1. Petitioner MAT WAHLSTROM ("Petitioner" or "WAHLSTROM") (hereinafter referred to as "Petitioner"), on behalf of himself, the citizens and voters in the City of San Diego and the 78<sup>th</sup> Assembly District as well as the general public, respectfully petition this Court for a Writ of Mandate issued as an alternative writ or a peremptory writ under California Code of Civil Procedure ("CCP") § 1084 et seq., directed to the CALIFORNIA FAIR POLITICAL PRACTICES COMMISSION and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, (collectively hereinafter "FPPC") because FPPC failed to comply with all applicable provisions of the California Constitution, common law, statutes and regulations and/or have acted in a manner that is arbitrary, capricious and/or an abuse of discretion and for which there is no adequate remedy at law relative to the matter referenced

below. Additionally, Petitioner WAHLSTROM seeks an order from this Court to exclude STEVEN J. KAUFMAN and DOES 51 through 100 (collectively hereinafter "KAUFMAN", and each of them, from participation in this action and related San Diego Superior Court Case No:37-2019-00043494-CU-JR-CTL pursuant to Government Code §87400 et seq. In support of the forgoing, this verified Petition alleges on information and belief and seeks relief as follows:

#### **VENUE**

2. The individuals, campaign committees and Assembly District which are the subject of this Petition are all located within the judicial district of the Central District of the San Diego County Superior Court. There is also a related case involving these parties and similar issues pending in Department 65 of this Court as Case No:37-2019-00043494-CU-JR-CTl before the Honorable Ronald F. Frazier (hereinafter the "Related Case").

#### **PARTIES**

- 3. Petitioner WAHLSTROM is and at all times herein mentioned herein was a citizen and registered voter in the City of San Diego and 78<sup>th</sup> Assembly District. WAHLSTROM is beneficially interested in the issuance of the requested writ as he desires to ensure Respondents properly perform their statutory duties in the manner required by law to ensure that all applicable laws and regulations relating to elections and campaign finance are faithfully and fully obeyed and implemented.
- 4. Respondent FPPC is a California government entity created in 1974 when California voters passed Proposition 9, now known as the Political Reform Act. One purpose of Respondent FPPC is to administer and enforce the Political Reform Act ("PRA"). According to the FPPC's website "[t]he mission of the Fair Political Practices Commission is to promote the integrity of state and local government in California through fair, impartial interpretation and enforcement of political campaign, lobbying and conflict of interest laws."
- 5. KAUFMAN is an attorney representing Real Party in Interest TODD GLORIA before the FPPC in the matter referenced below as well as in the Related Case.

- 6. KAUFMAN LEGAL GROUP, APC, is a California corporation and attorneys of record for Real Party in Interest TODD GLORIA before the FPPC in the matter referenced below as well as in the Related Case.
- 7. The true names and capacities of Respondents identified herein as DOES 1 through 100, inclusive, are unknown to Petitioner. Petitioner is informed and believes, and based thereon alleges, that Respondents DOES 1 through 100, inclusive, are individuals, corporations and/or agencies with involvement, jurisdiction and/or control over the subject matter of this action. Petitioner will seek leave to add the true names and capacities of said DOE Respondents when the true names of same are ascertained.
- 8. Real Party in Interest TODD GLORIA ("GLORIA") resides in and at all times herein mentioned herein was the elected representative of California's 78<sup>th</sup> Assembly District ("AD78"), which consists primarily of the coastal communities of the City of San Diego. TODD GLORIA is a candidate for elected office in the November 2020 election. GLORIA has an interest in this action because he was the subject of the complaints filed with FPPC, and the FPPC's actions/inactions thereon, which are the subject of this action. Therefore, Real Party in Interest GLORIA is a necessary party to this action.
- 9. The true names and capacities of Real Parties in Interest identified herein as ROES 1 through 100, inclusive, are unknown to Petitioner. Petitioner is informed and believes, and based thereon alleges, that Real Parties in Interest ROES 1 through 100, inclusive, have some interest in the complaints filed with FPPC, and the FPPC's actions/inactions thereon, which are the subject of this action and are therefore necessary parties in this action. Petitioner will seek leave to amend his Petition to state the true names and capacities of such ROE Real Parties in Interest when the same are ascertained.

### FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION (Writ of Mandate Against FPPC)

- 10. Petitioner incorporates the prior allegations as through fully recited herein.
- 11. FPPC's November 21, 2019 Stipulation, Decision and Order relative to GLORIA, attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** (bates range 1-4) (hereinafter the "GLORIA Order"), is void because it

fails to comply with applicable provisions of the California Constitution, common law, statutes and/or regulations and/or is arbitrary, capricious or an abuse of discretion based on the documents, facts and circumstances referenced herein and subsequently disclosed in discovery.

12. Attached hereto as Exhibit 2 (5-273) is the September 11, 2019 Sworn Complaint WAHLSTROM filed with FPPC via its Electronic Complaint System (hereinafter the "WAHLSTROM Complaint") alleging various violations of law by GLORIA and his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 campaign fundraising committee. As further evidence of GLORIA's violations of applicable law, WAHLSTROM attached to the WAHLSTROM Complaint the following documents:

13. By way of the WAHLSTROM Complaint, WAHLSTROM alleged to the FPPC and re-alleges here as follows:

In violation of the Political Reform Act, Todd Gloria (1) rolled over surplus funds from his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2018 committee into his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee, (2) accepted donations into his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee, and (3) spent money from his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee before he declared his intention to run for re-election to the Assembly in 2020 by filing his Statement of Intention (Form 501). After the press reported these violations, he filed his Statement of Intention to run for Assembly, under penalty of perjury, on August 13, 2019. At all times since at least December 20, 2018, Mr. Gloria has been running for Mayor of the City of San Diego.

Despite filing his Form 501 on August 13, 2019, Mr. Gloria was not a candidate for re-election to the Assembly; notwithstanding the filing, at no time has he ever been a candidate for re-election in 2020. In fact, on March 27, 2019, he donated money to another candidate for the same office, Christopher Ward, and donated money from his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee to Mr. Ward's Assembly committee. Mr. Gloria also endorsed Mr. Ward as his replacement in the Assembly.

On the same day that Mr. Gloria filed his Form 501 under penalty of perjury for the Assembly, his campaign manager, Nick Serrano, went on Twitter and denied that his boss was running for the Assembly. That following day, Mr. Gloria himself went on Twitter and posted this message: "Some news reports have suggested that I am seeking re-election to the Assembly. I want to be very clear: I am not running for the Assembly, I am running for Mayor. [¶] My Assembly committee remains open to fulfill my responsibilities as Member of the State Assembly until the end of my current term."

Mr. Gloria is not a candidate for the Assembly in 2020 but has been raising money into and spending money from his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee for political purposes other than his campaign for re-election to the Assembly – because he never has been and to this day is not running for re-election to that office – and not for any related legislative or governmental purposes. Mr. Gloria has been endorsed by the San Diego County Democratic Party, and I believe he intends to use the money rolled into and raised by his Todd Gloria for 2020 committee for political purposes associated with his Mayoral campaign (either directly or through the Party).

Attached to this sworn complaint (i.e., uploaded herewith) is a copy of my complaint against Mr. Gloria in San Diego County Superior Court, along with the application for a temporary restraining order that I recently filed and Mr. Gloria's opposition thereto. My sworn complaint is based on the information contained in my TRO filing.

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In opposition to my TRO, Mr. Gloria's attorney filed an opposition that included a copy of a letter that the attorney sent to the FPPC's Enforcement Division Chief, Galena West. In the letter, Mr. Gloria's lawyer's makes a number of false claims. First, he claims that "the contributions received by the Committee to date have been small in number and total a relatively small amount." That is false because his Assembly 2020 committee raised approximately \$25,000 in donations, which is not small. Furthermore, his Assembly 2020 committee received a transfer of more than \$290,000 from his Assembly 2018 committee, and Government Code section 82015(b)(2) defines "contributions" to include transfers "of anything of value received by a committee from another committee."

Second, the lawyer claims that Mr. Gloria's failure to file the Form 501 was brought to the FPPC's attention as soon as the failure had been brought to Mr. Gloria's attention. That claim is misleading at best. Mr. Gloria has known all along that he had to file the Form 501 in order to open a new committee for his (bogus) campaign for re-election to the Assembly. He is a seasoned, experienced politician and candidate. He has run for different offices many times and knows the purpose of the Form 501 and is aware that it is a legal prerequisite to forming a committee, receiving any contribution (whether a donation or transfer), and spending money from that committee. In fact, he filed his Form 501 in December 2018 for his Mayoral campaign, before he started raising money. If he truly were running for both offices at the same time, he would have filed his Form 501 for re-election to the Assembly and before being called out by the press. His claim that he made an honest mistake is a fabrication; he made a calculated decision based on the supposition that if he got caught, he would simply ask for forgiveness. His real goal has been to raise money under the auspices of running for re-election a state office (despite having no intention to seek re-election to that office) and take advantage of the higher donation limits for state office (more than four times the \$1,150 limit imposed on his Mayoral campaign under City of San Diego regulations), and then transfer his war chest from his bogus Assembly 2020 committee to his Mayor 2020 committee and/or the San Diego County Democratic Party.

This plan not only violated the Form 501 requirement, but it is another form of money laundering that you should investigate and punish. Mr. Gloria is raising money through his Assembly 2020 committee – all of which so far has come from non-individual sources that could not lawfully donate to his Mayor 2020 committee – in order to gain an unfair advantage in his Mayoral campaign.

When the judge initially denied my ex parte TRO request, he authorized me to file a formal motion for a preliminary injunction based on normal motion scheduling. I am asking the FPPC to enjoin Mr. Gloria's use of his Assembly 2020 funds for any purpose other than legislative or government purposes until the FPPC and/or the Superior Court has issued a final ruling on my sworn complaint. Because Mr. Gloria's Mayoral committee has raised more than \$700,000 so far and he has outraised all of his competition, he would not be harmed by an injunction.

At a minimum, you should require Mr. Gloria, not his surrogates, to testify under oath based on personal knowledge, not information and belief, about (1) whether he has ever been running for re-election to the Assembly in 2020; (2) if so, whether he is still running for re-election; and (3) if he is was running but is no longer running for re-election, when did he stop. You should also require him to testify under oath based on personal knowledge whether he was running for re-election at the time he filed the Form 501 on August 13, 2019.

- 14. In anticipation of and in an attempt to pre-empt the WAHLSTROM Complaint GLORIA, through his attorney KAUFMAN, filed his own Self-Referral Complaint (attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** (274-277)) with the FPPC on August 14, 2019.
- 15. Attached hereto as **Exhibit 4** (278-279) is a copy of FPPC's August 23, 2019 letter to GLORIA, by way of KAUFMAN, acknowledging "you notified the Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission of a potential violation of the Political Reform Act's (the "Act") campaign disclosure provisions related to Mr. Gloria's late filing of the Form 501 Candidate Intention Statement."
- 16. The GLORIA/KAUFMAN Self- Referral Complaint (**Exhibit 3**) intentionally mischaracterizes the severity of GLORIA's violation of California law relative to his Form 501 Candidate Intention Statement by stating:

Upon review of the Committee's records following a press inquiry, it appears that the Committee's treasurer inadvertently failed to file a Form 501 - Candidate Intention Statement at the time the Committee was initially formed. The Form 501 has since been filed, a date-stamped copy of which is enclosed. Otherwise, the Committee has properly and timely reported all of its activities, as required by the Political Reform Act.

- 17. WAHLSTROM contends, as alleged in his WAHLSTROM Complaint and as evidenced in the exhibits attached thereto (Exhibit 2), GLORIA's violation of California law was much more significant than a late filing caused by an "inadvertent" oversight. Instead, WAHLSTROM contends GLORIA committed perjury on his Form 501 Candidate Intention Statement for his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 campaign fundraising committee because he never intended to run for that office and therefore was not permitted to form a committee and receive campaign contributions for an office he was not running for.
- 18. WAHLSTROM contends, as alleged in his WAHLSTROM Complaint and as evidenced in the exhibits attached thereto (**Exhibit 2**), GLORIA's Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 campaign fundraising committee was a sham and fraud to allow him to collect campaign

contributions from contributors who were otherwise prohibited by San Diego City law from contributing to his Todd Gloria for Mayor 2020 and launder them for the benefit of his campaign to be elected Mayor of San Diego in 2020.

19. WAHLSTROM further contends, and alleges the GLORIA/KAUFMAN Self-Referral Complaint (Exhibit 3) intentionally included the following language so FPPC could divert the GLORIA matters into its "Streamline Program" to avoid scrutiny of GLORIA's egregious, brazen and illegal conduct and allow for its disposition with little more than a slap on the wrist:

We do not believe that the Committee's inadvertent oversight warrants any further action. Nonetheless, in determining what action, if any, to take against the Committee, we urge you to consider the totality of the facts and circumstances giving rise to this matter, including the fact that the Committee filed the Form 501 as soon as it discovered that it had not been filed; the public harm was negligible because the Form 410 - Statement of Organization filed by the committee upon its formation, contained virtually identical information as is listed on the Form 501; the contributions received by the Committee to date have been small in number and total a relatively small amount; and the Form 501 has been filed well before the election. Finally, we ask you to take into account that, upon becoming aware of this issue, the Committee decided to proactively present this matter to you for a speedy resolution of the issue.

20. WAHLSTROM further contends, and alleges, that prior to, during and after the FPPC's adjudication of the GLORIA Complaints referenced herein, GLORIA's attorney Kaufman was employed by and acted as the lead consultant to the FPPC to draft, implement and suggest ongoing revisions to the regulations, processes and procedures that implement FPPC's "Streamline Program" by which the GLORIA Complaints were adjudicated as evidenced by **Exhibit 5** (280-282) attached hereto and he states:

We appreciate the opportunity to serve the Commission and the People of California on these significant issues of public importance. We look forward to working with the Commission as we enter this next election cycle.

21. WAHLSTROM further contends, and alleges KAUFMAN's concurrent work for GLORIA and FPPC creates an illegal conflict of interest that voids the FPPC's GLORIA Order.

election committee even though he wasn't really running for re-election, then used the money in ways that supported his 2020 campaign for mayor of San Diego.

Total proposed fine: \$200.

Gloria created the 2020 re-election campaign early in 2019 and transferred the money from the 2018 committee before the funds became "surplus" under the law, which limits their use in politics. It was illegal because Gloria didn't file the required Statement of Intention to run in 2020 before opening the committee to raise money. Those forms have to be signed under penalty of perjury. The statement was finally filed on August 13, after a community newspaper questioned the campaign manager about the missing form. The FPPC says Gloria's campaign "self-reported" the omission. The Enforcement Division reached a quick settlement in its "streamline" program for minor violations, checking the box on the form marked, "Found no evidence of intent to conceal."

Judge for yourself.

By pretending to be a candidate for re-election in 2020, Gloria was able to raise more money from individual donors than was allowed by city election rules in San Diego. The per-donor contribution limit is \$4,700 for the Assembly campaign, but only \$1,150 in the mayor's race.

Gloria's \$200 fine is set to be considered by the FPPC at its meeting on November 21.

In comparison, another case on the November agenda involves Scott Jackson, who was elected in 2016 as a Superior Court judge in Alameda County. Jackson hired a professional treasurer, who filed the required pre-election campaign finance reports with the Alameda County Registrar of Voters. However, because the campaign raised more than \$25,000, it was also supposed to file the same reports with the Secretary of State's office, and the treasurer neglected to do that. The FPPC Enforcement Division contacted the campaign about the omission. Jackson hired a new treasurer, had all the reports reviewed and filed, and "fully cooperated" with the investigation, according to the FPPC's stipulated agreement.

The proposed fine against Judge Jackson is \$6,000 for three counts of "violating the Political Reform Act."

What is going on in this agency? We don't know, because there's no oversight of any kind. But consider its 2017 resolution of cases involving high-level political figures including former Gov. Jerry Brown.

In 2016, Consumer Watchdog filed a sworn complaint with the FPPC alleging that millions of dollars in political contributions from energy companies, including the investor-owned utilities such as PG&E, were being laundered through the California Democratic Party to evade contribution limits to campaigns and to influence decisions made by the Brown administration.

FPPC Enforcement Chief Galena West responded to the organization in a letter dated September 23, 2016, stating that the agency would open an investigation into the California Democratic Party, but not "the other persons identified in your complaint." Gov. Brown was not investigated.

Here's how that case, No. 16/19635, turned out: the FPPC determined that the California Democratic Party and its treasurer "failed to identify the committee bank account as 'all purpose: failed to notify a recipient of contributions from which account the funds derived, and failed to deposit contributions into the correct account." Total fine: \$3,500.

In a scathing letter to the FPPC dated May 24, 2017, Consumer Watchdog accused the Enforcement Division of failing to interview witnesses and ignoring evidence in that case as well as in case No. 16/263, which involved Nancy McFadden, a former Pacific Gas & Electric executive who became a top adviser to Brown. She failed to disclose energy-related holdings on her required annual Statement of Economic Interests for three years straight, at a time when legislation affecting her holdings was moving through the state Legislature. The FPPC fined her a total of \$300.

As you know, I have more than a passing interest in this subject. Last month, the FPPC approved a fine against me for what they acknowledge is the unintentional late filing of some pre-election reports in a 2013 special election for the Assembly, when I was a first-time state candidate with an all-volunteer campaign. Although the Enforcement Division wrote in 2017 that my campaign had "substantially complied" with the law, that I had made a good-faith effort throughout, and that there was no evidence of intent to conceal or deceive, the commission approved a fine of \$11,500.

At the FPPC's next meeting on November 21, the commissioners will consider whether to approve the stipulated agreements reached with Assemblyman Todd Gloria and Judge Scott Jackson. Then, at a second meeting on November 22, the commissioners will hear from Enforcement Division chief Galena West about "topics for input and discussion from the public and the Commission." Among the topics: "Analysis of 2019 Enforcement Trends."

25. Attached hereto as **Exhibit 9** (296-297) is an email dated November 18, 2019 from a person called Mike Bailey asking FPPC to explain why the fines it imposes on politicians such as GLORIA and Nancy McFadden are significantly lower than the fines it imposes on non-politicians who are running for office as follows:

As a California taxpayer for over 50 years, I demand to know why the fines for Todd Gloria and Nancy McFadden are in the hundreds (and \$3500 for Democrat Party), while Judge Jackson and Susan Shelley were fined \$6000 and \$11500?

26. Attached hereto as **Exhibit 10** (298-299) is an email dated November 18, 2019 from a person called Doug Butler asserting:

Todd Gloria's fine should be increased to at least \$100,000.00. Experienced politicians and political parties, in power, should face high fines for their transgressions. New candidates, particularly without powerful political backers should not face high fines. The fine for Scott Jackson should be \$100.00.

27. Attached hereto as **Exhibit 11** (300-304) is a letter erroneously dated October 1, 2019 (should have been dated November 8, 2019) by which counsel for WAHLSTROM, David Kenney, informed the FPPC their proposed GLORIA Order which is the subject of this action would be void because it failed to comply with applicable provisions of the California Constitution, common law, statutes and/or regulations and/or is arbitrary, capricious or an abuse of discretion based on the Exhibits, documents, facts, circumstances and allegations referenced herein as follows:

I represent Mat Wahlstrom, who filed a sworn complaint alleging multiple violations of the Political Reform Act (PRA) in matter no. COM-09112019-01765 against Assemblymember Todd Gloria. By letter dated September 24, 2019, Chief of Enforcement Galena West notified my client that parts of his complaint have been incorporated into existing FPPC case no. 2019-00969, that a small portion was deemed to lack foundation, and that the remainder had not yet received a determination. Case no. 2019-00969 arises from a self-reported violation by Mr. Gloria and is discussed in the Chief of Enforcement's executive staff report for the upcoming meeting on November 21, 2019. My client objects to the proposed resolution of case no. 2019-00969.

