Don't Forget...

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you of some small details that we often forget to mention:

- Please refrain from allowing your child/ ren to run in the parking lot or up and down the stairs on the South end of our building or through the tunnel as church employees are busy at work during our arrival and dismissal times.
- Please ensure that you are signing your child/ren in each day of their attendance with your name and the time of drop off, the process should be repeated at dismissal.
- In an attempt to keep away germs that can make us all ill, we ask that children wash their hands upon entering the classroom each morning.
- Our playground is only to be used for Preschool student purposes (supervised by a member of the Preschool staff) between 8:30 am and 3:00 pm
- We have a referral program and available space in our toddler program. Refer a friend or neighbor and get a credit towards your tuition!!!!

Preschool Illness Policy

It's the beginning of a new school year and we always find it helpful to review the school's illness policy for all of our families. We regularly take precautions to limit our exposure to illnesses (washing hands throughout the day, spraying and cleaning toys and classroom equipment, etc.), and ask for your assistance in our efforts.

Should you observe that your child/ren exhibit any signs of illness, we ask that you keep him/her home to prevent the further spread of such illnesses. Should we observe symptoms while the child is at school, the parent will be notified and requested to pick up the child from school. Symptoms may include, but are not limited to:

- Head lice
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Temperature of 100 degrees or more
- Red eye with discharge
- Green runny noses
- Difficulty breathing
- Lethargy
- General inability to participate in normal classroom activities
- Presence of sores on the body, feet, hands, etc.

All students must be symptom free for a full 24 hours prior to returning to school unless a doctor's statement is presented that explains the child's symptoms are not contagious to others in the environment.

The school must be notified of any illnesses so that other families within the same environment (classroom/school) can be notified. In the event of an identified outbreak, the Preschool is required to notify the Collier County Health Department.



Common Illnesses in Preschool

Many of us are new to the Preschool environment where sharing is common, both of toys and germs. In an effort to prepare you for some possible experiences, I ask that you review this list and follow our illness policy when necessary.



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- <u>Common colds</u>-runny noses, lethargy, coughing, sneezing that typically does not require medical attention (green mucous identifies an infection and can be treated with medication)
- <u>Pink eye</u>-red, irritate eyes (that children will often scratch) that produce a yellow discharge; requires medical treatment
- Hand Foot and Mouth-red, open sores on the soles of the feet, palms of the hands and in the mouth; may produce discomfort during drinking/eating; while there is no medical treatment, a doctor must be consulted; students are not allowed to attend the Preschool until a doctor has provided clearance
- <u>Strep throat</u>-sore throat, fever (may sometimes test positive even without fever); requires medical attention
- Head lice-small parasites that lay eggs on the hair follicle, causes itching of scalp and neck; requires treatment that can be obtained over the counter; office staff will perform a quick check to ensure there are no eggs/parasites present prior to student being able to attend
- <u>Pinworms</u>-small parasites that can cause discomfort around the anal or vaginal area; must be treated by medical professionals
- <u>Flu</u>-body aches, fever (can be high or low-grade), lack of appetite, may or may not include stomach discomfort and/or diarrhea; individuals can confirm diagnosis with medical attention
- <u>Stomach 'bugs'</u>-stomach discomfort (diarrhea, vomiting, etc.) with or without fever; may or may not require medical attention

These are the issues that we most often face during our school year, but with your help following the illness policy and our handwashing procedures, we can limit our exposure and maintain a healthier environment.
