Good for a deck, or as an alternative night-light in the kids' room (**Tse Tse Cubiste and Fanion garlands**, \$190 and \$45 at Mc & Co., 57 N. 6th St., nr. Kent Ave., Williamsburg; 718-388-3551).

Bring them to the park, or eat toast off them in the morning (**melamine plates**, \$1.95 each at CB2, 451 Broadway, nr. Grand St.; 212-219-1454).



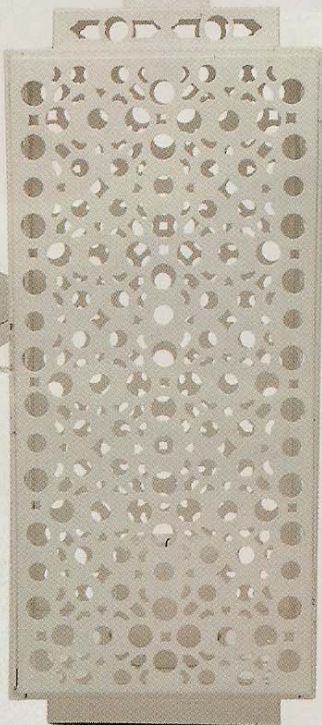