In San Diego, Mr. Gloria has been openly campaigning for Mayor of San Diego since December 2018. However, he formed his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee in March 2019, transferred more than \$293,000 from his Assembly 2018 committee to his Assembly 2020 committee, and accepted more than \$25,000 in contributions to his Assembly 2020 committee. The problem is that he had not filed his Form 501 to run for re-election to the Assembly in 2020. When this fact was reported in a local San Diego newspaper, Mr. Gloria denied that he was running for Assembly and affirmed that he was running only for Mayor. Amid mounting public scrutiny, he filed his Form 501 for re-election to the Assembly in 2020 on August 13, 2019 – under penalty of perjury – but simultaneously issued a public statement that he was running for Mayor and was not running for re-election to the Assembly.

The reason Mr. Gloria created his Assembly 2020 committee despite having no intention to run for re-election to the Assembly – and despite filing Form 501 under penalty of perjury to the contrary – is to launder money raised in connection with his Assembly office into his Mayoral campaign. The City of San Diego limits the

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amount of contributions to \$1,150 per election cycle and limits the source of contributions to natural persons and political parties. For his phony Assembly reelection, however, Mr. Gloria enjoys contribution limits that are more than four times higher and can accept corporate donations. Mr. Gloria may now launder his Assembly monies into the San Diego County Democratic Party to spend on his behalf in the Mayoral race, which includes a donation in excess of \$25,000 directly to his Mayoral committee and party expenditure for his benefit.

The foregoing accusations are substantiated by the evidence that my client previously submitted to the FPPC when he submitted his sworn complaint. The executive staff report indicates that Ms. West will be imposing a paltry fine of \$200 on Mr. Gloria as part of the FPPC's streamlined penalty process. My client believes that this result is improper and illegal for multiple reasons.

First, there is no statutory authority for the streamlined program. FPPC Regulation 18360.1 authorizes the Chief of Enforcement to include or exclude any filer from the streamlined program. However, the PRA does not authorize this delegation of authority. The Legislature has authorized the FPPC to delegate authority to the Chair and to the Executive Director. Gov't Code § 83108. As a public agency with a special and limited jurisdiction, the FPPC has only those express (or necessarily implied) powers which are specifically granted to it by statute. See, e.g., City of Ceres v. City of Modesto, 274 Cal. App. 2D 545, 550 (1969). The authority for the FPPC to delegate an enforcement decision to the Chief of Enforcement does not exist.

Second, even if such authority existed and Regulation 18360.1 were valid, Mr. Gloria's belated filing of Form 501 declaring his candidacy for an office that he has never intended to occupy does falls under multiple exceptions to the process for streamlined treatment. The late filing is excluded by sub-section (c)(2)(B)(i) because there is evidence that Mr. Gloria, who has run for elected office multiple times and is thoroughly familiar with the rules, intended to conceal his fundraising for Mayor by abusing his Assembly 2020 campaign and intended to violate the PRA in the process; up until the day he filed his Form 501 and every moment since, he has denied that he is a candidate for re-election to that office. The late filing is also excluded by sub-section (c)(2)(B)(vii) because laundering any amount of money, or even attempting to do so, causes serious public harm and erodes the public's confidence in the integrity of the electoral process. The late filing is further excluded by sub-section (c)(2)(B)(viii) because Mr. Gloria remains under investigation for other aspects of my client's sworn complaint, as confirmed by Ms. West's letter dated September 24. At a minimum the matter should be put into abeyance until his Assembly 2020 committee and his Mayoral committee issue their next campaignfinance reports so that you can follow the money and see exactly how badly he has abused the system.<sup>1</sup>

The worksheet showing how the \$200 penalty was calculated is very disturbing. For example, it fails to recognize that Mr. Gloria has a high level of experience and sophistication on election matters, contrary to sub-section (c)(2)(A)(i); only "self-reported" after his violations were detailed by the press,

Third, even if Mr. Gloria arguably qualified for streamlined treatment under Regulation 18360.1, he is not being properly punished under Regulation 18360.2 with a meager penalty of \$200. His Assembly 2020 committee received nearly \$320,000 during the first half of 2019, and only Mr. Gloria knows how much he raised prior to the day he filed his Form 501 on August 13, 2019. Yet the worksheet showing how the penalty was calculated does not include the 1% of contributions required by the Regulation. Because the PRA defines "contributions" to include transfers from a candidate's own committee, the fine should include at least \$3,200 on top of the \$200 penalty. Under no circumstances should the fine be less than \$3,400, and you should be waiting until after his Assembly 2020 reports its contributions through August 13, 2019, in order to know the full amount of contributions that should be subject to the additional 1% penalty.

In closing, I urge you to carefully consider the propriety of allowing Mr. Gloria to be slapped on the wrist when the evidence clearly establishes a premeditated plan to launder money from his state-office committee into his local-office committee. Doing so would violate the PRA and your own regulations.

Perhaps more importantly, I urge you to consider how the public will perceive the fine imposed on Mr. Gloria for such egregious conduct. The press has already written multiple articles critical of the FPPC's minimization of Mr. Gloria's fraud on the public.<sup>2</sup> The fact that Mr. Gloria's attorney in the matter, Gary Winuk, is the FPPC's former enforcement chief fuels the public's perception that the FPPC is primarily an incumbent-protection racket rather than an agency charged with protecting the integrity of the electoral system.

For these reasons, I encourage the FPPC to reject the proposed \$200 fine against Mr. Gloria, to conduct a thorough investigation of all the pending allegations against him (which means waiting until all relevant campaign-finance reports are available to the public), and then to take action that fully recognizes the gravity of the scam that Mr. Gloria was perpetrating against the public.

At the time this letter was submitted to the FPPC WAHLSTROM did not know GLORIA's attorney Kaufman was concurrently employed by and acted as a consultant to the FPPC to draft, implement and suggest on going revisions to the regulations, processes and procedures that implement FPPC's

contrary to sub-section (c)(2)(A)(ii); has caused major public harm by creating a scheme to launder excessive, corporate donations into a campaign that prohibits both, contrary to sub-section (c)(2)(A)(iii); received nearly \$320,000 into this Assembly 2020 committee before filing Form 501, contrary to sub-section (c)(2)(A)(iv); and the Form 501 is related to the re-election that triggered the filing obligation, contrary to sub-section (c)(2)(A)(xiv). None of those factors is mentioned in the worksheet.

- 30. Attached hereto as **Exhibit 14** (329-332) is a copy of the November 21, 2019 Regular Meeting Minutes for the FPPC that state on page 3 "The Executive Staff reports were accepted as submitted, without further action by the Commission."
- 31. Attached hereto as **Exhibit 16** (336-363) is a copy of California Code of Regulations ("CCR") § 18360 et seq., entitled "Enforcement Complaints."

## SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION (Order to Exclude KAUFMAN and KAUFMAN LEGAL GROUP, APC per Government Code § 87404)

- 32. Petitioner incorporates the prior allegations as through fully recited herein
- 33. The Milton Marks Postgovernment Employment Restrictions Act of 1990 (codified at Government Code § 87406 which is part of Article 4, Chapter 2, Title 9 of the Government Code) states in relevant part in paragraph (d)(1):
  - ...[A]ny officer, employee, or consultant of a state administrative agency who holds a position that entails the making, or participation in the making, of decisions that may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest... shall not, for compensation, act as agent or attorney for, or otherwise represent, any other person, by making any formal or informal appearance, or by making any oral or written communication, before any state administrative agency, or officer or employee thereof, for which he or she worked or represented during the 12 months before leaving office or employment, if the appearance or communication is made for the purpose of influencing administrative...action.

- 34. WAHLSTROM alleges KAUFMAN, as Chair of the FPPC Enforcement Review Task Force was an "officer, employee, or consultant of a state administrative agency who holds a position that entails the making, or participation in the making, of decisions" of FPPC, namely the enactment and enforcement of FPPC's streamlined enforcement program as referenced in **Exhibit** 5.
- 35. WAHLSTROM alleges KAUFMAN had a financial interest within the meaning of Government Code § 87406 because he is paid as an attorney to shepherds clients like GLORIA through FPPC's streamlined enforcement program.
- 36. WAHLSTROM alleges KAUFMAN violated the Milton Marks Postgovernment Employment Restrictions Act of 1990 on numerous occasions including, but not limited to, KAUFMAN's August 14, 2019 letter to FPPC on behalf of GLORIA (Exhibit 3) which was a written communication to a state administrative agency (FPPC) for which KAUFFMAN worked (Chair of the FPPC Enforcement Review Task Force) within at least one year prior and made for the purpose of influencing administrative action by the FPPC, namely FPPC's GLORIA Order attached as Exhibit 1.
- 37. Additionally, WAHLSTROM further alleges KAUFMAN was still working for the FPPC as the Chair of the FPPC Enforcement Review Task Force on the very day that the GLORIA Order was considered by the FPPC was evidenced by **Exhibit 15** (333-335) attached hereto which is a copy of the November 21, 2019 Enforcement Meeting Minutes for the FPPC which states on page 3:

Stephen Kaufman, Chair of the Enforcement Review Task Force, gave public comment on the presentation and suggested reforms to the Streamline Regulations (in particular, monetary thresholds; timelines for 24-hour reports; and, inclusion of major donors and behested payments into the Streamline program). Mr. Kaufman also encouraged the Commission to support a legislative change to limit private rights of actions for violations of the Political Reform Act.

- 17 -VERIFIED PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDATE; AND FOR ORDER TO EXCLUDE

6. For such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper.

#### On the Second Cause of Action

- That the Court issue an order to exclude KAUFMAN and his KAUFMAN LEGAL GROUP, APC, from further participation in or assisting or counseling any other participant in this action and the related action of San Diego Superior Court Case No:37-2019-00043494-CU-JR-CTL
- 2. For such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper.

#### FAIR POLITICAL PRACTICES COMMISSION STATEMENT OF RESPONDENT'S RIGHTS

The Complainant, the Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission, and Respondent, both identified by name on the front of this document, hereby agree that this Stipulation, Decision and Order will be submitted for notice at the next regularly scheduled Fair Political Practices Commission meeting, or as soon as the matter can be heard.

The parties agree to enter into this Stipulation to resolve all factual and legal issues raised in this matter and to reach a final disposition without the necessity of holding an administrative hearing to determine the liability of Respondent.

Respondent understands and hereby knowingly and voluntarily waives any and all procedural rights under California Government Code sections 83115.5, 11500, et seq., and 2 California Code of Regulations sections 18361.4 through 18361.11, including but not limited to the issuance and receipt of an accusation, and the right to appear personally and be represented by counsel at his or her own expense in any administrative hearing held in this matter, to confront and cross examine all witnesses testifying at the hearing, to subpoena witnesses to testify at the hearing, and to have an impartial administrative law judge present at the hearing to act as a hearing officer.

It is further stipulated and agreed that Respondent has violated the Political Reform Act as described herein.

Respondent agrees to the issuance of the Decision and Order and imposition by the Commission through the Chief of Enforcement of a penalty in the amount specified on the Stipulation, and a payment in full has been submitted by Respondent to be held by the State of California until the issuance of the Decision and Order. This will be the final disposition of the violation(s) described herein.

The parties agree that in the event the Chief of Enforcement refuses to accept this Stipulation, it shall become null and void, and within fifteen (15) business days after the Commission meeting at which this Stipulation is presented, payments tendered shall be reimbursed to Respondent. Respondent further stipulates and agrees that in the event the Chief of Enforcement rejects the Stipulation and a full evidentiary hearing before the Commission becomes necessary, neither a member of the Commission, nor the Executive Director, shall be disqualified because of prior consideration of this Stipulation.

## Exhibit 2

In violation of the Political Reform Act, Todd Gloria (1) rolled over surplus funds from his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2018 committee into his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee, (2) accepted donations into his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee, and (3) spent money from his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee before he declared his intention to run for re-election to the Assembly in 2020 by filing his Statement of Intention (Form 501). After the press reported these violations, he filed his Statement of Intention to run for Assembly, under penalty of perjury, on August 13, 2019. At all times since at least December 20, 2018, Mr. Gloria has been running for Mayor of the City of San Diego.

Despite filing his Form 501 on August 13, 2019, Mr. Gloria was not a candidate for re-election to the Assembly; notwithstanding the filing, at no time has he ever been a candidate for re-election in 2020. In fact, on March 27, 2019, he donated money to another candidate for the same office, Christopher Ward, and donated money from his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee to Mr. Ward's Assembly committee. Mr. Gloria also endorsed Mr. Ward as his replacement in the Assembly.

On the same day that Mr. Gloria filed his Form 501 under penalty of perjury for the Assembly, his campaign manager, Nick Serrano, went on Twitter and denied that his boss was running for the Assembly. That following day, Mr. Gloria himself went on Twitter and posted this message: "Some news reports have suggested that I am seeking re-election to the Assembly. I want to be very clear: I am not running for the Assembly, I am running for Mayor. [¶] My Assembly committee remains open to fulfill my responsibilities as Member of the State Assembly until the end of my current term."

Mr. Gloria is not a candidate for the Assembly in 2020 but has been raising money into and spending money from his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee for political purposes other than his campaign for re-election to the Assembly – because he never has been and to this day is not running for re-election to that office – and not for any related legislative or governmental purposes. Mr. Gloria has been endorsed by the San Diego County Democratic Party, and I believe he intends to use the money rolled into and raised by his Todd Gloria for 2020 committee for political purposes associated with his Mayoral campaign (either directly or through the Party).

Attached to this sworn complaint (i.e., uploaded herewith) is a copy of my complaint against Mr. Gloria in San Diego County Superior Court, along with the application for a temporary restraining order that I recently filed and Mr. Gloria's opposition thereto. My sworn complaint is based on the information contained in my TRO filing.

In opposition to my TRO, Mr. Gloria's attorney filed an opposition that included a copy of a letter that the attorney sent to the FPPC's Enforcement Division Chief, Galena West. In the letter, Mr. Gloria's lawyer's makes a number of false claims. First, he claims that "the contributions received by the Committee to date have been small in number and total a relatively small amount." That is false because his Assembly 2020 committee raised approximately \$25,000 in donations, which is not small. Furthermore, his Assembly 2020 committee received a transfer of more than \$290,000 from his Assembly 2018 committee, and Government Code section 82015(b)(2) defines "contributions" to include transfers "of anything of value received

by a committee from another committee."

Second, the lawyer claims that Mr. Gloria's failure to file the Form 501 was brought to the FPPC's attention as soon as the failure had been brought to Mr. Gloria's attention. That claim is misleading at best. Mr. Gloria has known all along that he had to file the Form 501 in order to open a new committee for his (bogus) campaign for re-election to the Assembly. He is a seasoned, experienced politician and candidate. He has run for different offices many times and knows the purpose of the Form 501 and is aware that it is a legal prerequisite to forming a committee, receiving any contribution (whether a donation or transfer), and spending money from that committee. In fact, he filed his Form 501 in December 2018 for his Mayoral campaign, before he started raising money. If he truly were running for both offices at the same time, he would have filed his Form 501 for re-election to the Assembly and before being called out by the press. His claim that he made an honest mistake is a fabrication; he made a calculated decision based on the supposition that if he got caught, he would simply ask for forgiveness. His real goal has been to raise money under the auspices of running for re-election a state office (despite having no intention to seek re-election to that office) and take advantage of the higher donation limits for state office (more than four times the \$1,150 limit imposed on his Mayoral campaign under City of San Diego regulations), and then transfer his war chest from his bogus Assembly 2020 committee to his Mayor 2020 committee and/or the San Diego County Democratic Party.

This plan not only violated the Form 501 requirement, but it is another form of money laundering that you should investigate and punish. Mr. Gloria is raising money through his Assembly 2020 committee – all of which so far has come from non-individual sources that could not lawfully donate to his Mayor 2020 committee – in order to gain an unfair advantage in his Mayoral campaign.

When the judge initially denied my ex parte TRO request, he authorized me to file a formal motion for a preliminary injunction based on normal motion scheduling. I am asking the FPPC to enjoin Mr. Gloria's use of his Assembly 2020 funds for any purpose other than legislative or government purposes until the FPPC and/or the Superior Court has issued a final ruling on my sworn complaint. Because Mr. Gloria's Mayoral committee has raised more than \$700,000 so far and he has out-raised all of his competition, he would not be harmed by an injunction.

At a minimum, you should require Mr. Gloria, not his surrogates, to testify under oath based on personal knowledge, not information and belief, about (1) whether he has ever been running for re-election to the Assembly in 2020; (2) if so, whether he is still running for re-election; and (3) if he is was running but is no longer running for re-election, when did he stop. You should also require him to testify under oath based on personal knowledge whether he was running for re-election at the time he filed the Form 501 on August 13, 2019.

- 4. The true names and capacities of the Defendants identified as DOES 1 through 100 are unknown to PLAINTIFF; once their true names and capacities are known, PLAINTIFF will seek leave to amend this lawsuit. On information and belief, PLAINTIFF alleges that each fictitiously named Defendant has a legally recognized interest in the outcome of this lawsuit.
- 5. On information and belief, PLAINTIFF alleges that each of the Defendants is, and at all relevant times was, the agent, servant, or employee of every other Defendant and acting within the scope of said agency, servitude, or employment.
- 6. The violations of law alleged herein were committed primarily if not entirely in the County of San Diego.
- 7. In November 2018, GLORIA was re-elected to the office of AD78 representative. To support that re-election campaign, he had created a candidate-controlled committee known as "Todd Gloria for Assembly 2018" approximately two years earlier.
- 8. On February 20, 2019, GLORIA created a new candidate-controlled committee known as "Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020" and around this date established a bank account for this committee. See Exhibit B hereto. GLORIA's Assembly 2020 committee is a "committee" within the meaning of Government Code section 82013(a).
- 9. On March 19, 2019, GLORIA transferred the remaining \$293,079.05 held by his Assembly 2018 committee to his new Assembly 2020 committee. See Exhibit C hereto.
- 10. GLORIA did not file FPPC Form 501 and declare his intention to run for re-election to the office of AD78 representative under penalty of perjury until August 13, 2019. See Exhibit D hereto.
- 11. On August 13, 2019, *Times of San Diego* published a news article announcing that earlier in the day GLORIA had filed his FPPC Form 501 and under penalty of perjury declared his

intention to run for re-election to the office of AD78 representative. The article's reporter, KEN STONE (STONE), "tweeted" his article on Twitter. See Exhibit E hereto.

