Dwight Rose, the son of the legendary Herbie Rose who's considered the founder of the Bradenton Village of the Arts", was born in Jamacia and moved to Florida by his pre-teen years. personal experiences as the son of a famous artist as well as living in the Middle East and Europe led him to select subjects for his art that are often resistant to change or embrace it wholeheartedly. He uses wet-in-wet watercolor washes on "Arches paper" and a continuous layering of pigment creating translucent glazes of paint often applied in part intuitively. "To me, art is a synthesis of individual feelings, along with the materials and techniques. My paintings are an exploration of these collective tools. which are the basis of my artistic expression."





My practice consists of mixed-media paintings, contemporary art quilts, collages, and soft sculpture dolls. I have been an educator both in the United States and The Gambia West Africa. Traveling has given me a broad view of the world and has had a unique influence on my creativity. Finally, when I work, I am interested in finding the solution keeping in mind that this is one of many solutions. I hate to think of right or wrong. This definition must come from the artist. It gives me such joy to create my work. My mixed-media paintings are both figurative and abstract. There is always a narrative. For me, the narrative is like solving a mystery or finding the missing piece of a puzzle.
