About the Friday Morning Tours:

Combined Tour – Tombstone Trolley & Goodenough Mine

Goodenough Mine – This involves an 80-step descent into the earth. 80 down means 80 coming back. This may be too physically challenging for some folks.

Tombstone Trolley – The trolley drives around town as the driver points out important features and tells the history. There is a stop at Boothill where you can get off and tour the actual 1880s graveyard. *There is a separate charge for Boothill.* You can pick up the next trolley to get back into town; it runs about every half hour.

Alternate Trolley Tour – Ride the Trolley and skip the mine. Spend more time at Boothill. Remember, there is a separate charge for the graveyard.

2nd Alternate Tour – This is a guided walking tour to Watervale. Watervale is the original site of Tombstone and is near the Tombstone Monument where Ed Schieffelin camped the night before he made his strike and where he's buried. In addition to the town site, you'll see Indian petroglyphs and the trestle for the railroad that ran to Tombstone. You'll need good shoes, a hat, and water. The hike is about one mile cross-country over mostly level terrain.
