fifteen in the North Carolina East District that are members of the President's Club (\$250.00 donation each year). There are several levels of giving for clubs and individuals. The beginning level for individuals is called the Dime-A-Day member. For a \$36.50 donation, you become a Dime-A-Day member. There are other levels, but if you are not a Foundation supporter, let me encourage you to start with the Dime-A-Day. I will be happy to discuss this with any of you at the district meeting or visit your club to talk about the Foundation.

If your club has not been a regular giver to the Foundation, I would also like you to encourage your club to give a minimum of \$365, if your funding is so you can do that.

Each club that donates as much as \$365 will get a banner patch and recognition at the district meeting, plus the feeling of knowing you are also helping kids in that manner.




