




Context

"Olowagli and her seven brothers", is the pilot episode of the audiovisual series "Guardians of the territory; Female power in the origin stories of indigenous peoples", that delves into the rich cultural diversity of Colombia (South America). In its first season, the series brings to life powerful female figures present in ancient stories of five indigenous peoples.

With five 12-minute chapters, each dedicated to a part of the country, the project explores and shares the stories of female mythological beings, guardians since their origins

SentArte will cocreate each episode with indigenous peoples, merging their cultural richness with the transformative power of these female figures. The series addresses the intimate connection between spirituality, resistance and environmental preservation, highlighting the importance of these guardians and their relationship with Mother Earth





Synopsis

Logline:

Olowagli, a cosmic warrior sent from the stars, faces the darkness to rescue her people and restore their identity.

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In a world where darkness threatens to erase the memory and identity of a people, seven brothers and a sister — Olowagli, the mother of the stars — are sent from the cosmos by the creators Nana and Baba. Supported by her cunning, beauty and the forces of Mother Earth, Olowagli fights evil and restores balance.

"Olowagli and her 7 brothers" tells the epic struggle of Olowagli to save her people and become a legend. This is an ancient tale that, while reflecting the current problems of the Gunadule people, inspires the recovery of their cultural and social identity.



Motivation

I am the daughter of the ancestral people called "Olodules", people of gold today known as Gunadule (Kuna-Tule). We have a great cultural wealth to preserve, safeguard and, at the same time, recover. Since I started making films, I have felt how this art has helped me strengthen my identity, root myself and orient myself, thus connecting me with my deepest essence in this earthly world.

Telling the stories of my people in a co-creative way and from our own perspectives has revolutionized the image that people have of us. We have broken the hegemonic images and external perspectives, and we no longer allow ourselves to be underrepresented. Now, we are the ones who tell our own stories.

The story of "Olowagil and her seven brothers" is part of the origin myth of the Gunadule people. In my journey as an aspiring historian of my people through the audiovisual medium, I have been captivated by the way in which grandmothers and grandfathers transmit stories to new generations and preserve our roots through songs. This story constitutes an invaluable contribution to our culture, as it allows us to continue weaving memory and redefining women's roles. By showing how at the beginning of time it was a woman who defeated evil among seven brothers, achieving perfect balance on earth, this story reminds all women that we are brave, heroines and valuable.

Distribution plan

Distribution of the series "Guardians of the Territory"

The series will begin its screening (pre-release) in the community where each story was co-created. Subsequently, the series will participate in national and international film festivals and exhibitions. Each chapter also works independently, as a short film, expanding the possibilities of distribution in different spaces.

After 2 years of festival circuit, we will distribute through VOD streaming platforms and local, national and international TV channels.

We will expand the stories through educational booklets, which we will distribute by participating in different cultural, artistic and academic settings, where we will encourage spaces for dialogue, exhibition and exchange of knowledge.

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


Distribution plan

This chapter will begin its exhibition in the communities of Caimán Bajo and Caimán Alto in Necoclí – Antioquia (Colombia, South America). Then, it will participate in national and international film festivals and exhibitions.

Note that in 2025 the Indigenous Film and Video Exhibition in Colombia - Daupará will be held in the territory of the Gunadule people (Colombia and Panama), and there SentARTE will present all the works it has made with the Gunadule people, including Olowagli.

As part of the "Guardians of the territory" series, this chapter, like the others, will be distributed on VOD streaming platforms and through local, national and international TV channels.

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




