of the SkyLift, the Gatlinburg SkyBridge is the longest pedestrian suspension bridge in North America and offers an exhilarating experience. Spanning 680 feet across a deep valley in a single span, SkyBridge is 140 feet high at its midpoint with glass-floor panels in the middle of the span. Guest can walk at their own pace to take in the spectacular setting and panoramic views of the smokles.
