Boys & Girls Homes Ray Cockrell, Chair

I shared with you just about this time last year how fantastic your cottage looks! The renovation to the living areas of the cottage transformed the look and feel of the cottage. You have done it again!! We are just now finishing up the renovation of the bedrooms. No more tile floor! No more cinderblock walls! Fresh paint! It looks amazing!!



We are so blessed by all of you that continue to believe in our work and provide support for YOUR Optimist Cottage. Optimist Day in April provided for a wealth of needs for the cottage, and we are in pretty good shape there. There are other needs for our kids on campus. I have shared with you about our Child Advocacy Center (CAC). This is the program that provides services for victims of sexual assault. We provide a forensic interview and a medical exam that helps to put the perpetrator away! We then continue to work with the victim and their family to provide clinical, therapeutic and healing services. What an amazing program! Here are some of the needs for this team:

- \$25 Gas cards (for families who identify a financial burden coming to the appointment)
- \$25 Gift Cards
- Food Lion/Walmart/Hills (for families that identify food insecurity on our needs assessment)
- Instant meals (small cups of macaroni and cheese, Chef Boyardee, etc.)
- New stuffed animals for the "Zoo"
- Puzzles (chunky wooden or 25 piece or less)
- New soft/fleece blankets for children's medical exams
- Personal hygiene items (toothbrush/ toothpaste, deodorant, combs, body wash, shampoo/conditioner, feminine products)
- 1 pack of mega blocks
- Board games (for all ages)
- New white t-shirts (sizes adult small & adult medium)
- Individual wrapped snacks/chips/cookies
- Juice Boxes
- Small Bottled Water
- Larger items/Projects: (Call us for specifics!)
- New rugs (for the advocate waiting room and interview room)
- Flowers planted/updated landscape Pressure washing/gutters cleaned
- Storage bins



Remember that we are willing to go anywhere anytime to share the message of the positive work we are doing for kids at Boys and Girls Homes. I hope you will reach out to invite myself or Tom Lamont, Director of Community Engagement to do a program for your club. I know you know what we do, yet we are making a lot of changes and would love to come and update you on what is happening in your cottage and on our campus.

New Club Building Linda Shepherd – Golden Circle, Elm City

Despite my efforts to accomplish the desired results expected of me as New Club-Building Chair, it saddens me to report that, as of this writing, no new clubs have been built in the NC East District this Optimist year. There was quite a bit of publicity, including personal contacts, flyers, and newspaper articles, early on in an attempt to build a club in the Outer Banks area. Governor Terry and I traveled to Kitty Hawk in February to conduct an informational meeting, but there was no response from the local citizenry. I have continued to try to contact OBXers who have a following, even speaking to someone I met on a cruise ship in Alaska recently!

My repeated efforts to make contact with the right persons of authority on two military bases in our district also proved futile.

As early as March, we had the understanding that there were the required number of interested students to build a college club at Wake Tech. Upon meeting virtually with college staff, we were told we could not complete the process until classes started for the new school year in August. However, it now seems that there are no students who are committed to join. Additionally, I understand that the student who was eagerly soliciting other students to get this club in place is now considering transferring elsewhere to study!

I scheduled an appointment with the Mayor of Apex in March, and he supported the idea of organizing an Optimist club there, even introducing me to the staff at the Apex Senior Center where our first informational meeting was held in April. With the help of



publicity sent out from the Senior Center, several interested individuals came to our first meeting on a Friday morning, and four people registered right away to become members. In May, we followed up with two more morning meetings at a church, and welcomed two additional members. Since then, we have held evening meetings in restaurants in order to attract people who work in the daytime. To date, we have a total of eight registered members with at least one more application being completed to turn in at our next meeting. We have established a location to have meetings and even a willing club president. The Garner Optimist Club has accepted to sponsor and offer guidance to this new club, and a few Garner Optimists have already been very supportive with their presence and enthusiasm at our meetings. It is our fervent hope that this new club will have the required fifteen member applicants with at least nine of them present so that chartering can become official at our fourth quarter convention.

Governor Terry and I have met virtually several times with Jim Boyd, OI Director of Strategic Growth. We have followed his suggestions and applied his ideas, but at this point nothing has come to fruition. Nevertheless, I will continue to press on expectantly until my term as chair ends on September 30. After all, an Optimist never gives up, right?




conducted it as a contest, but could not give a scholarship to her. I presented her a cash prize of \$100 from the District, along with the teacher donating \$250.