- 12. On August 13, 2019, NICK SERRANO (SERRANO) responded to STONE's tweet about the article and stated: "Nothing has changed, Ken. Todd is running for mayor." See Exhibit F hereto.
- 13. Since at least December 20, 2018, SERRANO has been GLORIA's mayoral campaign manager and a paid member of GLORIA's legislative staff for AD78.
- 14. On August 14, 2019, GLORIA tweeted the following statement (with his own emphasis): "Some news reports have suggested that I am seeking re-election to the Assembly. I want to be very clear: I am not running for the Assembly, I am running for Mayor. [¶] My Assembly committee remains open to fulfill my responsibilities as Member of the State Assembly until the end of my current term. The form filed by my committee yesterday simply corrected an administrative oversight that occurred when the original paperwork was filed months ago." See Exhibit G hereto.
- 15. Since declaring his intention to run for the office of Mayor of the City of San Diego in 2020, GLORIA has maintained a website (www.toddgloria.com), a Facebook account, and a Twitter account to support his Mayoral campaign. At no time has any of those communications media give any indication that GLORIA was running for re-election in 2020 to the office of AD78 representative. See Exhibit H hereto.
- 16. Between the time GLORIA first declared his intention to run for the office of Mayor of the City of San Diego in 2020 and the time he filed his FPPC Form 501 for re-election to the office of AD78 representative, GLORIA had never made any public statement that he was running or intended to run for re-election to the office of AD78 representative.

17.	Despite filing FPPC Form 501 for re-election to the office of AD78 representative
under penalty	of perjury on August 13, 2019, GLORIA has never intended to run for re-election to
the office of A	AD78 representative.

- 18. GLORIA has been soliciting and accepting donations into his Assembly 2020 committee with the intend to use that money, either directly or indirectly, to support his campaign for the office of Mayor of the City of San Diego in 2020.
- 19. GLORIA and at least one member of SDCDP's executive committee agreed, prior to the filing of this lawsuit, that if GLORIA transfers money from his Assembly 2020 campaign to SDCDP, SDCDP will use the money to support GLORIA's campaign for the office of Mayor of the City of San Diego in 2020.

#### FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION: ILLEGAL CAMPAIGN FINANCING

#### (Against All Defendants)

- 20. PLAINTIFF incorporates the prior allegations as through fully recited herein.
- 21. Government Code section 85200 states (emphasis added): "Prior to the solicitation or receipt of any contribution or loan, an individual who intends to be a candidate for an elective state office, as that term is defined by Section 82024, shall file with the Secretary of State an original statement, signed under penalty of perjury, of intention to be a candidate for a specific office."
- 22. Government Code section 85201(a) states (emphasis added): "Upon the filing of the statement of intention pursuant to Section 85200, the individual **shall establish one campaign contribution account** at an office of a financial institution located in the state."
- 23. Section 18521(a) of the FPPC's regulations states (emphasis added): "A candidate who is required to file a statement of organization for a controlled committee pursuant to Government Code section 84101 shall establish a separate controlled committee and campaign

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**bank account** for each specific office identified in statements filed by the candidate pursuant to Government Code section 85200 and 2 Cal. Code Regs. Section 18520."

24. Section 18525(a) of the FPPC's regulations states (emphasis added): "An **incumbent** elected officer shall make expenditures for the following campaign expenses from the appropriate campaign bank account for election to a future term of office: (1) Payments for fundraising and campaign strategy expenses for election to a future term of office. (2) Payments for mass mailings, political advertising, opinion polls or surveys, and other communications in connection with election to a future term of office. For purposes of this section, a mass mailing, political advertisement, opinion poll or survey, or other communication shall be considered 'in connection with election to a future term of office' if it makes reference to the officer's future election or status as a candidate for a future term of office, or if it is made by an incumbent officer within 3 months prior to an election for which he or she has filed any of the following: (A) A statement of intention to be a candidate for a specific office, pursuant to Government Code Section 85200. (B) A declaration of candidacy or nomination papers, as specified in Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 8000) of Division 8 of the Elections Code. (C) Any other documents necessary to be listed on the ballot as a candidate for any state or local office. (3) Payments for services and actual expenses of political consultants, the campaign treasurer and other campaign staff, pollsters and other persons providing services directly in connection with a future election. (4) Payments for voter registration and get-out-the-vote drives."

25. Section 18525(b) of the FPPC's regulations states (emphasis added): "An incumbent elected officer may make expenditures for purposes not enumerated in subdivision (a) from either the campaign bank account established pursuant to Government Code Section 85201 for election to the incumbent term of office or from a campaign bank account established pursuant to Government Code Section 85201 for election to a future term of office. **This section shall not be construed to** 

permit an incumbent elected officer to make expenditures from any campaign bank account for expenses other than those associated with his or her election to the specific office for which the account was established and expenses associated with holding that office."

- 26. Government Code section 89510(b) states (emphasis added): "All contributions deposited into the campaign account shall be deemed to be **held in trust** for expenses associated with the election of the candidate or for expenses associated with holding office."
- 27. Government Code section 89512(a) states (emphasis added): "An expenditure to seek office is within the lawful execution of the trust imposed by Section 89510 if it is reasonably related to a political purpose. An expenditure associated with holding office is within the lawful execution of the trust imposed by Section 89510 if it is reasonably related to a legislative or governmental purpose. Expenditures which confer a substantial personal benefit shall be directly related to a political, legislative, or governmental purpose."
- 28. Government Code section 89519(a) states (emphasis added): "Upon the 90th day after leaving an elective office, or the 90th day following the end of the postelection reporting period following the defeat of a candidate for elective office, whichever occurs last, **campaign** funds under the control of the former candidate or elected officer shall be considered surplus campaign funds and shall be disclosed pursuant to Chapter 4 (commencing with Section 84100)."
- 29. Government Code section 89519(b) states (emphasis added): "Surplus campaign funds shall be used **only** for the following purposes: (1) The payment of outstanding campaign debts or elected officer's expenses. (2) The repayment of contributions. (3) Donations to any bona fide charitable, educational, civic, religious, or similar tax-exempt, nonprofit organization, where no substantial part of the proceeds will have a material financial effect on the former candidate or elected officer, any member of his or her immediate family, or his or her campaign treasurer. (4) Contributions to a political party committee, provided the campaign funds are not used to support or

oppose candidates for elective office. However, the campaign funds may be used by a political party committee to conduct partisan voter registration, partisan get-out-the-vote activities, and slate mailers as that term is defined in Section 82048.3. (5) Contributions to support or oppose any candidate for federal office, any candidate for elective office in a state other than California, or any ballot measure. (6) The payment for professional services reasonably required by the committee to assist in the performance of its administrative functions, including payment for attorney's fees for litigation that arises directly out of a candidate's or elected officer's activities, duties, or status as a candidate or elected officer, including, but not limited to, an action to enjoin defamation, defense of an action brought for a violation of state or local campaign, disclosure, or election laws, and an action from an election contest or recount."

- 30. Section 18951 of the FPPC's regulations states in part (emphasis added): "For purposes of Section 89519: (a) Campaign funds under the control of a candidate or elected officer will be considered surplus campaign funds on the following dates: (1) Incumbent Candidates: The 90th day after leaving an elective office for which the campaign funds were raised, or if the candidate is defeated for reelection, the 90th day after the end of the postelection reporting period following his or her defeat, whichever is later. An incumbent candidate who wishes to use funds for a future election must transfer those funds to a new committee for a future election no later than this date."
- 31. Section 18951(b) of the FPPC's regulations states: "The 'end of the postelection reporting period' means June 30 with respect to elections occurring in the first six months of the calendar year and December 31 for elections occurring in the latter six months of the calendar year."
- 32. Page 11.7 of FPPC Manual 1, which governs candidates for state office and their committees, states in part (emphasis in original): "In order for a candidate to use leftover (non-

surplus) campaign funds for a future election, the candidate must (•) File a new **Form 501** (Candidate Intention Statement) for the specific future election; (•) File an initial **Form 410** (Statement of Organization to obtain a new committee identification number; and, (•) Open **new bank account**. Transfers to a committee for a different state office must be attributed to specific contributors as described in Chapter 1."

- 33. The money raised by GLORIA's Assembly 2020 committee may not lawfully be used for any political purpose because, despite filing his FPPC Form 501 for re-election to the office of AD78 representative under penalty of perjury, he has no intention of running for re-election to that office.
- 34. Because GLORIA has no intention of running for re-election to the office of AD78 representative, the money raised by GLORIA's Assembly 2020 committee may only be used for a governmental or legislative purpose associated with his current term of office. However, GLORIA has used that money mostly, if not exclusively, for illegal political purposes, and he intends to continue to use that money for such illegal purposes. The expenditure of any portion of that money to SDCDP for direct or indirect us to support GLORIA and/or oppose any of his opponents would constitute an illegal political purpose.
- 35. Because GLORIA received money in his Assembly 2020 committee before he filed his FPPC Form 501 for re-election to the office of AD78 representative under penalty of perjury, the money received by that committee prior to August 13, 2019, may not be spent by Gloria either because it became "surplus" money on March 31, 2019, or was otherwise illegally placed into the Assembly 2020 committee.
- 36. On information and belief, PLAINTIFF alleges that DEFENDANTS dispute the foregoing allegations. Declaratory relief is therefore appropriate.

37. The public will be irreparably harmed if DEFENDANTS are allowed to use the money illegally raised by GLORIA to support him, directly or indirectly, in the race for the office of Mayor of the City of San Diego in 2020. Money damages would be an inadequate remedy. Equitable relief is therefore appropriate.

WHEREFORE, PLAINTIFF prays for the following relief against all DEFENDANTS as the Court deems appropriate:

- An order or judgment declaring that DEFENDANTS are illegally financing
   GLORIA's campaign for election to the office of Mayor of the City of San Diego in 2020;
- An order or judgment enjoining DEFENDANTS from using any money from GLORIA's Assembly 2020 committee, directly or indirectly, to support his campaign for the office of Mayor of the City of San Diego in 2020;
  - 3. An award of attorney fees and court costs as authorized by law, and
  - 4. Any additional relief that the Court deems appropriate.



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## Todd Gloria Files for Assembly Re-Election While Running for San Diego Mayor

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

Four days after declaring that "I am absolutely running for mayor of San Diego," Assemblyman Todd Gloria filed paperwork Tuesday morning to seek re-election in his San Diego district.

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Gloria signed the Form 501 "candidate intention statement" dated Aug. 13. Under "Office Sought" is typed "Assemblymember State of California."

But the development appears to be fallout from an

issue raised by Councilwoman Barbara Bry - his main rival - during her closing statement Friday in a mayoral debate at San Diego City College.



Bry noted the existence of a fundraising committee Gloria set up for the 2020 Assembly race and asked: "Mr. Gloria, I want to know what office you are running for."

He didn't respond on stage, but told Times of San Diego afterward that the committee was part of his Assembly majority whip role to raise money for fellow Democrats in Sacramento and beyond.

On Twitter Tuesday night, Gloria spokesman Nick Serrano said: "Nothing has changed, Ken. Todd is running for Mayor." He didn't respond to questions about the 501 filing.



On Monday, however, Alberto Garcia of La Prensa San Diego — the largest local Hispanic newspaper — **reported that Gloria** may have violated state law by failing to file his intention to run for re-election before raising over \$300,000 for his Assembly committee.

"State law requires that all candidates file a Form 501 Candidate Intention Statement declaring their candidacy for election or re-election before any money can be raised for a campaign committee, even if it's the candidate's own money," La Prensa said.

In further reporting Tuesday, La Prensa said Gloria's 501 filing for re-election to the Assembly was hand delivered to the Secretary of State's Office the morning after the paper posed questions to Gloria's campaign manager about the missing form.



Even with Tuesday morning's filing, the California **Secretary of State website** by 6:15 p.m. had yet to show a Gloria candidacy statement for Assembly District 78.

A spokesman for the state **Fair Political Practices Commission** said Monday that no complaints had been filed about Gloria's Assembly 2020 committee.

The spokesman, Jay Wierenga, told Times of San Diego that it's "quite common" for people to have two fundraising committees.

"The most common is that an incumbent candidate would have an open committee for the office he/she holds and one for an election to a different office," he said.

Wierenga wouldn't comment on Gloria's case specifically but said: "It's perfectly fine to have two committees as long as they are for what they say they are and proper recordkeeping/reporting is being done."

Also Monday, veteran San Diego political consultant **Tom Shepard** explained why Bry didn't raise the issue until the last moments of the debate — when Gloria couldn't respond.



"She anticipated the issue would be the subject of a question during the debate," Shepard said via email. "Since it didn't come up, she added it to her closing remarks."

Shepard said there was nothing technically illegal about Gloria establishing the account, but "it raises several ethical issues and one potential Political Reform Act violation.

"We haven't been able to find any record that he filed a Form 501 Declaration of Candidacy Form for the 2020 Assembly race, which is required before a candidate-controlled committee can begin raising funds," he noted. "If confirmed, this would be a violation of the Political Reform Act and could taint funds raised and expended by the 2020 committee."

What did Bry hope to gain by noting the Assembly 2020 issue?

Shepard, a strategist for her campaign, said: "I don't think most San Diego voters want Sacramento special interests helping finance a candidate for mayor, nor would they support an attempt by a mayoral candidate to circumvent the city's campaign finance ordinance."



He added: "You can clearly see in Gloria's 2020 Assembly committee campaign report that money has been paid to state legislators' campaign committees and subsequently these legislators endorsed his candidacy for mayor. [The committee] also made expenditures for items that are not related to legitimate Assembly-related activities."

Shepard said he fully anticipated that Gloria would run for mayor.



"But if he is concerned with

transparency, compliance with local campaign finance laws and independence from Sacramento special interests, it's a bad way to start his campaign," he said.



- I, Mat Wahlstrom, am over the age of 18 years and, if called as a witness in this case, will testify as follows:
- 1. Todd Gloria is a registered Democrat and has represented California's 78th Assembly District (AD78), which consists primarily of the coastal communities of the City of San Diego, since December 2016; that is when he was termed out from representing San Diego City Council District 3 (CD3). For years I have been a resident of AD78 and CD3 and have been registered to vote therein.
- 2. To support his 2018 re-election campaign, Mr. Gloria created a candidate-controlled committee known as "Todd Gloria for Assembly 2018" in the early part of 2017.

I have reviewed his Facebook and Twitter accounts and his website, and nowhere have they ever indicated that he was running for re-election to the Assembly in 2020. Likewise I have never seen or heard any communication from Mr. Gloria indicating in his own voice of words that he is running for re-election to the Assembly in 2020.
- 13. The Secretary of State maintains a list of candidates who have filed a statement of intention to run for state office. Attached hereto as Exhibit N is a true and correct copy of the list as it existed on August 9, 2019. I obtained it from the Secretary of State's website.

# Todd Gloria Failed to File Candidacy Form Before Raising Money

August 12, 2019

State Assemblyman Todd Gloria, a candidate for San Diego Mayor, may have violated state law by failing to file his intention to run for re-election to the State Assembly before raising over \$300,000 in a campaign committee at the same time he's been running and raising money for San Diego Mayor.

A campaign committee, Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020, was created in March of this year when Gloria transferred \$293,078.05 that remained in his 2018 Assembly campaign committee after the November 2018 election.

State law requires that all candidates file a Form 501 Candidate Intention Statement declaring their candidacy for election or re election before any money can be raised for a campaign committee, even if it's the candidate's own money.

According to the California Secretary of State's office, there was no Form 501 on file for Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 as of the end of day on August 8th.

Under state law, Gloria had to empty and close out the 2018 committee by the end of March or the money would become "surplus" and subject to strict limits to donate the money to charity. Gloria instead transferred the money to the new Assembly 2020 committee and closed out the Assembly 2018 committee on March 19th.

The June 30th report for the Assembly 2020 campaign committee reflects contributions of \$25,246, plus the nearly \$300,000 he transferred from the 2018 committee. Those contributions have all come from special interests, including Native American tribes, new car dealers, an apartment association, and obbying groups for chiropractors and firefighters, and one contribution from State Treasurer Fiona Ma's 2020 re election campaign. No individual contributions were reported. The committee ended the June period with \$275,122.24 cash on hand.

Since March, Gloria has spent \$44,246.32 from that committee, including donating to other campaigns and organizations. Gloria donated \$5,000 to the San Diego Democratic Party; a ma imum \$4,700 contribution to Councilman Chris Ward's 2020 Assembly campaign to replace Gloria; \$1,500 to the Climate Action Campaign; \$1,000 to Kamala Harris' Presidential campaign; and \$1,037.50 to reimburse Lorena Gonzalez' Assembly campaign for delegate breakfast at the recent Democratic Party convention, among other e penditures.

At the time the 2020 Assembly committee was created, Gloria was already a declared candidate for San Diego Mayor and was raising money for a separate committee, Todd Gloria for Mayor 2020.

Gloria filed a 501 form with the San Diego City Clerk on December 20, 2018 declaring his candidacy for Mayor before raising money for that campaign.

At the end of June, Gloria reported having raised a total of \$656,108.28 for the 2020 San Diego Mayor's campaign since January 1st, and ended the period with \$474,735.49 cash on hand.

Gloria's mayoral campaign received the endorsement of California Governor Gavin Newsom last week, in addition to several Assembly members, in luding locals Lorena Gonzalez Fletcher and Shirley Weber, as well as Congress members Juan Vargas and Susan Davis.

A call to Todd Gloria's cell phone for comment was returned by Nick Serrano, Gloria's Communications Director in the Assembly who currently serves as campaign manager. Serrano appears to have received a \$500 payment from Gloria's mayor campaign committee in March, as

well as \$6,500 in payments from Gloria's 2020 Assembly committee between February and June of this year. Serrano said he would pass the message on to Gloria.

No comments were received from Gloria at the time this story was released.

Councilman Chris Ward, running to replace Gloria in the Assembly, filed his own 501 form for the Assembly before beginning to raise money in January. Ward's 2020 Assembly committee reported having raised a total of \$284,393.27 through June 30th. Ward received a contribution of \$4,700 from Gloria's 2020 Assembly committee.

Candidates do not usually donate money to other candidates running for the same office, but it is not clear if Ward knew whether or not Gloria intended to run for the Assembly before he declared his own candidacy for the same seat.

Gloria donated \$4,700 to Ward's campaign on March 27, just eight days after Gloria created his 2020 Assembly committee.

A message for comment left on Ward's cell phone was not returned when this story was published.

The California Political Reform Act, which requires the 501 form be filed before raising money, states that knowing or willful violations are misdemeanors, punishable by up to a year in jail and a \$1,000 fine. Additionally, a fine of \$10,000, or three times the amount which was improperly received, may be assessed.

A violation of the filing requirement may be prosecuted by the California Attorney General, the District Attorney, the elected City Attorney, or through a civil lawsuit called a Private Attorney General action.

Local attorney Cory Briggs, a frequent critic of San Diego's leadership and a current candidate for City Attorney, refused to comment on the issue so he wouldn't create a possible conflict of interest.

"The press and the public must remember that everyone is entitled to a presumption of innocence until proven guilty in a court of law," Briggs said. "If I am elected as City Attorney, this matter could fall within my prosecutorial purview so it would therefore be inappropriate for me to make any comment," Briggs concluded.

Current San Diego City Attorney Mara Elliott has endorsed Gloria's campaign for Mayor.

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### Todd Gloria Files for Assembly Re-Election While Running for San Diego Mayor

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

Four days after declaring that "I am absolutely running for mayor of San Diego," Assemblyman Todd Gloria filed paperwork Tuesday morning to seek re-election in his San Diego district.

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Gloria signed the Form 501 "candidate intention statement" dated Aug. 13. Under "Office Sought" is typed "Assemblymember State of California."

But the development appears to be fallout from an

issue raised by Councilwoman Barbara Bry - his main rival - during her closing statement Friday in a mayoral debate at San Diego City College.



