Kennedy home gets green makeover



The green makeover of Robert F. Kennedy Jr.'s historic home in Westchester, N.Y., is the subject of a new book to be published in April.

Kennedy Green House, a 160-page book by interior designer Robin Wilson, tells the story of how Wilson worked with Kennedy and a green team to do a major renovation of his home after it was ravaged by black mold from a summer flood. They sought to turn his "sick



home" into an eco gem by using non-toxic materials as well as efficient appliances and fixtures.

Kennedy, the third of 11 children born to Ethel Kennedy and Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, is no stranger to environmental causes. He's co-director of the Pace Environmental Litigation Clinic at Pace University School of Law and senior attorney for the non-profit Natural Resources Defense Council.

Kennedy, who wrote the foreward for the upcoming book, has authored two environmental books of his own: *Riverkeepers: Two Activists Fight to Reclaim Our Environment as a Basic Human Right* (with John Cronin) and *Crimes Against Nature: How George W. Bush and His Corporate Pals Are Plundering the Country and Hijacking Our Democracy.*
