CAT & DOG FOSTERING FAQ

What does it mean to foster a pet? When you foster a pet, you provide a temporary home for an animal prior to adoption. Fostering animals is a wonderful and personal way to contribute to saving homeless pets. Dogs and cats are the most common pets needing foster homes.

Why do animals need foster care? There are several possible reasons:

- Foster care can help save an animal's life when a shelter is full, and it frees up space for more animals to be saved.
- Some animals don't do well in a shelter environment because they are frightened or need a little extra care.
