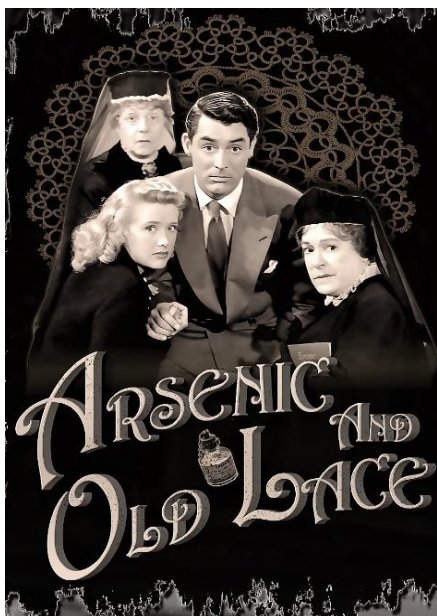


COMEDY GOLD ON THE SILVER SCREEN

- 9. **It's a Mad Mad Mad Mad World** (1963) featuring Buddy Hackett, Mickey Rooney and Jim Backus
- 10. **My Fair Ernest T. Bass** (1964) from **The Andy Griffith Show** featuring Andy, Don Knotts and Howard Morris as Ernest T. Bass
- 11. **The Dentist** (1969) skit from **The Carol Burnett Show** starring Tim Conway and Harvey Korman
- 12. **Television Comedy in the 1970s** from CNN's "**The Seventies**" focusing on **The Mary Tyler Moore Show** (1970-77)
- 13. **Bananas** (1971) "wedding night" starring Woody Allen and Louise Lasser, narrated by Howard Cosell for Wide World of Sports
- 14. **Young Frankenstein** (1974) "Railroad Station" starring Madeline Kahn and Gene Wilder; a story co-written and directed by Mel Brooks