Bry noted the existence of a fundraising committee Gloria set up for the 2020 Assembly race and asked: "Mr. Gloria, I want to know what office you are running for."

He didn't respond on stage, but told Times of San Diego afterward that the committee was part of his Assembly majority whip role to raise money for fellow Democrats in Sacramento and beyond.

On Twitter Tuesday night, Gloria spokesman Nick Serrano said: "Nothing has changed, Ken. Todd is running for Mayor." He didn't respond to questions about the 501 filing.



On Monday, however, Alberto Garcia of La Prensa San Diego — the largest local Hispanic newspaper — **reported that Gloria** may have violated state law by failing to file his intention to run for re-election before raising over \$300,000 for his Assembly committee.

"State law requires that all candidates file a Form 501 Candidate Intention Statement declaring their candidacy for election or re-election before any money can be raised for a campaign committee, even if it's the candidate's own money," La Prensa said.

In further reporting Tuesday, La Prensa said Gloria's 501 filing for re-election to the Assembly was hand delivered to the Secretary of State's Office the morning after the paper posed questions to Gloria's campaign manager about the missing form.



Even with Tuesday morning's filing, the California **Secretary of State website** by 6:15 p.m. had yet to show a Gloria candidacy statement for Assembly District 78.

A spokesman for the state **Fair Political Practices Commission** said Monday that no complaints had been filed about Gloria's Assembly 2020 committee.

The spokesman, Jay Wierenga, told Times of San Diego that it's "quite common" for people to have two fundraising committees.

"The most common is that an incumbent candidate would have an open committee for the office he/she holds and one for an election to a different office," he said.

Wierenga wouldn't comment on Gloria's case specifically but said: "It's perfectly fine to have two committees as long as they are for what they say they are and proper recordkeeping/reporting is being done."

Also Monday, veteran San Diego political consultant **Tom Shepard** explained why Bry didn't raise the issue until the last moments of the debate — when Gloria couldn't respond.



"She anticipated the issue would be the subject of a question during the debate,"

Shepard said via email. "Since it didn't come up, she added it to her closing remarks."

Shepard said there was nothing technically illegal about Gloria establishing the account, but "it raises several ethical issues and one potential Political Reform Act violation.

"We haven't been able to find any record that he filed a Form 501 Declaration of Candidacy Form for the 2020 Assembly race, which is required before a candidate-controlled committee can begin raising funds," he noted. "If confirmed, this would be a violation of the Political Reform Act and could taint funds raised and expended by the 2020 committee."

What did Bry hope to gain by noting the Assembly 2020 issue?

Shepard, a strategist for her campaign, said: "I don't think most San Diego voters want Sacramento special interests helping finance a candidate for mayor, nor would they support an attempt by a mayoral candidate to circumvent the city's campaign finance ordinance."

He added: "You can clearly see in Gloria's 2020 Assembly committee campaign report that money has been paid to state legislators' campaign committees and subsequently these legislators endorsed his candidacy for mayor. [The committee] also made expenditures for items that are not related to legitimate Assembly-related activities."

Shepard said he fully anticipated that Gloria would run for mayor.



"But if he is concerned with

transparency, compliance with local campaign finance laws and independence from Sacramento special interests, it's a bad way to start his campaign," he said.



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

### **MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES**

### INTRODUCTION A.

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Plaintiff asks the Court for injunctive relief that would unconstitutionally suppress the free speech rights of Assembly Member Todd Gloria as he seeks to exercise his right to use his campaign funds for lawful purposes. This request for a Temporary Restraining Order, during a critical time of Assembly Member Gloria's campaign for Mayor of San Diego, is being brought solely for political purposes in an attempt to use the Court for political advantage. The Court should deny the Plaintiff's request to unnecessarily intervene in an electoral campaign.

Plaintiff does not meet the standard for the Court to issue a Temporary Restraining Order. First, Plaintiff has made absolutely no showing of imminent harm. Plaintiff made the unsupported statement in his Complaint that there is an agreement between Gloria and the San Diego County Democratic Party (SDCDP) that funds in Gloria's campaign account will be given to the SDCDP in exchange for their support of his mayoral campaign. (See Complaint, ¶19.) Yet, Plaintiff has not presented a shred of evidence to this Court to suggest that any such transfer has been agreed upon or contemplated.

Gloria was admittedly late in filing a required campaign form (Form 501) for his 2020 Assembly campaign. That form has now been filed. Gloria reported the issue to the California Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC), the State agency charged with interpreting and enforcing the State's complex campaign rules, and the matter is currently pending before the FPPC. The Political Reform Act (Act) allows the Court to require a private party seeking an injunction under the Act to await FPPC action on a complaint before moving forward with the injunction request. Therefore, the Court should defer taking any action until the FPPC renders a decision.

Plaintiff previously filed a complaint with the District Attorney and City Attorney asking them to pursue these claims. Under the private right of action provisions of the Act, Plaintiff must wait 120 days to pursue a civil action while awaiting a decision by those agencies.

Plaintiff also is unlikely to prevail on the merits. Gloria's filing of the Form 501 on August 13, 2019 cured his prior failure to file a Form 501, allowing him to spend his funds for any political, legislative or governmental purpose. The fact that Gloria has committees for two

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different offices is of no consequence, and Gloria could have used the leftover funds in his 2018 committee to make contributions to the SDCDP had he not transferred the funds to his 2020 Assembly committee. Lastly, because the transferred funds were not "contributions" under the Act, it is arguable that Gloria was not even required to file a Form 501 prior to transferring leftover funds to his Assembly 2020 Committee.

There is simply no need for the Court to intervene in this electoral matter. Plaintiff is wrong in his legal assertions has made no showing of imminent harm, and the FPPC will determine the appropriate remedies. The Court should reject Plaintiff's request for injunctive relief.

### B. **BACKGROUND**

Following his 2018 re-election to the State Assembly, Gloria opened a committee to run for Mayor of San Diego and, as is permitted under State law, opened a separate campaign committee, Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 (Assembly 2020 Committee). After creating the committee, Gloria transferred \$293,078.05 from his Assembly 2018 Committee to the Assembly 2020 Committee. These funds could have remained in the Assembly 2018 Committee and been used for any political, legislative or governmental purpose – including contributions to SDCDP. Similarly, funds in the Assembly 2020 Committee may be used for any political, legislative or governmental purpose. At no point did these funds become surplus funds under the Political Reform Act, despite Plaintiff's suggestions to the contrary.

The Assembly 2020 Committee inadvertently failed to initially file an FPPC Form 501 Candidate Intention Statement, but corrected this inadvertent error on August 13, 2019. The following day, and before this civil action was initiated, Gloria filed a "self-referral" letter with the FPPC identifying the error. (Declaration of Stephen J. Kaufman, ¶ 2, Exhibit "1.") The FPPC is currently reviewing the issue. Plaintiff filed a complaint that same day with the District Attorney and the City Attorney, asking them to pursue a civil lawsuit against Gloria under the private right of action provisions of the Act. (Kaufman Decl., Exhibit "2.) Plaintiff then filed this suit on August 19, 2019.

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### C. PLACING RESTRICTIONS ON GLORIA'S CAMPAIGN EXPENDITURES INFRINGES ON HIS RIGHT TO FREE SPEECH

Plaintiff is taking the extraordinary step of asking this Court to enjoin Gloria from making campaign expenditures, such as contributions to the San Diego County Democratic Party ("SDCDP"), and prohibiting the SDCDP from making any expenditures using these funds. Such expenditures - were they even contemplated by the parties - constitute the highest level of political speech. (Buckley v. Valeo (1976) 474 U.S. 1, 19-21.)

As the Supreme Court noted in Buckley, "restrictions on the amount of money that can be spent on political communication during a campaign 'necessarily reduces' the quantity of expression by limiting the number of issues discussed, the depth of the discussion, and the discussion's reach." (Id. at 19-21.) Accordingly, Buckley established that government efforts aimed at limiting campaign expenditures are subject to the strictest level of constitutional scrutiny.

The California Supreme Court, in *In re Barry*, specifically applied the strict scrutiny standard to evaluate the validity of injunctions, stating "it is clear that constitutionally permissible restrictions upon the exercise of First Amendment rights must be drawn with a narrow specificity calculated to prevent repression of expressive activities as to which restriction is constitutionally forbidden." (In re Barry (1968) 68 Cal. 2d 137, 155 (holding temporary restraining order was unconstitutionally overbroad in that it unnecessarily restricted the exercise of First Amendment rights).)

Here, Gloria's and the SDCDP's first amendment rights to exercise free speech through the making of political campaign expenditures are at issue. These rights are subject to the highest level of scrutiny, and may not be abridged unless absolutely necessary. There is no showing by Plaintiff here that would warrant infringement upon these precious rights.

### PETITIONER IS NOT ENTITLED TO INJUNCTIVE RELIEF D.

Petitioner's request for a Temporary Restraining Order ("TRO") should be denied. The granting of injunctive relief is an extraordinary power, to be exercised with great caution. A TRO is only appropriate to "restrain[] the . . . continuance of the act complained of" when "great or irreparable injury will result to the applicant before the matter can be heard on notice." (C.C.P. §§ (213) 452-6565 Fax: (213) 452-6575 퍨 1

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526(a), 527(c).) Two interrelated factors must be considered in determining whether to issue a TRO: (1) the likelihood that the plaintiff will prevail on the merits at trial, and (2) the interim harm that the plaintiff is likely to sustain if the restraining order were denied as compared to the harm that the defendant is likely to suffer if the order were issued. (Church of Christ in Hollywood v. Sup. Ct. (2002) 99 Cal. App. 4th 1244, 1251.) While courts may balance the factors in making a determination, "[A] trail court may not grant a [restraining order], regardless of the balance of interim harm, unless there is some possibility that the plaintiff would ultimately prevail on the merits of the claim." (Id. at 1251)

### 1. Plaintiff Cannot Demonstrate Imminent Harm

Plaintiff has not made any showing that irreparable public harm will occur if funds from Gloria's Assembly 2020 Committee are contributed to the SDCDP and then spent by the Party to support Gloria's Mayoral campaign. In fact, Plaintiff has not presented a shred of evidence to establish interim harm. Plaintiff's claims are purely speculative, and even if such a contribution were contemplated, Plaintiff has not established a legal basis for claiming it would be illegal. As noted, this issue is currently being reviewed by the FPPC. The FPPC's decision will guide the future use of the transferred funds from Gloria's Assembly 2018 Committee to his Assembly 2020 Committee. To our knowledge, the FPPC has never ordered a party to return or refrain from spending funds simply because a Form 501 was not timely filed. Thus, Plaintiff is asking the Court to wade into uncharted territory. Awaiting the determination of the FPPC – the State agency charged with interpreting and enforcing the Act – is, therefore, the most appropriate way to proceed under the circumstances. Because Plaintiff has not made any showing of imminent harm, Plaintiff's request for relief must be denied.

### 2. Plaintiff Is Not Likely to Prevail on the Merits

Plaintiff is unlikely to prevail on the merits for several reasons. First, the matter pending before the FPPC is likely to preclude further civil or injunctive action. Second, the matter is also pending before the San Diego District Attorney and San Diego City Attorney, which necessitates Plaintiff waiting 120 days before filing a civil action. Third, the Plaintiff's legal arguments are erroneous.

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### The FPPC Case Precludes Further Action. a.

Under the Act, if the FPPC takes administrative action to resolve a complaint, the issues involved may not be the subject of a civil action. (Govt Code § 91008.5.) Gloria made a selfreferred complaint to the FPPC regarding the late filing of his Form 501. (Kaufman Declaration, ¶2, Exh. "1.") The FPPC can respond by requiring Gloria and his committee to (a) cease and desist any violations of the Act; (b) file any missing reports, statements, or other documents; or (c) pay a monetary penalty. (Govt. Code §83116.) If the Commission orders any of these actions, a civil action by Plaintiff would be precluded.

Further, private individuals seeking an injunction under the Act may be required by the Court to file a complaint with the FPPC prior to seeking injunctive relief. (Govt Code § 91003(a).) Since a complaint is currently pending before the FPPC in this matter, this Court should defer any action until that complaint is resolved.

### Plaintiff Has Not Waited the Required 120 Days Before Filing a Civil b. Action

Under the Act, any private party seeking to enforce the Act's provisions must first give the FPPC or the civil prosecutor 120 days to either initiate a civil action or give permission to the private party to sue. (Govt Code §91007.) If the civil prosecutor or FPPC fail to respond within 120 days, the private party has permission to initiate a civil action.

Plaintiff, in his persistent attempt to secure governmental interference in the San Diego Mayoral election, filed a request on August 14, 2019, with the District Attorney and City Attorney asking them to take action on the issues raised in this complaint. (Kaufman Decl., ¶3, Exh. "2.") Plaintiff has not received permission from the District Attorney or the City Attorney to initiate a civil suit, nor has 120 days passed since Plaintiff made his request. Therefore, Plaintiff is currently precluded from initiating a civil action on the issues that are the subject of this request for injunctive relief.

## Plaintiff's Legal Arguments are Erroneous.

Even if Plaintiff's Complaint survives the procedural infirmities stated above, there is little possibility that Plaintiff will ultimately prevail on his claims. Plaintiff's arguments are both

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factually inaccurate and legally flawed.

First, Gloria's filing of the Form 501 on August 13, 2019, cured any technical deficiencies in his paperwork. Although filed late, the Form 501 was filed months before the 2020 election and simply reiterated what was already publicly stated in the Form 410 Statement of Organization filed by Gloria's Assembly 2020 Committee on February 19, 2019. The Form 410 stated, among other things, Gloria's intention to be a candidate for State Assembly District 78 in the 2020 election. (See Form 410, Exh. "D" to Plaintiff's Decl.) Thus, despite Plaintiff's claims, the Form 501 simply reiterated information that had been available to the public since February 19. And, expenditures made by Gloria's Assembly 2020 Committee before that form was filed legally could have been made by his Assembly 2018 Committee, had Gloria chosen to leave the transferred funds in that committee's bank account rather than transferring them to the new committee.

Plaintiff improperly asserts that the leftover funds in Gloria's Assembly 2018 committee were surplus funds, and that a contribution to the SDCDP would be an illegal use of surplus funds. Government Code section 89519(a), the "surplus funds" provision of the Act, states:

> Upon the 90th day after leaving an elective office, or the 90th day following the end of the postelection reporting period following the defeat of a candidate for elective office, whichever occurs last, campaign funds under the control of the former candidate or elected officer shall be considered surplus campaign funds and shall be disclosed pursuant to Chapter 4 (commencing with Section 84100).

(Emphasis added.)

Gloria won his re-election campaign in 2018. He is the current incumbent Assembly Member representing the 78th Assembly District. He has neither left office, nor was he defeated in the 2018 election. Therefore, Gloria's leftover funds from his 2018 campaign are not – as Plaintiff asserts -- surplus funds.

Rather, as permitted by FPPC rules and regulations, Gloria may continue to use those funds for any political, legislative or governmental purpose until the 90th day after he leaves office. (Campaign Disclosure Manual 1, Chapter 6.1; see also, Government Code sections 89510 through 89522.) The only restriction on Gloria's use of leftover funds from his 2018 campaign is that he could not have used the funds to run for future office unless he transferred them to a new

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committee – which he did. (2 CCR §18525(b).)

All expenditures made by the Assembly 2020 Committee to date either have been associated with holding office or were contributions to other candidates or party committees. These expenditures all have a political, legislative or governmental purpose that could have applied equally to the Assembly 2018 committee had Gloria chosen to keep that committee open. This would also be true of a contribution to the SDCDP – if he wanted to do that. Thus, the failure to timely file a Form 501 does not change the purposes for which those funds may be spent.

Moreover, there is nothing in the Act that prohibits an elected official from maintaining two different committees for different offices. (Martinez FPPC Advice Letter, I-00-187.) In fact, FPPC regulations contemplate an individual running for both state and local office. "When an individual is simultaneously a candidate for elective state office and elective office in a local government agency, or for elective office in two different local jurisdictions, he or she shall, in addition to any other requirements relating to the filing of campaign statements, file campaign statements for all committees he or she controls with both jurisdictions at the locations specified in Section 84215 on the dates the candidate is required to file semiannual statements under Section 84200 and preelection statements under Sections 84200.5 and 84200.8." (2 CCR § 18405(b)(1) (emphasis added).) Thus, there is no basis for Plaintiff's claim that expenditures from Gloria's Assembly 2020 Committee are illegal by virtue of his status as a candidate for multiple offices.

Finally, we question whether it was even necessary for Gloria's Assembly 2020 Committee to file a Form 501 before transferring leftover funds from his Assembly 2018 Committee to his Assembly 2020 Committee, because such funds are not considered "contributions" solicited or received under the Act.

A candidate is required to file a Form 501 "prior to the solicitation or receipt of any contribution." (Cal Govt Code §85200.) Gloria moved the leftover funds remaining from his 2018 campaign to his Assembly 2020 Committee on March 19, 2019 under the "carry over" provisions of the Act. Government Code section 85317 states:

> Notwithstanding subdivision (a) of Section 85306, a candidate for elective state office may carry over contributions raised connection with one election for elective state office to pay campaign expenditures incurred in connection with a subsequent election for

FPPC regulations clarify that "carry over" – as that term is used in Section 85317 – "refers to the movement of campaign funds to the candidate's controlled committee established for a subsequent election to the *same* elective state office without attribution as required by Government Code section 85306(a)." (2 CCR §18537.1(a) (emphasis added).) "The committee receiving the funds is required to report the carry over transfer as a miscellaneous increase to cash on Schedule I -- rather than as a contribution on Schedule A." (FPPC Campaign Disclosure Manual 1, Chapter 1.11.) Gloria's transfer of carry over funds was reported accordingly.<sup>1</sup>

Since Gloria's "carry over" funds are not considered "contributions," it is questionable whether he was even required to file a Form 501 before transferring such funds to his Assembly 2020 Committee. Again, a Form 501 is only required "prior to the solicitation or receipt of any contribution." (Cal Govt Code §85200.) Since the majority of funds at issue were not "contributions" received or solicited by the 2020 Assembly Committee, the existence of a Form 501 prior to the transfer had no effect on these funds.

### E. CONCLUSION

For all of the forgoing reasons, Plaintiff has not met the requirements for obtaining injunctive relief, and the Court should deny Plaintiff's request for issuance of a Temporary Restraining Order and Order to Show Cause re Preliminary Injunction.

We are writing on behalf of Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 ("Committee") (ID No. 1416118), to advise you of an issue regarding the Committee's compliance with the Political Reform Act of 1974, as amended.

The Committee, which qualified in February of this year, is a controlled committee of Assemblymember Todd Gloria. Since its formation, the committee received a carryover transfer (i.e., miscellaneous increase to cash) of \$293,078 from the Assemblymember's 2018 Assembly committee, and approximately \$34,000 in contributions.

Upon review of the Committee's records following a press inquiry, it appears that the Committee's treasurer inadvertently failed to file a Form 501 – Candidate Intention Statement at the time the Committee was initially formed. The Form 501 has since been filed, a date-stamped copy of which is enclosed. Otherwise, the Committee has properly and timely reported all of its activities, as required by the Political Reform Act.

