# Item 2 – Matters arising from last meeting and AGM

- 2.1 Competition Terms and Conditions of Play document was issued to all members. As stated, when issued, this document is liable to change and will be amended as required. Following the first issue a number of changes have been made and, therefore, was reissued 30 Jun. To ensure all members are fully aware that this document exists it will be sent to all new joiners to the Section along with their welcome letter by the Secretary.
- 2.2 Honours Board now updated, thanks to Ben for ordering the required lettering and Dave Callaghan for updating the boards.

#### Item 3 - Captain's Report

# <u>Item 4 -Secretary's Report</u>

4.1 Membership now stands at 135, a substantial increase since the last meeting. 4.2 2026 Fixtures. Some will be aware that there has been an issue with playing Bowood in friendly matches, not so much the timing which is early in the season when the weather and course conditions are not at their best, but with their 'winter enhanced' handicaps which make the matches uncompetitive and frustrating to play. The Committee have therefore unanimously agreed to remove Bowood from our fixture list from 2026. Discussions are in place to find a replacement.

#### Item 5 - Competition Secretary's Report

- 5.1 Thanks to all who contributed proposed changes to the Competition T&C document which will be reissued shortly.
- 5.2 All knockout competitions are running on schedule and the plate is now on HowDidiDo.
- 5.3 Harry Champion. Good to get to the final this year and well done to Paul Jarvis and Raj Patel our only winners on the day. It was agreed by the Committee that due to the high costs of subsidising this event we will only submit 1 team next year as well.
- 5.4 There was some debate over the format of the Peter Gill Trophy and the issue of retaining handicaps between rounds. The Committee agreed unanimously to retain the 2 stableford rounds and that handicap changes will be adjusted between rounds in accordance with EGU rules.
- 5.5 RS proposed that next year we have a minimum of 2 qualifying rounds per month, if possible, this was supported in principle by the Committee and the Secretary will note this when preparing next year's fixture list.

# Item 6 - Treasurer's Report

6.1 After deductions for monies held in the wallet, charity account, anticipated prize funds and purchase of trophies/engraving we have a balance of approx. £2400. As ever, we will consider – sensible - suggestions from the members on spending proposals and continue to pay out slightly more in prizes each week than received via entry fees. For the benefit of new members, your £4 entry fee consists of £2 for competition prizes, £1 2s sweep, £0.50p for Captain's Charity (Cornwall Air Ambulance) and £0.50p for Section admin costs.

## <u>Item 7 – Any Other Business</u>

7.1 Following a request from Graham Clatworthy to consider the 14<sup>th</sup> tee position for those who struggle to get over the water RS stated that for Trophy Competitions, in order to preserve the integrity of the event, he asks the green staff to push back the tee, if a medal it will be moved nearer the front of the box and for routine events move it to the front. The course has to be set up for everyone and not for the minority and if it means taking 3 off the drop zone it is still possible to score.
