This toolkit is designed to support NGOs and community leaders in delivering accessible, meaningful art workshops that explore the theme of Human Rights Today. These workshops will result in artworks to be submitted to an international online exhibition during Refugee Week 2025.

Workshop Objectives

- Encourage participants to explore and express their understanding of human rights.
- Create a safe, inclusive, and inspiring space for artistic expression.
- Produce individual or group artworks suitable for submission to the online exhibition.

1. Tanning Guide

- Target Group: Refugees, asylum seekers, displaced individuals, youth, and marginalised groups.
- Facilitator Requirements: Artistic background or interest in creative facilitation; basic understanding of human rights.
- Workshop Duration: 1.5 to 2 hours
- Group Size: 5-20 participants
- Format: Can be in-person, online, or hybrid

2. 🧝 Sample Workshop Session Plan

Time Activity

0–15 min Welcome, introductions, and icebreaker 15–30 min Group discussion: What do human rights mean to you?

30–90 min Art-making session

90–105 min Sharing circle:

Present and reflect on the artworks 105–120 min Documentation, quotes, and clean up

UNIVERSAL	Human rights belong to all people.
INALIENABLE	Human rights cannot be taken away.
INALIENADEL	Trainan rights cannot be taken away.
INTERCONNECTED	Human rights are dependent on one another.
INDIVISIBLE	Human rights cannot be treated in isolation.
INDIVISIEE	ruman rights cannot be treated in isolation.
NON-DISCRIMINATORY	Human rights should be respected without prejudice.





3. 🗣 Discussion Prompts on Human Rights

- What does freedom mean to you?
- Have you ever seen or experienced injustice?
- What does dignity look like in your community?
- If you could protect one right for everyone, what would it be?
- How would the world change if everyone respected human rights?

Use these to spark reflection before the creative session.

4. 🔭 Creative Activity Ideas

A. My Right, My Voice

Participants choose one human right they care about and represent it visually.

B. Imagining Justice

Group collage where each member adds an element of fairness or hope.

C. The World I Dream Of

Drawing or painting a future where human rights are respected.

D. In Our Hands (for children or families)

Use cut-outs of hands with drawings or words inside them showing what they want to protect.

5. 🖊 Materials List

Choose based on availability:

- A4/A3 Fabriano or recycled paper
- Pencils, pens, markers, crayons
- · Acrylic or watercolour paints
- Brushes, sponges
- Glue, scissors, collage materials
- Magazines/newspapers for cutting
- Canvas or cardboard (for group work)
- Smartphone/camera for documentation

Artworks can be on different media, from paper to cotton bags or objects... sky is the limit!











6. M Submission Guidelines

- Submit one photo per artwork or one photo of a group work.
- Include:
 - Name of the artist/group
 - A short quote (max 50 words) explaining the artwork

7. Á Consent & Attribution Form Template

Each participant should complete a simple form stating:

- Their name (or "Anonymous" if preferred)
- Consent to display their artwork and quote online
- Permission to be credited by name (optional)
- Signature of participant or guardian (for under 18s)