We do not believe that the Committee's inadvertent oversight warrants any further action. Nonetheless, in determining what action, if any, to take against the Committee, we urge you to consider the totality of the facts and circumstances giving rise to this matter, including the fact that the Committee filed the Form 501 as soon as it discovered that it had not been filed; the public harm was negligible because the Form 410 – Statement of Organization filed by the committee upon its formation, contained virtually identical information as is listed on the Form 501; the contributions received by the Committee to date have been small in number and total a relatively small amount; and the Form 501 has been filed well before the election. Finally, we ask you to take into account that, upon becoming aware of this issue, the Committee decided to proactively present this matter to you for a speedy resolution of the issue.

My office represents Kathryn Burton and Mat Wahlstrom. On their behalf, I am requesting that you civilly prosecute Todd Gloria, a representative of California's 78<sup>th</sup> Assembly District and a candidate for Mayor of the City of San Diego, for violations of the Political Reform Act of 1974 (PRA), Gov't Code § 81000 et seq. PRA section 91001(b) designates the San Diego County District Attorney as the civil prosecutor with respect to local agencies for violations of the PRA, and section 91001.5 extends prosecutorial jurisdiction to a charter city's attorney for violations occurring in the city. If your offices do not prosecute, my clients intend to prosecute pursuant to PRA section 91007(a).

In short, my clients have reason to believe that there is a conspiracy to launder campaign money from an illegal campaign committee controlled by Mr. Gloria to the San Diego County Democratic Party, to a candidate to replace Mr. Gloria in the Assembly, and to several sitting members of the Assembly. Such illegal activity would violate the PRA and, for those participants aware of the criminal nature of their wrongdoing, also violate Penal Code section 186.10 (Money Laundering).

Attached to this letter are articles published by La Prensa San Diego on August 12 and 13, 2019, and another published by Times of San Diego on August 13, 2019. (Exhibits 1-3.) In essence, even though Mr. Gloria has formally been running for Mayor of the City of San Diego since December 2018, he established a separate campaign committee earlier this year, "Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020," for an office that he never intended to run for, Assembly District 78. (Exhibit 4.) Not only did he record contributions into his Assembly 2020 committee's bank account, but he transferred nearly \$300,000 from his Assembly 2018 committee to his Assembly 2020 committee a few days before those funds would have become "surplus" by operation of law.

The problem is that Mr. Gloria did not file his declaration of intent to run for re-election to the Assembly in 2020 until August 13, 2019, which is one day after the first article on this subject ran. (Exhibit 5.) The PRA and the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) both prohibit him from soliciting or receiving contributions into his Assembly 2020 committee without first filing his declaration, known as Form 501. Clearly Mr. Gloria created the Assembly 2020 committee for the sole purpose of extending the expiration date on the money left over from his Assembly 2018 committee and allowing him to continue to raise money from sources who would not be qualified to donate to his Mayoral campaign and in amounts exceeding city limitations. Because it was illegal for him to receive money into his 2020 Assembly committee prior to August 13, 2019, it was also illegal for him to use the money for any candidate-related purpose.

Like the form Mr. Gloria signed when he declared his intent to run for Mayor, the form he signed for re-election to the Assembly is signed "under penalty of perjury." (Exhibit 5.) When a reporter for *Times of San Diego* tweeted his story about Mr. Gloria filing to run for re-election to the Assembly, Mr. Gloria's campaign manager and Assembly communications director replied: "Nothing has changed, Ken. Todd is running for Mayor." (Exhibit 6.) The reply is entirely consistent with Mr. Gloria's website, Facebook page, and Twitter account, all of which promote his Mayoral candidacy without any mention of any candidacy for re-election to the Assembly. (Exhibit 7-9.)

In the City of San Diego, not only is it common knowledge that Mr. Gloria has never intended to run for re-election to the Assembly in 2020, but it is widely known that he endorsed Christopher Ward as his replacement in the Assembly and that Mr. Ward in turn endorsed him for Mayor; this announcement was made on Mr. Ward's Facebook page on February 19, 2019. (Exhibit 10.) More than a month later, Mr. Gloria's Assembly 2020 committee donated \$4,700 to Mr. Ward's Assembly committee; both committees reported the transaction as either to or from "Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020." (Exhibit 4, pg. 10.) (Based on the prior cross endorsements (Exhibit 10) Mr. Ward knew, at the time he received the donation from Mr. Gloria's Assembly 2020 committee, that he was receiving funds from an illegitimate committee controlled by a non-candidate.)

According to the latest disclosures by Tasha Boerner Horvath, who unlike Mr. Gloria is running for re-election to the Assembly, she received a donation from his Assembly 2020 committee on June 7, 2019. (Exhibit 11, pg. 36.) However, she endorsed him for Mayor more than two months earlier, according to his Facebook page (Exhibit 12) and therefore knew that his donation was from an illegitimate committee controlled by a non-candidate.

Ms. Boerner Horvath is not the only member of the Assembly who took tainted money from Mr. Gloria with the knowledge that he was not running for re-election. According to Mr. Gloria's Facebook page, by April 26, 2019, every Democratic member of the Assembly had

endorsed him. (Exhibit 13.) Two months later, he rewarded five of them with a donation of \$1,000 each from his Assembly 2020 campaign: Christy Smith, Cottie Petrie-Norris, Rebecca Bauer-Kahan, James Ramos, and Sabrina Cervantes. They too knew that they were illegally receiving money from a non-candidate.

Aspiring and serving Assembly members are not the only ones involved in taking illegal payments from Mr. Gloria's illegitimate committee. On May 23, 2019, he appears to have made a down-payment toward a Mayoral endorsement by the San Diego County Democratic Party. (Exhibit 4, pg. 11.) That is when he delivered \$5,000 to the Party as evidence that he would transfer the remainder of his Assembly 2020 committee funds to the Party if it endorses him for Mayor.

Based on the information currently available to my clients, they believe Mr. Gloria has violated several provisions of the PRA. He repeatedly violated PRA section 85200 by soliciting and receiving multiple contributions to his Assembly 2020 committee before filing a statement of intent to run for the Assembly in 2020; without filing that statement, the FPPC's manual makes clear, he could not lawfully receive any funds into his Assembly 2020 committee, not even a transfer from his Assembly 2018 committee. Second, he violated PRA section 89519 by not distributing his Assembly 2018 campaign funds in accordance with the distribution requirements for surplus funds, which do not allow such funds to be used to support his own campaign or be donated to a candidate or to a political party to be used to support or oppose any candidate; however, he used those funds to support multiple candidates, including the candidate running to replace him in the Assembly. Third, he violated PRA sections 84301 and 85701 by using his Assembly 2020 committee as the nominal donor to pass through donations to other candidates and to the San Diego County Democratic Party in violation of the rules against campaign money laundering. Finally, it appears that Mr. Gloria as well as Mr. Ward, Ms. Boerner Horvath and her aforementioned colleagues in the Assembly, and someone at the highest level of the San Diego County Democratic Party knew about the illegal nature of Mr. Gloria's Assembly 2020 committee and the monies they received from it, making them liable for aiding, abetting, and conspiring with Mr. Gloria to violate a long list of campaign-related laws.

Dear Chair Miadich and Commissioners:

We are writing as Chair and Vice Chair of the Commission's Enforcement Review Task Force to provide you with a summary of the Task Force's work and our recommendation for further action.

The Task Force was created by the Commission in May 2018. The Commission ultimately selected a Task Force of 32 members representing a broad spectrum of stakeholders who either are regulated by the Political Reform Act or who actively monitor or report on the activities of those who are regulated by the Act.

The Task Force was given broad direction from the Commission and a deadline of December 2018 to complete its work. Given the scope of the potential issues, it became apparent at our initial meetings that the time-frame provided by the Commission for completing our work was insufficient. As a result, we requested additional time to complete our work, and the Commission extended the Task Force's deadline to allow for appropriate deliberations.

The Task Force began its work by examining ways to expand the Commission's streamlined enforcement program and warning letter criteria to include technical violations of the Act that result in minimal public harm and, therefore, do not warrant full enforcement. Working with the Commission's staff, the Task Force helped develop regulations to expand the Commission's streamlined enforcement program and clarify the criteria for issuing warning letters. We are pleased that these efforts resulted in the Commission's adoption of Regulations 18360.1 and 18360.2 at its January 17, 2019 meeting. We believe that these regulations will ensure that filers are held accountable, while allowing the Commission to focus its resources on more serious violations of the Act.

The Task Force next studied issues relating to the Commission's complaint and investigative process, including notification and due process considerations for respondents while a complaint is pending and the information available to the public throughout the investigative process. The Task Force had a lively debate about these competing considerations and presented its findings to the Commission at its March 21, 2019 meeting.

Finally, members of the Task Force firmly believe that the Commission should engage in an annual or periodic review of its own enforcement priorities to ensure that it is taking appropriate action through the enforcement process. Such regular reviews will provide the Commission with an opportunity to determine whether enforcement actions that may have been taken in response to a new statutory requirement may be too extreme or excessive in retrospect. In other instances, the Commission may conclude that it is not pursuing enough enforcement on an issue that has risen in public importance. Setting enforcement priorities in this manner will give direction to the staff on how the Commission would like cases enforced prior to them coming before the Commission, and will also provide the regulated community with notice that the Commission intends to pursue enforcement in areas that it may not have pursued previously. This is a preferable alternative to the Commission making important policy decisions through the enforcement process.

We believe that any remaining areas of interest to members of the Task Force should be addressed by the Commission through regular and ongoing communications between the Commission's staff and parties who have a direct interest in the subject matter. Thus, we believe it is an appropriate time for the Task Force to conclude its business.

We appreciate the opportunity to serve the Commission and the People of California on these significant issues of public importance. We look forward to working with the Commission as we enter this next election cycle.

This letter is in response to the sworn complaint you submitted on September 11, 2019, to the Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission regarding the above-referenced committee. Since the allegations in your complaint are the subject of an existing case, we will not open a new complaint on this matter. The parts of your complaint regarding campaign filing have been incorporated into our existing case, FPPC Case No. 2019-00969.

However, after a review of the complaint and the documents submitted, the Enforcement Division found the allegation pertaining to surplus funds to be unfounded. Campaign funds held by an officeholder become surplus on the 90<sup>th</sup> day after the officeholder leaves the office for which the funds were raised, or on the 90<sup>th</sup> day after the end of the post-election reporting period following his defeat, whichever occurs last. Since Mr. Gloria won his election and did not leave the office of Assemblymember, the funds did not become surplus under the Act. Therefore, we will not pursue this specific allegation further.

You will next receive notification from us upon the final disposition of the case. However, please be advised that at this time we have not made any determination about the validity of the allegation(s) you have made or about the culpability, if any, of the person(s) you identify in your complaint.

### Assemblyman Todd Gloria Gets Stern Finger Wag From FPPC on Campaign Violations

Everyone in the Capitol knew he had no intention of running for re-election, and planned to run for San Diego Mayor

San Diego Democrat Assemblyman Todd Gloria and the Fair Political Practices Commission have reached a settlement over Gloria's violations of the California Political Reform Act — a whopping \$200 fine.

If this tiny penalty suggests a tiny violation, think again. Gloria improperly funded a bogus committee for his re-election to the Assembly in order to use funds left over from his successful 2018 run for that office to now fund his campaign for Mayor of San Diego, which is totally illegal.

"The mission of the Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission is to fairly, effectively, and efficiently enforce the provisions of the Political Reform Act," the FPPC website says. "If the case merits pursuit of a fine, the Enforcement Division will **00286** 



Gloria was trying to skirt the fact that the two elected offices have significant differing campaign contribution limits. The Assembly limit is \$4,700 per donor and the Mayor limit in San Diego is \$1,150. By transferring the 2018 Assembly funds to another 2020 Assembly fund, no reduction in the amounts contributed was required. Had that money been transferred to the Mayor committee, any donation over the City imposed limit of \$1,150 would have had to be reduced.

The San Diego Union Tribune reported:

Less than a week after he filed the statement of intention, Gloria was sued by San Diego resident Mat Wahlstrom for allegedly raising hundreds of thousands of dollars for his state campaign even though he was instead seeking the mayor's job.

In August Wahlstrom and his attorney asked a judge in San Diego Superior Court to prevent Gloria from spending those funds to support his mayoral bid. The judge declined that request.

Wahlstrom called the \$200 payout a slap on the wrist.

California Globe covered Gloria's violations, and in August interviewed one of the attorneys representing Walstrom:

Speaking with attorney Julie Biggs, who is involved in the case, she offered the following facts:

- 1. Gloria was re-elected to the Assembly in November of 2018 and had funds remaining in his 2018 Assembly committee amounting to nearly \$300,000.
- 2. Gloria filed a Statement of Intention to run for the office of Mayor of San Diego (form 501) and established an election committee for that campaign on December 18, 2018. He formally announced his candidacy for that office and has been actively campaigning since that time.
- 3. Apparently to avoid having his 2018 funds declared surplus and therefore subject to strict limitations as to use, Gloria filed papers to form a new 2020 Assembly committee on March 19, 2019. That filing, however, did not include filing the required Statement of Intention (form 501) to run for that office.
- 4. Gloria transferred his 2018 Assembly committee funds to the 2020 Assembly committee on March 19, 2019.
- 5. Gloria contributed \$4,700 to the candidate who declared his candidacy for Gloria's seat on March 28, 2019.
- 6. The 2020 Assembly committee has raised an additional \$25,000 or so and has expended about \$45,000 to support other campaigns and to contribute to the Democratic party in support of events attended by Gloria as a candidate for Mayor.
- 7. Gloria has affirmatively stated in response to questioning by another candidate for Mayor that he is not running for the Assembly seat but is running for Mayor.
- 8. Gloria submitted his Statement of Intention to run for the Assembly seat on August 13, 2019, the day after the story was published locally.

Attorney Biggs explained that California law precludes a campaign committee from collecting contributions prior to the filing of the Statement of Intention (Form 501) to run for the office for which the committee will be raising funds. Knowing and willful violation of that law is a misdemeanor which may be punished by a fine of \$10,000 or three times the amount of the contribution illegally made or accepted, whichever is higher.

Wahlstrom called the \$200 payout a slap on the wrist, the UT reported. "I wish I could say I'm shocked that a politician who commits perjury and fraudulently raises corporate money for a mayoral race that does not allow corporate donors would be slapped on the wrist," Wahlstrom said. "But I'm not: the FPPC is designed to protect officeholders first and foremost. This is what's wrong with our system. This is why I filed suit in the first place — and why I will continue fighting to make sure that the public and Mr. Gloria both receive the justice they deserve."

Barbara Bry, Gloria's opponent in the Mayor's race said, "Todd Gloria has acknowledged that he has violated the Political Reform Act, but the FPPC findings don't address the fact that he is using this ruse to funnel \$300,000 of special interest corporate and PAC contributions

### Does the FPPC help voters or those in power?: Susan Shelley

The California Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) is about to fine Assemblyman Todd Gloria, D-San Diego, for violating the law when he moved nearly \$300,000 in leftover funds from his 2018 Assembly campaign to a 2020 re-election committee even though he wasn't really running for re-election, then used the money in ways that supported his 2020 campaign for mayor of San Diego.

Total proposed fine: \$200.

Gloria created the 2020 re-election campaign early in 2019 and transferred the money from the 2018 committee before the funds became "surplus" under the law, which limits their use in politics. It was illegal because Gloria didn't file the required Statement of Intention to run in 2020 before opening the committee to raise money. Those forms have to be signed under penalty of perjury.

The statement was finally filed on August 13, after a community newspaper questioned the campaign manager about the missing form.

The FPPC says Gloria's campaign "self-reported" the omission. The Enforcement Division reached a quick settlement in its "streamline" program for minor violations, checking the box on the form marked, "Found no evidence of intent to conceal."

Judge for yourself.

By pretending to be a candidate for re-election in 2020, Gloria was able to raise more money from individual donors than was allowed by city election rules in San Diego. The per-donor contribution limit is \$4,700 for the Assembly campaign, but only \$1,150 in the mayor's race.

Gloria's \$200 fine is set to be considered by the FPPC at its meeting on November 21.

In comparison, another case on the November agenda involves Scott Jackson, who was elected in 2016 as a Superior Court judge in Alameda County. Jackson hired a professional treasurer, who filed the required preelection campaign finance reports with the Alameda County Registrar of Voters. However, because the campaign raised more than \$25,000, it was also supposed to file the same reports with the Secretary of State's office, and the treasurer neglected to do that. The FPPC Enforcement Division contacted the campaign about the omission. Jackson hired a new treasurer, had all the reports reviewed and filed, and "fully cooperated" with the investigation, according to the FPPC's stipulated agreement.

The proposed fine against Judge Jackson is \$6,000 for three counts of "violating the Political Reform Act."

What is going on in this agency? We don't know, because there's no oversight of any kind. But consider its 2017 resolution of cases involving high-level political figures including former Gov. Jerry Brown.

In 2016, Consumer Watchdog filed a sworn complaint with the FPPC alleging that millions of dollars in political contributions from energy companies, including the investor-owned utilities such as PG&E, were being laundered through the California Democratic Party to evade contribution limits to campaigns and to influence decisions made by the Brown administration.

FPPC Enforcement Chief Galena West responded to the organization in a letter dated September 23, 2016, stating that the agency would open an investigation into the California Democratic Party, but not "the other persons identified in your complaint." Gov. Brown was not investigated.

Here's how that case, No. 16/19635, turned out: the FPPC determined that the California Democratic Party and its treasurer "failed to identify the committee bank account as 'all purpose,' failed to notify a recipient of contributions from which account the funds derived, and failed to deposit contributions into the correct account." Total fine: \$3,500.

In a scathing letter to the FPPC dated May 24, 2017, Consumer Watchdog accused the Enforcement Division of failing to interview witnesses and ignoring evidence in that case as well as in case No. 16/263, which involved Nancy McFadden, a former Pacific Gas & Electric executive who became a top adviser to Brown. She failed to disclose energy-related holdings on her required annual Statement of Economic Interests for three years straight, at a time when legislation affecting her holdings was moving through the state Legislature. The FPPC fined her a total of \$300.

As you know, I have more than a passing interest in this subject. Last month, the FPPC approved a fine against me for what they acknowledge is the unintentional late filing of some pre-election reports in a 2013 special election for the Assembly, when I was a first-time state candidate with an all-volunteer campaign. Although the Enforcement Division wrote in 2017 that my campaign had "substantially complied" with the law, that I had made a good-faith effort throughout, and that there was no evidence of intent to conceal or deceive, the commission approved a fine of \$11,500.

At the FPPC's next meeting on November 21, the commissioners will consider whether to approve the stipulated agreements reached with Assemblyman Todd Gloria and Judge Scott Jackson. Then, at a second meeting on November 22, the commissioners will hear from Enforcement Division chief Galena West about "topics for input and discussion from the public and the Commission." Among the topics: "Analysis of 2019 Enforcement Trends."

Dear Commissioners and Enforcement Division Chief:

I represent Mat Wahlstrom, who filed a sworn complaint alleging multiple violations of the Political Reform Act (PRA) in matter no. COM-09112019-01765 against Assemblymember Todd Gloria. By letter dated September 24, 2019, Chief of Enforcement Galena West notified my client that parts of his complaint have been incorporated into existing FPPC case no. 2019-00969, that a small portion was deemed to lack foundation, and that the remainder had not yet received a determination. Case no. 2019-00969 arises from a self-reported violation by Mr. Gloria and is discussed in the Chief of Enforcement's executive staff report for the upcoming meeting on November 21, 2019. My client objects to the proposed resolution of case no. 2019-00969.

