In November 1911 in Detroit, Michigan, a professional road racer Louis Chevrolet and General Motors founder Billy Durant founded the Chevrolet Motor Car Company; overtaking Ford as the best – selling car company in the United States by 1929.

The Phoenix is a symbol of immortality. It obtains new life by rising from the ashes of its predecessor.



1935 Studebaker

Lincoln is an American luxury automobile brand, operated under the Ford Motor Company.

Edsel Ford picked the leaping greyhound to grace the hood of the Lincoln car.

Lyons (Jaguar) didn't start putting cats on the bonnets of his cars until almost a decade after Ford put dogs on their Lincolns. Lincoln started using greyhounds on their radiator caps in the 1920s, and Fords would wear them in the early 1930s, also before Jaguar leaper.

A Lincoln brochure, circa 1925 states:

"The greyhound – known for its swiftness and stamina, for grace and beauty in action – has become the emblem of Lincoln cars. Its poised, silvery body, extended neck, and flowing tail are the radiator cap of every new Lincoln. Long, lithe and sinuous, the greyhound best typifies Lincoln's speed and grace, beauty and class."

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Excalibur

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The Excalibur automobile is a Neo-classical car inspired by the 1928 Mercedes-Benz SSK by Brooks Stevens for Studer. It was first produced in 1964.

From 1964, over 300 Excaliburs were built by The Excalibur Corporation of Milwaukee, Wisconsin were shipped to dealers and distributors around the world. Excaliburs have been owned by many famous people, including Frank Sinatra, Steve McQueen, Dick Van Dyke, Tony Curtis, Shirley Jones, Sonny and Cher, Dean Martin, and Jackie Gleason. One of the most enthusiastic owners was Phyllis Diller - she purchased four of them. The King of Spain was one of their last customers. The company ceased production in 1997.



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