Here is what we did:



community. We shared how we did that and what we learned. This activity made the Optimist Creed a living



The topic this year was "How to Change the World with Optimism." Each competitor offered their unique perspective on that topic.





Three of our NC East qualifiers actually played at the tournament in Doral, FL. Our best player tied for 18th place, and the next best player tied for


67th place – out of a total of 606 players.



Lt. Governor Reports

Angela – Zones 3 & 4

Roanoke Rapids had 185 kids playing T-Ball. Up plus Five members. Had a Boston Butt Sale fundraiser.

Elm City – sponsored Middle School, May 2nd is Bunco, then 'Kisses for Xmas' fundraiser.

Golden Circle – two new members, lost Celia Wise. Had 2 Essay entries. Robin made a beautiful quilt. Have given over 1500 stuff animals to the police department. Greenville didn't attend. They raised money through concessions at ECU football.

Blackbird – Oratorical Contest and Essay Contest. They helped the Salvation Army helped with bell ringing. The Zone is looking good.

David J. – Zone 5 - Henderson, Wake Forest, North Wake and Roxboro

East Wake small buy mighty. Thanksgiving and Christmas Meals, Gifts to children, Bingo night raised over \$2,000. Meals for kids 2x per month. Applying for grants. Garner – very active. Seven Scholarships to kids on an application basis. BUG program – 'Bringing up a Grade' is a Middle School program. Town of Garner named

their parade – the 'Garner Optimist Club Parade'! I was blown away by attendance. 33 members present – it was crowded.

Raleigh Club – 44 members. Meeting at the Farm. Scouts, sports teams, football, volleyball, robotics club all rent facilities and fields. Xmas trees sold \$10K and cleared \$7K, \$2k grant local community, Essay contest had a few entries, youth mentoring, Boys2Men – interpersonal growth, Pond/Fishing program – catch and release and give out trophy's for biggest, smallest, turtle on hook, etc. Lasts through August. Ed Moore takes 20 families with children that have cancer to the beach. All expenses paid for the weekend. This year they are going to Myrtle Beach (instead of Atlantic Beach).

Bennie – Zone 1 – Wilmington, Winter Park, Cape Fear and Wilmington Supper

Three clubs represented today.

Two clubs starting Ball today. WP rebuilding Optimist Cottage. Held Essay contest.

Auston – Cape Fear is a very busy club. A-Team, club. Average age of our club is 70 years old. Car show every year. Fall and Spring Ball. Travel Ball taken over Rec Ball. Not a lot of scholarship money out there for players. Major facelift and getting new members to grow. Essay winner in top three of District. We are the largest club in the District! We serve good food too.

Terry - I visited a couple of weeks ago. Visited Clubhouse and complex. Seven ball fields. Concessions, restrooms. Really impressive 3rd Tuesday they feed the club. They put out a good spread.

We are doing things. We need to continue this. Don't complain about OI or District. Just keep helping the kids. In 2010 we had 29 clubs and 700+ members. Now we have more clubs and less members.

Easy for us and them. We had 22 last year. 8 qualifier's. Need four spotters on the course. Making 25 bags. Carolina Golf contacts all high schools. Terry – Gary Pender not here to talk about CCDHH. Have only one contestant so far.

Foundation – Dime a Day – every Optimist needs to donate to the Foundation. This is where scholarship money comes from for Essay, Oratorical and CCDHH grants. They provide a lot of training sponsorships. Next meeting bring back the jars full of dimes. Will get a discount on registration for Q4 meeting.

The Oratorical Contest will start at 1:30. We have seven contestants. Please stay here and watch the kids. Lunch will be from Smithfield's BBQ @ noon.

Membership

Auston – Lost 80 members. Now 77 down. Seek out new members. Bring in at least one new member. Will bring it up by a third. Sell what you do. 77 down- CRA's last year – Benson Club closed but we lost 38. They were tired of paying dues. Start a new club. You have to be a part of that club. Member & Mentor to the club. New clubs tend to close and very few hang on. They don't mind volunteering. They just don't want to be a member of an organization. FOO's – was \$100, now \$140. Plays havoc on members... Past FOO's have to pay an extra \$40 this year. Betty got a '5 New Member' pin. Cape Fear will feed you 15x per year.

Linda – FOO – if club has money – they could pay the extra

Angela – Club gets back \$56 from OI for FOO.

Auston – The FOO is not a liability.

Sandy - VP needs to take this back to OI. There's some logic for the \$140.
