
We have just completed the run event at the Lane County Fair. I want to thank all of you who were there to support the club by setting up, running trains and taking the layout down.





Some roughly 4600 miles from Eugene there is a train that is "magical". It is the *Jacobite* operating on the Mallaig Extension of the West Highland Line running from Fort William, Scotland to Mallaig, Scotland. Opened in 1901, this line runs through some of the most scenic areas of Scotland. In 1984, Scotrail re-introduced steam power rail service over this extension in an effort to encourage tourism and boost the economy on the heavily subsidized line. And on this line is the steam powered passenger/tourist train nicknamed the *Jacobite*. It has been running during the summers almost continually every year since 1984. It had previous names between the years 1984 to 1994, the *West Highlander* and the *Lochaber*. In 1995 the name the *Jacobite* took hold after the historic Jacobite Rebellion in Scotland, which has many local connections along the route.



I, with my father, had the chance to ride this train. An interesting note is the station and flag stop signs along this route are bilingual, in Celtic and English. The scenery along these tracks is breathtaking. The route of 84 miles round trip the train takes includes passing Ben Nevis,




Scotland's highest mountain, and crossing the Glenfinnan Viaduct. It is the route used in all the *Harry Potter* movies. The company running the *Jacobite* provided Warner Brothers with the train and allowed them use of the *Jacobite's* route for filming. The train the *Jacobite* is the *Hogwarts Express* pulled by Great Western Railway 4900 Class 5972 Olton Hall in the movies. Hence the train is "magical".

With help from hobby shops in Perth and Birmingham we were able to assemble our own *Jacobite* for our souvenir of our trip. We bought a Mainline 4-6-0 locomotive, a Hornby Buffet/Coach Car and a Compartment/Coach Car, a Lima Restaurant Car, and a Compartment Car and finally a Mainline Guard (end) Car. The train is HO/OO and operates fine on code 100 track. On code 83 track the flanges from the wheels tick every railroad tie. This model train brings back fond memories when operating on my layout.