In San Diego, Mr. Gloria has been openly campaigning for Mayor of San Diego since December 2018. However, he formed his Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020 committee in March 2019, transferred more than \$293,000 from his Assembly 2018 committee to his Assembly 2020 committee, and accepted more than \$25,000 in contributions to his Assembly 2020 committee. The problem is that he had not filed his Form 501 to run for re-election to the Assembly in 2020. When this fact was reported in a local San Diego newspaper, Mr. Gloria denied that he was running for Assembly and affirmed that he was running only for Mayor. Amid mounting public scrutiny, he filed his Form 501 for re-election to the Assembly in 2020 on August 13, 2019 – under penalty of perjury – but simultaneously issued a public statement that he was running for Mayor and was not running for re-election to the Assembly.

The reason Mr. Gloria created his Assembly 2020 committee despite having no intention to run for re-election to the Assembly – and despite filing Form 501 under penalty of perjury to the contrary – is to launder money raised in connection with his Assembly office into his Mayoral campaign. The City of San Diego limits the amount of contributions to \$1,150 per election cycle and limits the source of contributions to natural persons and political parties. For his phony Assembly re-election, however, Mr. Gloria enjoys contribution limits that are more than four times higher and can accept corporate donations. Mr. Gloria may now launder his Assembly monies into the San Diego County Democratic Party to spend on his behalf in the Mayoral race, which includes a donation in excess of \$25,000 directly to his Mayoral committee and party expenditure for his benefit.

The foregoing accusations are substantiated by the evidence that my client previously submitted to the FPPC when he submitted his sworn complaint. The executive staff report indicates that Ms. West will be imposing a paltry fine of \$200 on Mr. Gloria as part of the FPPC's streamlined penalty process. My client believes that this result is improper and illegal for multiple reasons.

First, there is no statutory authority for the streamlined program. FPPC Regulation 18360.1 authorizes the Chief of Enforcement to include or exclude any filer from the streamlined program. However, the PRA does not authorize this delegation of authority. The Legislature has authorized the FPPC to delegate authority to the Chair and to the Executive Director. Gov't Code § 83108. As a public agency with a special and limited jurisdiction, the FPPC has only those express (or necessarily implied) powers which are specifically granted to it by statute. See, e.g., City of Ceres v. City of Modesto, 274 Cal. App. 2D 545, 550 (1969). The authority for the FPPC to delegate an enforcement decision to the Chief of Enforcement does not exist.

Second, even if such authority existed and Regulation 18360.1 were valid, Mr. Gloria's belated filing of Form 501 declaring his candidacy for an office that he has never intended to occupy does falls under multiple exceptions to the process for streamlined treatment. The late filing is excluded by sub-section (c)(2)(B)(i) because there is evidence that Mr. Gloria, who has run for elected office multiple times and is thoroughly familiar with the rules, intended to conceal his fundraising for Mayor by abusing his Assembly 2020 campaign and intended to violate the PRA in the process; up until the day he filed his Form 501 and every moment since, he has denied that he is a candidate for re-election to that office. The late filing is also excluded by sub-section (c)(2)(B)(vii) because laundering any amount of money, or even attempting to do so, causes serious public harm and erodes the public's confidence in the integrity of the electoral process. The late filing is further excluded by sub-section (c)(2)(B)(viii) because Mr. Gloria remains under investigation for other aspects of my client's sworn complaint, as confirmed by Ms. West's letter dated September 24. At a minimum the matter should be put into abeyance until his Assembly 2020 committee and his Mayoral committee issue their next campaign-

finance reports so that you can follow the money and see exactly how badly he has abused the system.<sup>1</sup>

Third, even if Mr. Gloria arguably qualified for streamlined treatment under Regulation 18360.1, he is not being properly punished under Regulation 18360.2 with a meager penalty of \$200. His Assembly 2020 committee received nearly \$320,000 during the first half of 2019, and only Mr. Gloria knows how much he raised prior to the day he filed his Form 501 on August 13, 2019. Yet the worksheet showing how the penalty was calculated does not include the 1% of contributions required by the Regulation. Because the PRA defines "contributions" to include transfers from a candidate's own committee, the fine should include at least \$3,200 on top of the \$200 penalty. Under no circumstances should the fine be less than \$3,400, and you should be waiting until after his Assembly 2020 reports its contributions through August 13, 2019, in order to know the full amount of contributions that should be subject to the additional 1% penalty.

In closing, I urge you to carefully consider the propriety of allowing Mr. Gloria to be slapped on the wrist when the evidence clearly establishes a premeditated plan to launder money from his state-office committee into his local-office committee. Doing so would violate the PRA and your own regulations.

Perhaps more importantly, I urge you to consider how the public will perceive the fine imposed on Mr. Gloria for such egregious conduct. The press has already written multiple articles critical of the FPPC's minimization of Mr. Gloria's fraud on the public.<sup>2</sup> The fact that Mr. Gloria's attorney in the matter, Gary Winuk, is the FPPC's former enforcement chief fuels the public's perception that the FPPC is primarily an incumbent-protection racket rather than an agency charged with protecting the integrity of the electoral system.

The worksheet showing how the \$200 penalty was calculated is very disturbing. For example, it fails to recognize that Mr. Gloria has a high level of experience and sophistication on election matters, contrary to sub-section (c)(2)(A)(i); only "self-reported" after his violations were detailed by the press, contrary to sub-section (c)(2)(A)(ii); has caused major public harm by creating a scheme to launder excessive, corporate donations into a campaign that prohibits both, contrary to sub-section (c)(2)(A)(iii); received nearly \$320,000 into this Assembly 2020 committee before filing Form 501, contrary to sub-section (c)(2)(A)(iv); and the Form 501 is related to the re-election that triggered the filing obligation, contrary to sub-section (c)(2)(A)(xiv). None of those factors is mentioned in the worksheet.

For these reasons, I encourage the FPPC to reject the proposed \$200 fine against Mr. Gloria, to conduct a thorough investigation of all the pending allegations against him (which means waiting until all relevant campaign-finance reports are available to the public), and then to take action that fully recognizes the gravity of the scam that Mr. Gloria was perpetrating against the public.

Staff: Neal Bucknell, Senior Commission Counsel and Bob Perna, Program Specialist II. The Respondents were represented by the Law Office of Andreas Rockas and the Law Offices of Wayne Ordos. This matter arose from an audit performed by the Franchise Tax Board's Political Reform Audit Program. Joseph Canciamilla is the former Contra Costa County Clerk-Recorder and Registrar of Voters, as well as a former candidate for Contra Costa County Superior Court Judge. Joe Canciamilla for Contra Costa County Clerk/Recorder 2014/2018 and Joe Canciamilla for Judge 2012/2014 are his candidate-controlled committees. In 2011, 2014, and 2015, Canciamilla used campaign funds for personal purposes which were unrelated to a political, legislative, or governmental purpose, in violation of Government Code Sections 89510, subdivision (b), 89512, and 89513, subdivision (a) (15 counts). From 2011 through 2019, this activity was concealed on campaign statements by other reporting violations including non-reporting and the overstatement of available cash on hand, in violation of Government Code Section 84211 (14 counts). Also, in 2011 Canciamilla and his judge committee commingled campaign funds with personal funds, in violation of Government Code Section 84307 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$150,000 - \$75,000 (Canciamilla personally) and \$75,000 (Canciamilla and his committees).

#### Canciamilla - Stip

4. In the Matter of Michael D. Jackson for School Board 2016, Michael D. Jackson, and Kelvin Barrios; FPPC Nos. 17/964 and 18/1465. Staff: Theresa Gilbertson, Commission Counsel and Marshall Miller, Special Investigator. The respondents are represented by Matthew Soleimanpour of Soleiman, APC. Michael D. Additionally, Jackson used campaign funds for personal purposes which were unrelated to a political, legislative, or governmental purpose, in violation of Government Code Section 89512 (1 count). Barrios also used the Jackson committee campaign funds in this way, and in addition impermissibly used campaign funds as treasurer from the California Young Democrats Latino Caucus committee for personal purposes, in violation of Government Code Sections 89512 and 89512.5 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$8,500 – \$2,000 (Jackson, Barrios and Committee), \$2,500 (Jackson personally), and \$4,000 (Barrios personally).

adequate records for expenditures made from the 2014 committee's bank account, in violation of San Bernardino Ordinance Section 12.4313 (a) and Government Code Section 84104 (1 count). **Total Proposed Penalty: \$10,000.**

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### I. ENFORCEMENT DIVISION

STAFF: GALENA WEST, CHIEF OF ENFORCEMENT

#### I. Overview

During the period of October 1, 2019 through October 31, 2019 the Enforcement Division received 80 complaints, opened 20 for investigation, and rejected 35. The Enforcement Division received 185 late filer referrals during this time. The Enforcement Division closed a total of 140 cases including:

- 51 warning letters campaign violations (20), conflict of interest violations (1), and statement of economic interests violations (30);
- 49 no action closure letters alleging campaign violations (15), statement of economic interests violations (29), advertisement violations (3) conflict of interest violations (1); behested payment violations (1);
- 1 advisory letter for an advertisement violation;
- 34 approved stipulations at the September Commission meeting; and
- 5 committees were administratively terminated.

The Division had 1,597 cases in various stages of resolution at the time of the October Monthly Report and currently has approximately 1,727 cases in various stages of resolution, including the 44 cases before the Commission as listed in the November 2019 Agenda.

On May 1, 2015, the Division received from the Secretary of State's office 2,460 \$50 Annual Fee referrals for 2013 fees not paid timely. Of those, 4 remain pending. On October 22, 2015, the Division received the \$50 Annual Fee referrals for 2014, which totaled 1,786. Of those, 10 remain pending. We are receiving 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2018 referrals periodically through the new Electronic Complaint System.

#### **II. Annual Statistics**

On the next page, you will find a chart that details the annual statistics for enforcement complaints, referrals and cases. This chart includes the data from 2018, where consistent with other years, 966 cases were closed with violations found. The penalties collected decreased as the emphasis on providing warnings increased. The information in the chart has been gathered from public reports, information from the defunct and inactive database, and data that has been converted into current form, so the numbers are close estimates in some instances.

In the Matter of American Civil Liberties Union/Northern California/Southern California/San Diego and Imperial Counties; FPPC No. 19/1233. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Chloe Hackert, Political Reform Consultant. The respondent was represented by James Harrison of Remcho, Johansen, and Purcell LLP. American Civil Liberties Union/Northern California/Southern California/San Diego and Imperial Counties (the "ACLU") is a lobbyist employer. The ACLU failed to timely report payments to influence legislative or administrative action, for the reporting periods of January 1, 2018 through September 30, 2018, and January 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019, in violation of Government Code Section 86116 (5 counts). Total Proposed Penalty: \$685.

#### **Campaign Bank Account**

In the Matter of Friends of Adam Hill Supervisor 2016 and Adam Hill; FPPC No. 16/237.

Staff: Bridgette Castillo, Senior Commission Counsel and Jay Martin, Special Investigator. Adam Hill was a successful candidate for San Luis Obispo County Supervisor in the June 7, 2016 Primary Election, and is currently in office. Friends of Adam Hill Supervisor 2016 was his candidate-controlled committee. The Committee and Hill failed to pay expenses from the designated campaign bank account, in violation of Government Code Section 85201, subdivisions (d) and (e) (1 count). **Total Proposed Penalty: \$125.** 

#### **Campaign Late Filer**

In the Matter of El Tejon Excellence for Education – Yes on Measure D and Wendy Jones; FPPC No. 19/406. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Tara Stock, Intake Manager. El Tejon Excellence for Education – Yes on Measure D is a local primarily formed committee supporting Measure D, which was approved by Kern County voters at the June 5, 2018 Primary Election. Wendy Jones is the Committee's treasurer. The Committee and Jones failed to timely file a pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of January 1, 2018 through May 19, 2018, in violation of Government Code Section 84200.5 (1 count); two semiannual campaign statements for the reporting periods of May 20, 2018 through June 30, 2018 and July 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018, in violation of Government Code Section 84200 (2 counts); and two 24-Hour Reports, in violation of Government Code Section 84203 (2 counts). Total Proposed Penalty: \$1,592.

In the Matter of California Young Democrats Latino Caucus, Kelvin Barrios, and Sean Rivas; FPPC No. 17/1473. Staff: Ruth Yang, Commission Counsel and Lance Hachigian, Special Investigator. The Committee and Sean Rivas were represented by Emily Andrews of Olson Hagel & Fishburn LLP, and Kelvin Barrios was represented by Matthew Soleimanpour of Soleiman, APC. California Young Democrats Latino Caucus is a local general purpose committee. Sean Rivas is the Committee's current treasurer and Kelvin Barrios was the Committee's treasurer from 2016 through 2017. The Committee, Rivas, and Barrios failed to timely file six semiannual campaign statements for the reporting periods of January 1, 2016 through June 30, 2016; July 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016; January 1, 2017 through June 30, 2017; July 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017; January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018; and July 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018, in violation of Government Code Section 84200 (6 counts). Total Proposed Penalty: \$1,369.

In the Matter of Jeffrey Greenberg and Affiliated Entities, including Global Personals LLC, Worldwide Connect, and WealthyMen.Com; FPPC No. 19/944. Staff: Theresa Gilbertson, Commission Counsel and Ann Flaherty, Special Investigator. The respondents were represented by Mark Bryn of Bryn & Associates P.A. Greenberg and affiliated entities qualified as a major donor in 2016 after contributing to the No on Proposition 60, Californians Against Worker Harassment, Sponsored by the Free Speech Coalition. Greenberg failed to timely file a 24-Hour Report, in violation of Government Code Section 84203 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$600.

In the Matter of Ybarra City Council District 2018, John Ybarra, and Lisa Kennedy; FPPC No. 18/892. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Tara Stock, Intake Manager. John Ybarra was an unsuccessful candidate for Fullerton City Council in the November 6, 2018 General Election. Ybarra City Council District 2018 was his candidate-controlled committee. Lisa Kennedy was the Committee's treasurer. The Committee, Ybarra, and Kennedy failed to timely file a pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of January 1, 2018 through September 22, 2018, in violation of Government Code Section 84200.5 (1 count), and failed to timely file a 24-Hour Report, in violation of Government Code Section 84203 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$537.

In the Matter of Cook for Supervisor 2020 and David Cook; FPPC No. 19/1237. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Tara Stock, Intake Manager. The respondents were represented by Michael Columbo of Neilsen Merksamer Parrinello Gross & Leoni, LLP. David Cook is a candidate for Sonoma County Supervisor in the upcoming March 3, 2020 Primary Election. Cook for Supervisor 2020 is his candidate-controlled committee. The Committee and Cook failed to timely file a semiannual campaign statement for the reporting period of January 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019, in violation of Government Code Section 84200 (1 count). Cook also failed to file a Candidate Intention Statement prior to receiving contributions related to the election, in violation of Government Code Section 85200 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$478.

In the Matter of Elect G. Mario Fernandez for School Board 2018, G. Mario Fernandez, and Eric Paredes; FPPC No. 18/917. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Dominika Wojenska, Associate Governmental Program Analyst. G. Mario Fernandez was an unsuccessful candidate for Eureka City Schools Governing Board in the November 6, 2018 General Election. Elect G. Mario Fernandez for School Board 2018 is his candidate-controlled committee. Eric Paredes is the Committee's treasurer. The Committee, Fernandez, and Paredes failed to timely file a pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of July 1, 2018 through September 22, 2018, in violation of Government Code Section 84200.5 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$422.

In the Matter of 43rd Republican Assembly District Central Committee and Bill Saracino; FPPC No. 18/219. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Dominika Wojenska, Associate Governmental Program Analyst. 43rd Republican Assembly District Central Committee is a local general purpose committee. Bill Saracino is the Committee's treasurer. The Committee and Saracino failed to timely file two semiannual campaign statements for the reporting periods of July 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016 and January 1, 2017 through June 30, 2017, in violation of Government Code Section 84200 (2 counts). Total Proposed Penalty: \$400.

In the Matter of Dime Systems LLC; FPPC No. 19/942. Staff: Theresa Gilbertson, Commission Counsel and Ann Flaherty, Special Investigator. The respondent was represented by Mark Bryn of Bryn & Associates P.A. Dime Systems LLC qualified as a major donor in 2016 after contributing to the No on Proposition 60, Californians Against Worker Harassment, Sponsored by the Free Speech Coalition. Dime Systems LLC failed to timely file a 24-Hour Report, in violation of Government Code Section 84203 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$300.

In the Matter of Pro Data Tech LLC; FPPC No. 19/943. Staff: Theresa Gilbertson, Commission Counsel and Ann Flaherty, Special Investigator. The respondent was represented by Mark Bryn of Bryn & Associates P.A. Pro Data Tech LLC qualified as a major donor in 2016 after contributing to the No on Proposition 60, Californians Against Worker Harassment, Sponsored by the Free Speech Coalition. Pro Data Tech LLC failed to timely file a 24-Hour Report, in violation of Government Code Section 84203 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$300.

In the Matter of Web Data Solutions LLC; FPPC No. 19/945. Staff: Theresa Gilbertson, Commission Counsel and Ann Flaherty, Special Investigator. The respondent was represented by Mark Bryn of Bryn & Associates P.A. Web Data Solutions LLC qualified as a major donor in 2016 after contributing to the No on Proposition 60, Californians Against Worker Harassment, Sponsored by the Free Speech Coalition. Web Data Solutions LLC failed to timely file a 24-Hour Report, in violation of Government Code Section 84203 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$300.

In the Matter of Duarte Unified Education Association PAC and Tracy Hall; FPPC No. 19/583. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Tara Stock, Intake Manager. Duarte Unified Education Association PAC is a local general purpose committee. Tracy Hall was the Committee's treasurer at the time this violation occurred. The Committee and Hall failed to timely file a semiannual campaign statement for the reporting period of October 21, 2018 through December 31, 2018, in violation of Government Code Section 84200 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$289.

In the Matter of Flicker 4 School Board 2018 and Amy Flicker; FPPC No. 19/593. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Tara Stock, Intake Manager. Amy Flicker was an unsuccessful candidate for Trustee of San Dieguito Union High School District Board of Education in the November 6, 2018 General Election. Flicker 4 School Board 2018 was her candidate-controlled committee. The Committee and Flicker failed to timely file a pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of September 23, 2018 through October 20, 2018, in violation of Government Code Section 84200.5 (1 count). **Total Proposed Penalty: \$234.** 

In the Matter of Anaheim Neighborhood Association and Lewis A. Aguilar; FPPC No. 18/895. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Dominika Wojenska, Associate Governmental Program Analyst. Anaheim Neighborhood Association is a local general purpose committee. Lewis A. Aguilar is the Committee's treasurer. The Committee and Aguilar failed to timely file a pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of July 1, 2018 through September 22, 2018, in violation of Government Code Section 84200.5 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$220.

In the Matter of Galt Certificated and Classified Employees Committee on Political Education and Julie Lewis; FPPC No. 18/752. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Chloe Hackert, Political Reform Consultant. Galt Certificated and Classified Employees Committee on Political Education is a local general purpose committee. Julie Lewis is the Committee's treasurer. The Committee and Lewis failed to timely file a semiannual campaign statement for the reporting period of January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018, in violation of Government Code Section 84200 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$217.

