



att. "He comes to us after serving as president and CEO at Southstone Behavioral




Health Center in Virginia. He had previously served as president and CEO of Buckhorn Children & Family Services. His experiences with those organizations will help him guide B&GH into the future."

"I am looking forward to working with Ricky," said Faircloth. "I will do everything I can to achieve a smooth transition."






