I was inspired by that article, so I started drawing pencil images of all kinds of people. I asked God to help me draw exact likenesses. Later, I discovered charcoal, which is an artistic adventure. I enjoy the enthusiasm in painting, but I love the intensity of charcoal.

I like creating images of people. People are fascinating in the way they look, smile, and move, seeing life in their faces. Art inspires me to see beauty in everything: flowers, trees, dogs, and especially people. Just like Barbara Streisand sings... "People who need people are the luckiest people in the world." As a Christian, I don't believe in luck; I believe in blessings. So, I'm a blessed "Penny"!
