- 4. Ella Fitzgerald serenades An American in Paris (1951), directed by Vincente Minnelli, starring Gene Kelly and Leslie Caron
- 5. The Woman he was Singin' about in the Rain (1952) starring 19-year-old Debbie Reynolds, Gene Kelly and Donald O'Connor
- 6. Secret Love by Doris Day from Calamity Jane (1953), thought to be Day's favorite movie of those in which she appeared
- 7. Roman Holiday (1953) starring Audrey Hepburn and Gregory Peck, serenaded by Michael Buble's You Don't Know Me (2003)
- 8. Diamonds Are a Girl's Best Friend by Marilyn Monroe from Gentlemen Prefer Blondes (1953)
- 9. Ray (movie montage) starring Jamie Foxx as Ray Charles (set in the 1950s and 60s), co-starring Regina King and Kerry Washington
- 10. Dancing in the Dark from The Bandwagon (1953) starring Fred Astaire and Cyd Charisse
- 11. Barn Dance from Seven Brides for Seven Brothers (1954) starring Jane Powell and the brothers, along with Howard Keel
- 12. People Will Say We're In Love from Oklahoma (1955) starring Gordon MacRae and Shirley Jones (making her film début)
- 13. <u>Sluefoot</u> (1955) from **Daddy Long Legs** starring Fred Astaire & Leslie Caron
- 14. The King and I (1956) starring Yul Brynner and Deborah Kerr
- 15. When I Fall in Love by Nat King Cole (1956) from the one full year *The Nat King Cole Show* was on the air (1956-57 on NBC)
- 16. Got a Lot O' Livin' and Teddy Bear from Elvis's second film Loving You (1957) co-starring Lizabeth Scott and Dolores Hart
- 17. I'm in Love from South Pacific (1958) starring Mitzi Gaynor
- 18. Don't Worry Darling (set in late 1950s) starring Florence Pugh, Harry Styles, Chris Pine, and Olivia Wilde, who also directed (2022)
- 19. Pleasantville (set in late 1950s) starring Toby Maguire & Reese Witherspoon in a Gary Ross film; music by Randy Newman (1998)
- 20. Pink Shoe Laces by The Chordettes (1959) dance challenge compilation based on a season 2 episode of "The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel"