In the Matter of Todd Gloria; FPPC No. 19/969. Staff: Bridgette Castillo, Senior Commission Counsel and Luz Bonetti, Supervising Management Auditor. Todd Gloria, a current member of the California State Assembly, was re-elected to the 78<sup>th</sup> District Assembly in the November 6, 2018 General Election. Gloria failed to timely file a Candidate Intention Statement prior to receiving contributions to his candidate-controlled committee, Todd Gloria for Assembly 2020, in violation of Government Code Section 85200 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$200.

#### **Campaign Late Reporter**

In the Matter of Valencia for Orange City Council 2018, Betty Valencia, and Joana Barcelona; FPPC No. 19/006. Staff: Megan A. Van Arsdale, Commission Counsel and Special Investigator, Lance M. Hachigian. Betty Valencia was an unsuccessful candidate for Orange City Council in the November 6, 2018 General Election. Valencia for Orange City Council 2018 was her candidate-controlled committee. Joana Barcelona was the Committee's treasurer. The

Committee, Valencia, and Barcelona failed to timely disclose a non-monetary contribution on a pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of September 23, 2018 through October 20, 2018, in violation of Government Code Section 84211 (1 count). **Total Proposed Penalty: \$128.** 

In the Matter of Daysog for Council 2018 and Tony Daysog; FPPC No. 18/1235. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Ginny Lambing, Political Reform Consultant. Tony Daysog was a successful candidate for Alameda City Council in the November 6, 2018 General Election. Daysog for Council 2018 was his candidate-controlled committee. The Committee and Daysog failed to timely disclose expenditures on a semiannual campaign statement for the reporting period of October 21, 2018 through December 31, 2018, in violation of Government Code Section 84211 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$105.

#### **Statement of Economic Interests Late Filer**

In the Matter of Harry Dana Moore; FPPC No. 16/20053. Staff: Jenna C. Rinehart, Commission Counsel. The respondent was represented by Edwin Riddle of the Law Offices of Edwin M. Riddle. Harry Dana Moore, a Director of Classified Services for the Konocti Unified School District, and a former Board Member of the Schools Insurance Group Northern Alliance I, failed to timely file his 2015 and 2016 Annual Statements of Economic Interest, in violation of Government Code Section 87300 (2 counts). Total Proposed Penalty: \$800.

In the Matter of Michael Lubic; FPPC No. 18/057. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Tara Stock, Intake Manager. Michael Lubic, as a former Consultant for the California Public Employees Retirement System, failed to timely file an Assuming Office, a 2015 and 2016 Annual, and a Leaving Office Statement of Economic Interests, in violation of Government Code Section 87300 (4 counts). Total Proposed Penalty: \$800.

In the Matter of Catalina Aguilar; FPPC No. 18/1503. Staff: Jenna C. Rinehart, Commission Counsel. Catalina Aguilar, a Board Member for Darnall Charter School, failed to timely file a 2017 Annual Statement of Economic Interests, in violation of Government Code Section 87300 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$400.

In the Matter of Igor Weisz; FPPC No. 17/1264. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Chloe Hackert, Political Reform Consultant. Igor Weisz, a Staff Psychiatrist for the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, failed to timely file a 2016 Annual Statement of Economic Interests, in violation of Government Code Section 87300 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$200.

In the Matter of Bryce Bannatyne; FPPC No. 17/990. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Tara Stock, Intake Manager. Bryce Bannatyne, an Alternate Member for the California Avocado Commission, failed to timely file a 2018 Annual Statement of Economic Interests, in violation of Government Code Section 87300 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$200.

In the Matter of John Vinke; FPPC No. 19/1408. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Chloe Hackert, Political Reform Consultant. The respondent was represented by Robert Feldhake of the Feldhake Law Firm, APC. John Vinke, as an Interim Chief Business Officer/Consultant for the Lennox School District, failed to timely file an Assuming Office Statement of Economic Interests, in violation of Section 87300 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$200.

In the Matter of Matthew Girardot; FPPC No. 17/530. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Chloe Hackert, Political Reform Consultant. Matthew Girardot, as a Program Administrator I/II/III for the Health Care Agency of County of Ventura, failed to timely file a 2016 Annual and Leaving Office Combination Statement of Economic Interests, in violation of Government Code Section 87300 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$200.

<u>In the Matter of Julia Hernandez; FPPC No. 19/841.</u> Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Ginny Lambing, Political Reform Consultant. Julia Hernandez, Mayor for the City of San Joaquin, failed to timely file a 2018 Annual Statement of Economic Interests, in violation of Government Code Section 87203 (1 count). **Total Proposed Penalty: \$200.** 

In the Matter of Oscar Rosales; FPPC No. 19/293. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Cheng Saetern, Staff Services Analyst. Oscar Rosales, a member of the Mendota City Council, failed to timely file a 2017 Annual Statement of Economic Interests, in violation of Government Code Section 87203 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$200.

In the Matter of Abel Lua; FPPC No. 19/842. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Ginny Lambing, Political Reform Consultant. Abel Lua, a member of the San Joaquin City Council, failed to timely file a 2018 Annual Statement of Economic Interests, in violation of Government Code Section 87203 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$200.

In the Matter of Enrique Fernandez; FPPC No. 19/1173. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Ginny Lambing, Political Reform Consultant. Enrique Fernandez, a member of the Woodland City Council, failed to timely file a 2018 Annual Statement of Economic Interests, in violation of Government Code Section 87203 (1 count). Total Proposed Penalty: \$200.

#### **Statement of Economic Interests Late Reporter**

In the Matter of Scott Schneider; FPPC No. 18/1004. Staff: Galena West, Chief of Enforcement and Ginny Lambing, Political Reform Consultant. Scott Schneider, a former Administrative Services Director for the City of Fort Bragg, failed to timely disclose a source of income on his 2015 and 2016 Annual Statements of Economic Interest, in violation of Government Code Section 87207 (2 counts). Total Proposed Penalty: \$200.

### II. LEGAL DIVISION

STAFF: DAVID BAINBRIDGE, GENERAL COUNSEL

#### A. Pending Litigation

California State Association of Counties and California School Boards Association v. FPPC Los Angeles County Superior Court, Central District, Case No. BS174653

On September 11, 2018, petitioners served a first amended petition for writ of mandate and complaint for declaratory relief. Petitioners allege that Regulations 18420.1 and 18901.1 are invalid as a matter of law, that the Commission has exceeded its jurisdiction in adopting these Regulations, and that the Regulations are unenforceable.

The Attorney General's Office is representing the Commission and timely filed an answer to the petition/complaint. On March 4, 2019, the Commission filed a Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings.

On March 29, 2019, the Commission's Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings was granted with leave to amend. The court vacated all hearing dates and set a new trial setting conference. Plaintiffs timely filed a Second Amended Complaint (SAC) on June 27, 2019. The Commission has filed a demurrer and the hearing is set for November 22, 2019. The trial setting conference is also set on November 22, 2019.

Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association, et al. v. Edmund Brown, et al. Court of Appeal, Third Appellate District, Case No. C086334

On December 12, 2016, the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association and retired State Senator and Judge Quentin L. Kopp filed a lawsuit against Governor Brown and the Commission to invalidate a new law that would allow public funds to be used for political campaigning. In September of 2016, the Governor signed Senate Bill 1107 which authorizes the use of public funds to finance campaigns if a jurisdiction adopts a law or ordinance creating a public financing program. Plaintiffs allege the new law improperly eliminates the prohibition against public financing of campaigns, implemented pursuant to Proposition 73 in 1988, because it was done without voter approval. In addition, plaintiffs allege that the new law violates the Political Reform Act because it does not "further the purposes of the Act," an express requirement in the Act for legislative amendment.

The Attorney General's Office is representing both Governor Brown and the Commission in this litigation. A hearing was held in Superior Court on August 4, 2017. After taking the matter under submission, the Court issued a Ruling, dated August 23, 2017, "entering a judgment declaring that the amendments made to Government Code section 85300 by Senate Bill No. 1107 are void and have no legal effect; and an injunction restraining Respondents from enforcing the unconstitutional amendments made by Senate Bill No. 1107."

In closed session at its meeting on September 21, 2017, the Commission voted to appeal the Superior Court decision. The Notice of Appeal was filed with the Third District Court of Appeal on January 9, 2018. Appellants' Opening Brief was timely filed on September 21, 2018. Respondents' Brief was timely filed on December 10, 2018. Appellants' Reply Brief was timely filed on March 1, 2019.

The appellate court heard oral argument on July 17, 2019. On August 26, 2019, the court affirmed the trial court's order invalidating SB 1107. Appellants did not file a petition for review in the California Supreme Court. Respondents will be seeking an award of attorney's fees and costs.

#### **B.** Outreach and Training

- Political Reform Consultant, Alexandra Castillo, presented a workshop in Norwalk from October 2-3 to candidates and treasurers, as well as two workshops to campaign filing officers. 29 people attended the candidate and treasurer workshop, 40 people attended the first campaign filing officer workshop, and 25 people attended the second.
- Political Reform Consultant, Aly Larson, presented a campaign filing officer
  workshop and a candidate and treasurer workshop in Fresno on October 17. 15 people
  attended the campaign filing officer workshop and 30 people attended the candidate
  and treasurer workshop.
- Political Reform Consultant, Alana Jeydel, presented a campaign filing officer workshop in Napa on October 25. 20 people attended this workshop.
- Political Reform Consultant, Alex Castillo, presented a candidate and treasurer workshop to the San Mateo and Santa Clara Democratic Clubs in Palo Alto on October 26. 35 people attended this workshop.
- Video Tutorials: Commission video tutorials were accessed a total of 346 times in October. Form 700 videos were accessed 173 times, the Candidate/Treasurer video was accessed 111 times, and the filing officer videos were accessed 62 times.

#### C. Advice

In October 2019, the Legal Division responded to the following requests for advice:

- *Education Program*: The Education Program responded to 513 requests for technical assistance via phone.
- *Requests for Advice:* The Email Advice and Conflict of Interest Code Program and Legal Division attorneys collectively responded to more than 594 e-mail and telephone requests for advice, 34 of which were not responded to within 24 hours.

- *Advice Letters:* The Legal Division received 10 advice letter requests under the Political Reform Act and completed 18 letters.
- Section 1090 Letters: The Legal Division received three advice letter requests concerning Section 1090 and completed five letters. This year to date, we have received 62 advice requests regarding Section 1090.

Please note, a finding of probable cause does not constitute a finding that a violation has occurred. The respondents are presumed to be innocent of any violation of the Act unless a violation is proven in a subsequent proceeding.

The following matters were decided based solely on the papers. The respondents did not request a probable cause hearing.

- 1. *In the Matter of Re-Elect Gary Mendez For Rio Hondo College Board 2015 And Gary Mendez, FPPC No. 16/20131.* On October 7, 2019, probable cause was found to believe Respondents committed the following violations of the Act:
- Count 1: The Committee and Mendez failed to timely file the pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of July 1, 2016 through September 24, 2016, due September 29, 2016, in violation of Government Code sections 84200.5, subdivision (a), and 84200.8, subdivision (a).
- Count 2: The Committee and Mendez failed to timely file the pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of September 25, 2016 through October 22, 2016, due October 27, 2016, in violation of Government Code sections 84200.5, subdivision (a), and 84200.8, subdivision (b).
- <u>Count 3</u>: The Committee and Mendez failed to timely file the semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of October 23, 2016 through December 31, 2016, due January 31, 2017, in violation of Section 84200.
- Count 4: The Committee and Mendez failed to timely file the semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of January 1, 2017 through June 30, 2017, due July 31, 2017, in violation of Section 84200.
- <u>Count 5</u>: The Committee and Mendez failed to timely file the semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of July 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017, due January 31, 2018, in violation of Section 84200.

- <u>Count 6</u>: The Committee and Mendez failed to timely file the semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018, due July 31, 2018, in violation of Section 84200.
- Count 7: The Committee and Mendez failed to timely file the semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of July 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018, due January 31, 2019, in violation of Section 84200.
- 2. In the Matter of California Cannabis Unity Campaign 2016 and Samuel H. Clauder II, FPPC No. 16/514. On October 11, 2019, probable cause was found to believe Respondents committed the following violations of the Act:
- <u>Count 1</u>: The Committee and Clauder failed to timely file the semi-annual campaign statement for the period of January 1, 2015 through June 30, 2015, due July 31, 2015, in violation of Government Code Section 84200.
- Count 2: The Committee and Clauder failed to timely file the semi-annual campaign statement for the period of July 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015, due February 1, 2016, in violation of Government Code Section 84200.
- Count 3: The Committee and Clauder failed to timely file the semi-annual campaign statement for the period of January 1, 2016 through June 30, 2016, due August 1, 2016, in violation of Government Code Section 842000.

#### 2 CCR § 18360

#### § 18360. Enforcement Complaints.

- (a) Sworn complaint. The Enforcement Division considers each complaint it receives but only a sworn complaint entitles the complainant to the procedural rights provided for in subdivisions (b) through (e) of this regulation. In order to file a sworn complaint, the complainant must:
  - (1) File the Complaint with the Enforcement Division on a form made available by the Commission.
  - (2) Identify the person or persons who allegedly violated the Act and, if known, the specific provision or provisions of the Act allegedly violated.
  - (3) Describe with as much particularity as possible the facts constituting each alleged violation.
  - (4) State the facts that support the complainant's belief that a person has violated the Act and include any documents or other evidence supporting this conclusion.
  - (5) Include or describe with as much particularity as possible evidence or means of obtaining evidence in support of the complaint.
  - (6) Include names and addresses of potential witnesses, if known.
  - (7) Sign the complaint under penalty of perjury.
- (b) Notice of sworn complaint. Within three business days of receipt of a sworn complaint, the Enforcement Division will provide each person who the complaint alleges violated the Act a copy of the complaint, and notice that the person may respond to the complaint. The Enforcement Division may withhold notice of a complaint or the identity of the complainant if the Enforcement Division Chief determines that disclosing the information would jeopardize the investigation.
- (c) Notice to complainant of intended action. Within 14 calendar days of receiving a sworn complaint, the Enforcement Division will notify the complainant in writing that it will do one or more of the following in response to the complaint:

- (1) Open a case to further investigate the allegations in the complaint. This notice will include a statement that opening a case indicates the complaint alleges a potential violation of the Act, but the Enforcement Division has not necessarily determined that any violations actually occurred.
- (2) Refer the complaint to another governmental agency.
- (3) Take no action on the complaint because the Commission does not have jurisdiction to investigate based on the information provided.
- (4) Take no action on the complaint because the allegations of the complaint, absent additional information, do not warrant further action for the reason stated.
- (5) Take additional time to investigate the complaint to determine whether to open a case and provide an explanation for the delay. The Enforcement Division will provide the complainant with subsequent written notice of what action it will take in response to the complaint.
- (d) Reconsideration of intended action. If the person who filed the sworn complaint disagrees with the response sent pursuant to paragraphs (c)(1)-(5), he or she may submit in writing, within 20 calendar days of receipt of the response, a request for reconsideration to the Executive Director of the Commission. The Executive Director may deny the request, or based on good cause, direct the Chief of the Enforcement Division to take specified action consistent with the Act and its regulations. The Executive Director will provide the complainant written notice of his or her decision within 20 calendar days of receipt of the request.
- (e) Notice to subjects of a sworn complaint. The Enforcement Division will send a copy of the notice to the complainant of intended action to any person the complaint at issue alleges violated the Act at the same time the notice is sent to a complainant, unless the Enforcement Division Chief determines that providing the person with notice of the complaint would jeopardize the investigation.
- (f) Commission initiated investigation. All investigations that do not result from a sworn complaint are opened on the initiative of the Commission as provided for under Section 83115. The Enforcement Division will determine whether to open Commission initiated investigations.
  - (1) Letters of Inquiry. The Enforcement Division may contact subjects of a Commission initiated investigation to gather additional information to determine whether to open an Enforcement case and further investigate potential violations.
  - (2) Notice of investigation initiated by the Commission: The Enforcement Division will send notice, as well as a copy of any document submitted to the Enforcement Division, to any identified subjects of a Commission initiated investigation after a case is opened. The Enforcement Division may withhold any document, the identity of any person providing information, or the notice and existence of an investigation if the Enforcement Division Chief determines disclosing the information would jeopardize the investigation, or if the information is privileged, private or confidential. No notice will be sent to the provider of the information regarding whether a case has been opened.

- (g) Media and public inquiries. The Commission will respond to requests for information about complaints and investigations as follows:
  - (1) Sworn Complaints. The Commission may confirm receiving a sworn complaint at any time but will not provide a copy of the complaint until five calendar days after a copy of the complaint is sent to all persons the complaint alleges violated the Act as provided in subdivision (b). The Commission is not required to wait five calendar days before providing a copy of the complaint if the Enforcement Division has decided to take no action on the complaint. Commission staff may not disclose any action the Enforcement Division intends to take on a sworn complaint, other than no action, until after notice to complainant of intended action is sent under subdivision (c).
  - (2) Commission initiated investigation. The Commission may confirm that the Enforcement Division sent a letter of inquiry and may provide a copy of the letter and any documents submitted to the Enforcement Division by the complaining member of the public five calendar days after sending the letter of inquiry. The Commission may confirm that it has opened a case on its own initiative and provide a copy of the notice sent to all identified subjects of the Commission initiated investigation five calendar days after sending notice to all identified subjects of the investigation as provided in subdivision (f)(2).
  - (3) Referrals. The Commission will confirm that it has received a referral from filing officers upon receipt and will provide a copy of the referral upon request.
  - (4) Protected Information. The Commission may withhold any document, the identity of any person providing information, or the existence of an investigation or complaint if the Enforcement Division Chief determines that disclosing the information would jeopardize the investigation, or the information is privileged, private or confidential.
- (h) Notice of resolution. The Enforcement Division will send a notice of resolution to each complainant who filed a sworn complaint with the Commission and was notified that the Enforcement Division would investigate the allegations in the complaint.

#### 2 CCR § 18360.1

§ 18360.1. Eligibility Requirements and Considerations - Streamline and Warning Letters.

The Chief of Enforcement may include or exclude any filer from receiving a streamline penalty based upon mitigating or aggravating circumstances. Mitigating circumstances result in consideration of a Warning Letter being issued instead of a streamline penalty. Aggravating circumstances result in the consideration of a Mainline Stipulation instead of a streamline penalty. A Mainline Stipulation generally results in a higher penalty and includes a full description of the violation and surrounding events.

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Types of Violations Eligible.
(1) Late Statements and Reports, including Campaign, Statement of Economic Interests, and Lobbying.
(2) Unreported Economic Interest(s) on a Statement of Economic Interests.
(3) Unreported Lobbying Activity, Contributions or Expenditures.
(4) Cash Contribution(s) or Expenditure(s) of \$100 or More.
(5) Campaign Bank Account.
(6) Committee Naming.
(7) Advertising and Mass Mailing Disclosures.
(8) Recordkeeping.
(9) Gift Limit.
(10) Slate Mailer Organization Filing Issues.

(11) Proper Recusal of a Conflict of Interest.

