

What a fun time was had by Optimists representing all zones in the North Carolina East District when we participated in Optimist Day at the NC Boys and Girls Homes at Lake Waccamaw

on Saturday, April 12! Optimists from the NC West District were there also, so it was a special time of renewing friendships as well as making new ones with fellow Optimists.

The day began with a general session in the beautiful and serene chapel where we learned about some of the programs that are offered to benefit the boys and girls who live on campus and details related to the foster care and adoption program.

Afterward, a short walk over to our Optimist cottage gave us an opportunity to tour the cottage and greet the young ladies who currently reside there. From

there, we were transported around the campus to see Thomas Academy and the gymnasium, where students have their schooling, athletic events, and even a prom! We were shown to the equine area where the young residents learn the skills of horsemanship, how to care for horses, and how to trust again--an important aspect of trauma therapy. Perhaps you are not aware that on this campus, students can experience farm life, auto mechanics, and even how to care for a baby! Yes, on this campus at Lake Waccamaw, there are LAKE houses. In this case, LAKE stands for Learning and Knowledgeable Environment, and it is where teen mothers learn to show love and take proper care of their babies under the tutelage of house mothers who set the example and assist in the care while the young mothers

continue their schooling. When our touring was finished, we came in from the chilly outside air to find that a delicious



meal had been prepared for us by the kitchen staff. Campus residents were present to enjoy

the meal alongside those of us who were their adult quests! There was a brief sharing time with the serious business of several financial contributions along with the tomfoolery of grown men demonstrating the ability to do handstands and even walk around on their hands! What a relaxing way to bring the day's activities to a close! Then it was time to say good-bye for most people. However, a few members of the Wake Forest Club and East Wake Club could be found planting flowers to beautify the yard around the Optimist cottage.

If you have never been to see the NC Boys and Girls Homes at Lake Waccamaw, I hope that, after

reading this article, you will realize that it is well worth your time and gas to see this facility which provides a safe and loving environment where children who were not able to experience such kindness in the home of their parents are now thriving. I am very proud that Optimists across our state support the NC Boys and Girls Homes, not only financially, but also with gifts of items needed and requested for the ultimate benefit of the young residents.

If you have any interest in helping with this event, please let me know. I need all the volunteers I can aet.



points were made. I was able to share experiences and the hard work that the Wake Forest High




School JOI Club has done. The result was interest in starting clubs in elementary, middle, and high school. I will be collaborating with Vance County High School to




New Club Building (NCB) David Griffiths, Garner


