Brief Check-ins

Mark shared that First Congregational has been exploring its history and connection to the missions and displacement of Indigenous people as well as ideas for reparations. On November 10th, Mark will be preaching on this topic. Mark's ordination ceremony is on November 17th 3:00pm in the main sanctuary at First Congregational Church. Earthkeepers are invited.

Updates and Continuing Issues

1. Eugene City Council and Commission Sustainability Commission: The commission tabled at six neighborhood association events this summer and has a powerpoint they are hoping to share with neighborhoods and other groups about the city's efforts. The Commission work plan for 2024-25 will go to the Council for review and includes building decarbonization, urban canopy and other landscape issues, continuing public education and outreach efforts.

Sue attended a meeting put on by Beyond Toxics and Bethel Neighborhood Association about an issue of concern that will affect the Trainsong neighborhood. A Texas company is planning to build a distribution center on the railroad where various types of fuel products will be unloaded during the night and transported through the community. Lucy Vinis was at the meeting, and the City is worried that they have no control over this. They are concerned about fuel spilling. The neighborhood is still dealing with the effects from J.H. Baxter.

- **2. Fossil Free Coalition:** No new updates.
- 3. Oregon Coalition for Environmental Rights: No new updates.
- **4. Divest Oregon:** Upcoming legislation for 2025 includes a five year moratorium on private funds investments in fossil fuels as well as no new fossil fuel investments. Updated demands include investing in a just, climate-safe future, ending investments in fossil fuels, and addressing climate risk transparently. There will be opportunities for citizens to meet with representatives. More information to come. There is more detailed information on their website.

5. Stop Gerrymandering Lane County: This is a local PAC that aims to stop Measure 20-362. More information can be found on their <u>website</u>. Redistricting wasn't supposed to occur until 2031. This is another example of minorities of people trying to manipulate the government. Sue printed information to hand out at UU. Earthkeepers are encouraged to spread the word.

1. Webmaster for EK Website: Ron will not be able to continue managing the Earthkeepers website. It was suggested that we send an email to the entire Earthkeepers list to try to recruit someone to take over the website. Ron is willing to train someone and will continue to pay the yearly fees. We will revisit this next month.

Education

Becoming Earth by Ferris Jabar - Chapters 2-3

Mark: The interdependence and interconnections between species is mind boggling. An elephant's footprint can create a pond that becomes an ecosystem. Bison affect seasonal plant growth more than the weather. Beavers have been reshaping the planet's surface. They can make dams that are a half mile long.

Jerry: The presence and absence of wild birds has changed the climate. He also mentioned a show on PBS: <u>The Soul of the Ocean.</u>

Sue: She and Mark mentioned a book about beavers called "Eager." Sue recently read an article about beavers being reintroduced to London, England. UU made a video about living with beavers. She also talked about her yard and mentioned that you can go to any Dutch Brothers to get coffee grounds.

Ron: He brought up another book called Sapiens, which also discusses the inanimate objects that dramatically affect life.
