What to look for:

4. Top 5 Card Storage Tips (Preserve Value)

1. Use Penny Sleeves + Toploaders

Every valuable card should first go into a penny sleeve, then into a toploader for rigid protection.

2. Store Upright, Not Flat

Especially important for foil or chrome cards that can warp over time.

3. Avoid Humidity + Heat

Cards need a cool, dry environment. Use silica packs in long-term storage boxes.

4. Invest in a Lockable Storage Box

Protect your high-value items from kids, pets, and dust.

5. Label + Catalog

Knowing what you have is just as important as having it. Use spreadsheets or apps to track your inventory.

5. Raw vs Graded - Should You Grade It?

Grading can multiply the value of a card — but only if done wisely.

Raw means ungraded. You can still sell cards raw if they're in good shape or part of a set.

Graded cards are authenticated and scored (usually by PSA, BGS, or SGC) on condition.

When to grade:

- Rookie cards of major players
- Rare inserts, parallels, or short prints
- Cards in near-perfect condition (centered, sharp corners, clean surface)

Pro Tip: Use a magnifier and centering tool before submitting. You don't want to pay \$25+ for a card that grades a 6.

6. Selling Like a Pro (Platforms & Pricing)

You don't need a brick-and-mortar shop to make consistent sales. Here's how to get started:

Best Platforms:

- eBay Still the king. Use auctions or Buy It Now. Great for rare cards and international buyers.
- Whatnot Live streaming card sales are huge right now. Engage with collectors in real-time.
- Facebook Marketplace & Groups Local buyers and niche groups are ideal for bulk deals.
- Instagram Build a brand presence, then direct followers to your eBay or website.

Pricing Tips:

- Research sold listings, not just active ones.
- Factor in fees (eBay, PayPal, shipping).
- Undercut competitors slightly for quicker sales or bundle for added value.

College Stars with NIL Deals

They already have fanbases and exposure.

• Bench Players on Big Teams
