13. Greenkeepers Report.

Greens:

The greens recovered very well from greens maintenance back in August and have been performing consistently well most of the year. This week we have carried out our Autumn maintenance, which has been slow going however, essential that we do this to give us the best chance of the greens standing up to and drain well ahead of a harsh winter.

Weather:

Having had extremely low rainfall readings since the end of January this year, the course desperately needed some rain, and didn't we get it?! With almost 8 inches of rain falling since August 27th.

All in all, the course has bounced back quite well following the rain. The wetting agent on tees fairways as well as monthly applications on greens is paying dividends.

Tees:

All tees have had a liquid feed with growth regulator in order to thicken up the sward ahead of the winter. The 2 grass tees that will be used during the winter, (2nd and 10th) have had an extra granular fertiliser applied.

All tees will be verti drained before winter.

This Autumn we will be levelling and slightly enlarging some tees. We have already started the 5th medal tee, and next week will commence the 5th yellow tee. The yellow markers will be placed onto the winter mat for the remainder of the winter.

Much of the turf stripped from the medal tee was re-used in certain areas that were damaged and marked G.U.R.

Next in line will be the 13th medal tee, which will be re-levelled, and moved very slightly to the right, as we can no longer use the left-hand side of the tee due to the growth of the trees on the left.

Fairways:

We made use of the dry weather to get out with the 'shockwave' drainage attachment. All fairways that have an outfall, 'slope to take water away' have now been 'shockwaved,' and we are around hallway through verti draining all fairways.

You may have seen the robot that has been on demo for the past few weeks cutting fairways 1.2 and 3 as well as 4 metres of rough outside these fairways. We will soon be demonstrating a similar robot from a different manufacturer over the next few weeks.

Leaves:

This time of the year the leaves start falling from the trees. We have already made use of our new Weidenmann Mega twister leave blower which can blow leaves from large areas speeding up play and improving presentation.
