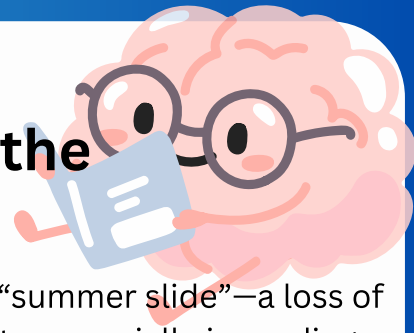

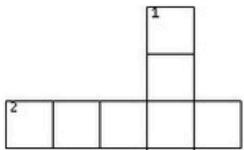

Join us each Thursday for hands-on activities, guest presenters, crafts, and more. These events support learning through fun and community connection.

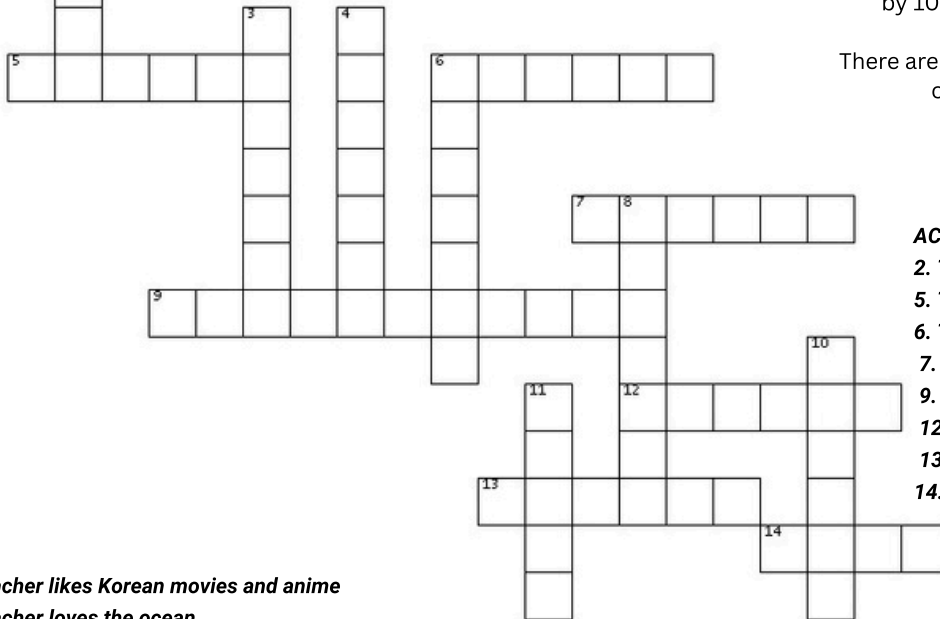