(12) Major Donor Notifications.						
(b) Penalty Amount. The streamline penalty for each violation is found in Regulation 18360.2.						
(c) General Requirements for Eligibility, Considerations, Factors, and Exclusions.						
(1) General Eligibility Requirements:						
(A) Sign and submit to the Commission a streamline stipulation, decision, and order on a form provided by the Commission and						
(B) Pay a proposed penalty by cashier's check, electronic payment, or money order in an amount as determined in Regulation 18360.2.						
(2) Considerations and Factors.						
(A) Considerations for a Warning Letter include a balancing of the following factors:						
(i) Low level of experience and sophistication of the party.						
(ii) Self-reported violations before public discovery.						
(iii) Violations resulted in minimal public harm.						
(iv) Low amount raised and spent regarding the election.						
(v) Unsuccessful.						
(vi) Filer or candidate leaving office or never having obtained office.						
(vii) Illness, incapacitation, death, or otherwise unable to perform duties.						
(viii) Low activity during the missing or late reporting period.						
(ix) Small percentage of overall activity for the reporting period.						

(x) Committee has terminated.
(xi) Fraudulent activity of other caused the violation.
(xii) Activity was reported by other participant in the transaction.
(xiii) Activity was reported timely on another campaign statement of the filer.
(xiv) For late statements and reports, activity was unrelated to the election that triggered filing requirements.
(xv) The same candidate, committee, or principal officer has not been issued a Warning Letter for the same type of violation within the last five years.
(B) Exclusions from the Streamline Program include:
(i) Any evidence of an intent to conceal or violate the Political Reform Act or regulations relating to the Act.
(ii) Presented the FPPC false or altered evidence.
(iii) Made false statements to the FPPC regarding material facts.
(iv) Evidence of intentional interference with a witness in the FPPC matter.
(v) The same candidate, committee, or principal officer has paid a prior penalty to the Commission for the same type of violation occurring within the last five years.
(vi) For late statements and reports, history of not timely filing statements or reports.
(vii) Violations caused in the aggregate more than minimal public harm.
(viii) Has other violations under review for prosecution that do not qualify for a streamline penalty.
(d) Specific Requirements for Eligibility.
(1) Late Statements and Reports. To enter into a streamline settlement, an individual who failed to timely file a campaign statement or report, lobbying report, or Statement of Economic Interests must file the late statement or report with the

appropriate agency unless the relevant information was reported by the person elsewhere or the FPPC determines that the information has been sufficiently disclosed in the stipulation and/or other filings.

- (A) Statement of Economic Interests Considerations and Factors.
  - (i) Considerations for a Warning Letter include:
    - a. The late filed Statement of Economic Interests is a Leaving Office Statement.
    - b. The late filed Statements of Economic Interests are the Leaving Office Statement and the Annual Statement that was due within three months of the date the public official left office.
  - (ii) Exclusions from the Streamline Program include:
    - a. For Statement of Economic Interests reporting violations, a public official also had a conflict of interest violation under Sections 1090 or 87100 involving the undisclosed economic interest.
- (B) Campaign Statement or Report Considerations and Factors.
  - (i) Considerations for a Warning Letter include:
    - a. The committee had less than \$2,000 of activity for the statement period.
    - b. The committee filed an electronic (or paper) statement or report timely for the same period.
    - c. The committee meets the requirements for administrative termination.
    - d. The late statement or report was filed prior to the relevant election.
    - e. The statement due was a Form 470.
  - (ii) Exclusions from the Streamline Program include:
    - a. For all committees, participation in the Streamline Program is limited based on the population of the jurisdiction of the committee, or for special districts, the population within the boundaries of the district. The population numbers are based on the U.S. Census. Special districts will be asked to supply the population information based on the U.S. Census. Candidates, committees, treasurers, or principal officers will be excluded from participating in the Streamline Program if their district does not provide population numbers.

For at large elections, use the entire population of the jurisdiction. For jurisdictions with districts, take the total population of the jurisdiction and divide by the number of districts. The campaign statement or report at issue was required to report contributions or expenditures totaling not more than:

- 1. \$4,000, for populations at or under 10,000;
- 2. \$5,700, for populations between 10,001-25,000;
- 3. \$8,200, for populations between 25,001-62,500;
- 4. \$11,700, for populations between 62,501-156,250;
- 5. \$16,700, for populations between 156,251-390,625;
- 6. \$23,900, for populations between 390,626-976,562;

  - c. The filer has not performed the duties of the office/position for a significant period of time due to illness or otherwise.
- (ii) Exclusions from the Streamline Program include:
  - a. The undisclosed gift(s) or income received from a source that was regulated by or had business before the filer's agency.
  - b. The undisclosed gift(s) or income caused a conflict of interest violation under Sections 1090 or 87100.
- (3) Unreported Lobbying Activity, Contributions or Expenditures.
- (A) Eligibility Requirements: File an amended campaign statement or report that includes all required information including contributions received, expenditures made, or other activity.
- (B) Considerations and Factors.
  - (i) Considerations for a Warning Letter include:
    - a. The committee, lobbyist, lobbying firm, lobbyist employer, or person had less than \$2,000 of activity not reported.

Disclose the source of the contribution(s) or recipient(s) of the expenditure(s) on the appropriate campaign statement(s) or report(s).

  - (i) Considerations for a Warning Letter include:
    - a. The aggregate amount received or spent is less than \$500.
  - (ii) Exclusions from the Streamline Program include:
    - a. Failure to timely disclose the cash contribution(s) or expenditure(s) on campaign statement(s) or report(s).
    - b. The percentage of cash contributions and expenditures of \$100 or more exceeds 25% of total campaign contributions and expenditures of the committee for the reporting period.
    - c. The total amount of cash contributions and expenditures for the reporting period exceeds \$10,000.
    - d. The person made personal use of campaign funds.
    - e. The campaign records were insufficient to determine if use of cash concealed other violations.
- (5) Campaign Bank Account.
- (A) Eligibility Requirements: Disclose the contribution(s) or expenditure(s) on the appropriate campaign statement(s) or report(s).

- (i) Considerations for a Warning Letter include:
  - a. Disclosure of the contribution(s) or expenditure(s) was reported timely on the correct campaign statement or report of the committee.
  - b. The candidate or his or her wholly owned business is the source of 50% or more of the committee funds for the election.
  - c. Reimbursement, if any, occurred within the time periods prescribed by the Political Reform Act and regulations.
  - d. The activity was isolated to the beginning of the campaign.
- (ii) Exclusions from the Streamline Program include:
  - a. The total amount of all contributions not deposited in a campaign bank account during the statement period exceeds 10% of the total contributions received for that period or the total amount exceeds \$10,000.

    - a. The violation is likely to result in confusion regarding the identity of the candidate or committee responsible for the advertisement, or a top contributor, sponsor, controlling candidate, or ballot measure supported or opposed.
    - b. The advertisement or mass mailing contains more than two missing or incorrect disclosures or display requirements in the disclaimer and one or more of the missing or incorrect disclosures is: (1) paid for by requirement, (2) top contributor information, or (3) the statement that the advertisement was not authorized by a candidate or committee controlled by a candidate.
  - (ii) Examples of minor violations that may qualify for a streamline penalty include the following:
    - a. Failure to include "paid for by" in the same manner and immediately adjacent to a committee name;
    - b. Disclosures in a font type, color, position, or size that does not comply with a requirement but is as legible as the requirement;
    - c. Disclosures that include a committee name that does not match the name as stated in the statement of organization but clearly identifies the source of the advertisement;

- d. Failure to include a street address but other identifying information, such as a website address, is included;
- e. Inadvertent failure to list top contributors in proper order but they are all included;
- f. Required size or time length of disclosure is not correct, but the disclaimer is identifiable, and the remainder of the disclosure is correct;
- g. Failure to use the precise disclaimer language but the remainder of the disclosure is correct.
- (8) Recordkeeping (as required by Section 84104 and Regulation 18401).
- (A) Considerations and Factors.
  - (i) Considerations for a Warning Letter include:
    - a. The missing records do not rise to the level to be considered a material violation.
  - (ii) Exclusions from the Streamline Program include:
    - a. The lack of recordkeeping inhibited audit efforts.
    - b. The lack of recordkeeping made it impracticable to determine if a person substantially complied with the Act's campaign reporting requirements.
    - c. The lack of recordkeeping may have inhibited discovery of other violations.
- (9) Gift Limit (contained within Sections 86203 or 89503).
- (A) Eligibility: If a person receives a gift over the limit, they must return the gift or reimburse the giver for the difference between the gift's fair market value and the applicable gift limit.
- (B) Considerations and Factors.
  - (i) Considerations for a Warning Letter include:
    - a. No evidence that governmental decisions were made or effected regarding the gift giver by the recipient.

- (ii) Exclusions from the Streamline Program include:
  - a. The gift giver is a named party in, or the subject of, a governmental decision before the gift recipient or the gift recipient's agency.
  - b. Failure to report the gift on a Statement of Economic Interests, if required.
  - c. The fair market value of the gift is more than \$200 over the gift limit.
- (10) Slate Mailer Organization Campaign Filings. Slate Mailer Organizations only qualify for possible participation in the Commission's Streamline Program if they have also filed timely campaign statements and reports as a committee under the Political Reform Act disclosing essentially all of the information required to be reported by the late filed slate mailer organization campaign statements and reports.
- (11) Proper Recusal for a Conflict of Interest. An individual may qualify to participate in the Commission's Streamline Program if the individual identified a potential conflict of interest regarding the governmental decision and recused his or herself but failed to either:
- (A) Publicly identify the financial interest that gives rise to the conflict of interest or potential conflict of interest in detail sufficient to be understood by the public as detailed in Regulation 18707, subdivision (a), or
- (B) Properly leave the room until after the discussion, vote, and any other disposition of the matter is concluded.
- (12) Major Donor Notifications. An individual or committee may qualify for participation in the Commission's Streamline Program if they failed to timely send out major donor notifications required by Section 84105.
- (A) Considerations and Factors.
  - (i) Considerations for a Warning Letter include:
    - a. The committee has been in existence less than one year.
    - b. The individual or committee has not previously been required to send out the major donor notification.
    - c. All persons who would have received the notifications timely filed as Major Donors, if required.

## 2 CCR § 18360.2

§ 18360.2. Penalties in Streamline Cases.

Streamline penalty stipulations are approved by the Chief of Enforcement and are reported to the Commission for discussion only before they are executed. The Chief of Enforcement will include those stipulations in the next Commission agenda, as a part of the Executive Staff Report. After the close of the hearing, the Chief of Enforcement may execute all or any of the streamline penalty stipulations, at his or her discretion.

Penalties in streamline cases are not to exceed the prescribed maximum fine amount per violation found in <u>Government Code</u> <u>Section 83116</u>, <u>subdivision (c)</u>.

- (a) Late Statement of Economic Interests.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The streamline penalty for failing to timely file a Statement of Economic Interests is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$200 per late statement if filed in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the filer.
  - (B) \$400 per late statement if filed prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
  - (C) \$600 per late statement if filed prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
  - (D) \$800 per late statement if filed prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.
- (b) Unreported Economic Interest(s).
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The penalty for failing to timely report an economic interest on a Statement of Economic Interests is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$100 per economic interest not disclosed per statement that did not include timely disclosure of an economic interest if filed in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the filer.

- (B) \$200 per economic interest not disclosed per statement that did not include timely disclosure of an economic interest if filed prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
- (C) \$300 per economic interest not disclosed per statement that did not include timely disclosure of an economic interest if filed prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
- (D) \$400 per economic interest not disclosed per statement that did not include timely disclosure of an economic interest if filed prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.
- (c) Late Campaign Statement or Report.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The penalty for failing to timely file a campaign statement or report is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$200 plus 1% of contributions received or expenditures made, whichever is greater, per late statement if filed in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the filer (unless statement or report was due before the relevant election, but filed later than seven days before the election, then the 1% is increased to 3%).
  - (B) \$400 plus 2% of contributions received or expenditures made, whichever is greater, per late statement if filed prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division (unless statement or report was due before the relevant election, but filed later than seven days before the election, then the 2% is increased to 4%).
  - (C) \$600 plus 3% of contributions received or expenditures made, whichever is greater, per late statement if filed prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division (unless statement or report was due before the relevant election, but filed later than seven days before the election, then the 3% is increased to 5%).
  - (D) \$800 plus 4% of contributions received or expenditures made, whichever is greater, per late statement if filed prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission (unless statement or report was due before the relevant election, but filed later than seven days before the election, then the 4% is increased to 6%).
- (d) Unreported Contributions or Expenditures.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The penalty for failing to timely report is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$100 plus 1% of contributions received or expenditures made, whichever is greater, per late statement if filed in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the filer (unless statement or report was due before the relevant election, but filed later than seven days before the election, then the 1% is increased to 3%).
  - (B) \$200 plus 2% of contributions received or expenditures made, whichever is greater, per late statement if filed prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division (unless statement or report was due before the relevant election, but filed later than seven days before the election, then the 2% is increased to 4%).

- (C) \$300 plus 3% of contributions received or expenditures made, whichever is greater, per late statement if filed prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division (unless statement or report was due before the relevant election, but filed later than seven days before the election, then the 3% is increased to 5%).
- (D) \$400 plus 4% of contributions received or expenditures made, whichever is greater, per late statement if filed prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission (unless statement or report was due before the relevant election, but filed later than seven days before the election, then the 4% is increased to 6%).
- (e) Late Lobbying Reports.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The penalty for failing to timely file a report is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$200 plus 1% of all payments received or payments made for lobbying activity, whichever is greater, if the report is filed in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the filer.
  - (B) \$400 plus 2% of all payments received or payments made for lobbying activity, whichever is greater, if the report is filed prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
  - (C) \$600 plus 3% of all payments received or payments made for lobbying activity, which is greater, if the report is filed prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
  - (D) \$800 plus 4% of all payments received or payments made for lobbying activity, whichever is greater, if the report is filed prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.
- (f) Unreported Lobbying Activity.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The penalty for failing to timely report lobbying activity is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$100 plus 1% of all payments received or payments made for lobbying activity, whichever is greater, if the report is filed in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the filer.
  - (B) \$200 plus 2% of all payments received or payments made for lobbying activity, whichever is greater, if the report is filed prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
  - (C) \$300 plus 3% of all payments received or payments made for lobbying activity, whichever is greater, if the report is filed prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.

- (D) \$400 plus 4% of all payments received or payments made for lobbying activity, whichever is greater, if the report is filed prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.
- (g) Cash Contributions or Expenditures of \$100 or More.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The streamline penalty for receiving a contribution or making an expenditure of \$100 or more in cash is calculated as follows:
  - (A) An amount equal to 25% of the amount of the contribution or expenditure in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the person.
  - (B) An amount equal to 50% of the amount of the contribution or expenditure if prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
  - (C) An amount equal to 100% of the amount of the contribution or expenditure if prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
  - (D) An amount equal to two times the amount of the contribution or expenditure if prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.
- (h) Campaign Bank Account.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The streamline penalty for failing to deposit a contribution into a campaign bank account, or failing to make a campaign expenditure from the campaign bank account is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$100 plus 1% of the amount not processed through the campaign bank account per statement period during which a violation occurred if settled in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the person.
  - (B) \$200 plus 2% of the amount not processed through the campaign bank account per statement period during which a violation occurred if settled prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
  - (C) \$300 plus 3% of the amount not processed through the campaign bank account per statement period during which a violation occurred if settled prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
  - (D) \$400 plus 4% of the amount not processed through the campaign bank account per statement period during which a violation occurred if settled prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.
- (i) Committee Naming.

- (1) Penalty Amount. The streamline penalty for failing to name the committee properly is calculated as follows:
- (A) \$400 per reporting period if settled in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the person.
- (B) \$600 per reporting period if settled prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
- (C) \$800 per reporting period if settled prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
- (D) \$1,000 per reporting period if settled prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.
- (j) Advertising and Mass Mailing Disclosures.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The streamline penalty for failing to include all required advertisement or mass mailing requirements is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$100 plus 1% of each advertisement buy if settled in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the person.
  - (B) \$200 plus 2% of each advertisement buy if settled prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
  - (C) \$300 plus 3% of each advertisement buy if settled prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
  - (D) \$400 plus 4% of each advertisement buy if settled prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.
- (k) Recordkeeping.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The streamline penalty for failing to maintain adequate records is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$200 per reporting period if settled in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the person.
  - (B) \$400 per reporting period if settled prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
  - (C) \$600 per reporting period if settled prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
  - (D) \$800 per reporting period if settled prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.

# (1) Gift Limit.

- (1) Penalty Amount. The penalty for a gift limit violation is calculated as follows:
- (A) \$200 per gift received over the limit if settled in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the person.
- (B) \$400 per gift received over the limit if settled prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
- (C) \$600 per gift received over the limit if settled prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
- (D) \$800 per gift received over the limit if settled prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.
- (m) Slate Mailer Organization Filing Issues.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The streamline penalty for failing to properly file slate mailer organization statements is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$400 per reporting period if settled in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the person.
  - (B) \$600 per reporting period if settled prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
  - (C) \$800 per reporting period if settled prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
  - (D) \$1,000 per reporting period if settled prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.
- (n) Proper Recusal for a Conflict of Interest.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The streamline penalty for failing to properly recuse for a conflict of interest is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$400 per incident if settled in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the person.
  - (B) \$600 per incident if settled prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
  - (C) \$800 per incident if settled prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
  - (D) \$1,000 per incident if settled prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.

- (o) Major Donor Notifications.
  - (1) Penalty Amount. The streamline penalty for failing to properly notify a major donor is calculated as follows:
  - (A) \$200 per reporting period if settled in response to the Enforcement Division's first contact with the person.
  - (B) \$400 per reporting period if settled prior to issuance of a probable cause report by the Enforcement Division.
  - (C) \$600 per reporting period if settled prior to issuance of an accusation by the Enforcement Division.
  - (D) \$800 per reporting period if settled prior to adoption of a default decision and order by the Commission.

# 2 CCR § 18361

§ 18361. Delegation by the Executive Director Pertaining to Enforcement Proceedings and Authority to Hear Probable Cause Proceedings.

- (a) If the Executive Director is unavailable, or believes he or she cannot be fair or impartial, the Executive Director may delegate in writing his or her authority under Regulations 18360, 18361.1 through 18361.3, and 18361.5 through 18361.8, to the General Counsel or to an attorney from the Legal Division. The Executive Director may also delegate his or her authority under Regulations 18361.1 and 18361.7, in writing, to an administrative law judge.
- (b) Probable cause proceedings under Regulation 18361.4 shall be heard by the General Counsel or an attorney from the Legal Division. The General Counsel may delegate the authority to hear probable cause proceedings, in writing, to an administrative law judge.

## 2 CCR § 18362

§ 18362. Access to Enforcement Records.

- (a) Production of Enforcement Records. The Commission will make complaints, investigative files, and related records available to the public and members of the media in accordance with the Public Records Act (<u>Government Code Section 6250</u>, et seq.) Enforcement records requests should specifically identify the documents sought.
- (b) Format of Enforcement Records. The Commission will make records available for inspection at its office during office hours. The Commission may provide copies of requested records either in paper or electronic format to the person that requested the records in lieu of inspecting the records at the Commission offices. Any person requesting paper copies of records must reimburse the Commission ten cents (\$0.10) per page to pay the cost of copying, or supply copying equipment and make copies in the offices of the Commission. Original records of the Commission may not be removed from the offices of the Commission.
- (c) Complaint Notice Period. The Commission may not provide or make available complaints or related records until after the disclosure periods provided in Regulation 18360.
