We have the signed contract for the Benton County Fair and are working with Vicki, from the Lane Events Center, on the contract. Just one thing to verify before we sign the contract.



#### Yreka Western's First Box Car Fleet

### **Modeling Memories**

The Yreka Western Railroad wanted to alleviate shortages in box cars for their shippers and abroad in the mid 1970's. So, in 1976 they acquired 47 ex-Western Pacific 50' double door (one plug door and one sliding door) box cars. They were the first interchange equipment ever bought by the YW since its incorporation in 1889. Prior to this purchase the Railroad had only owned one freight car, an ore car used mainly for ballast track maintenance on the line. These "new" box cars would travel around the country hauling products and creating revenue in service to other railroads for the short line. They were allotted YW 35701-35750 for a number series, the same number series used by the WP

for these cars. These cars had an appealing paint scheme with the rail-road's parent company's (the Kyle Corporation) "Blue Goose" logo of white on blue. According to one of the employees I talked to years ago the box cars were painted in house by YW employees at a rate of one every one and a half to two weeks in the engine house. Since it was the year of our country's bicentennial and other railroads were painting equipment to honor our nation the YW decided to paint one box car with a "76" logo surrounded by 13 stars in a circle in the place of the blue goose logo. The roof walks were removed and brake wheels lowered. This fleets success for the Railroad led to the YW leasing 100 FMC 50' double door box cars two years later to create more revenue abroad for their usage by other railroads.

Having been born and raised in my early years in Yreka I have fond memories of these cars. My strongest memory of these cars was in the summer of 1977 when I saw a string of ten of these on the siding at Butcher Hill between Yreka and

Montague. I always wanted one or more of these cars for my layout. But, to the best of my knowledge no HO manufacturer has ever made

them. After researching what was out there in undecorated form I settled on Details West's BC-600 Undecorated 50' Combination Door Box Car Kit. The only problem was these cars have been out of production for some time. I searched ebay and model train swap meets in Roseville, Sacramento, Medford and Eugene for two years and finally in 2012 I found not one, but two of these kits at the WCMRRC Show and Swap Meet at a table near the food counter in the main building. I bought them, these Yeals Wester #25726 C Seattle Conducted Accessed.

home and there they sat for over a decade. Finally, this previous winter I pulled them out and went to work on them.

them

I first assembled all the ladders and door runners using Testors #281220 Plastic Cement. I then dug out my paint chip. I have a paint chip off the inside door frame from one of these box cars that was damaged in

service and parked on a siding near the engine house and used for storage for years. Larry Bacon, general manager of the Railroad at the time, said it would be okay. I experimented mixing Floquil Great Northern Big Sky Blue, Dark Blue and Conrail Blue until I achieved a match I was satisfied with. I then air brushed the two cars this color. Following this up with a 50' box car roof stencil I made years ago I spray painted the roofs Scalecoat #20476 Aluminum. After drying, I sprayed the sides with Testors #1261 Glosscote to prepare them for decaling. I went about decaling them with Miller Advertising #B-870 Yreka Western box car decal sheets. These are also out of production, but I found some nice ones on ebay. Two cars numbers are already on the sheets and I went with them. But, there are decals on the sheets to make all the car numbers. I used Walthers Solvaset #470 and added inspection dots and ACI boards from Microscale decal sheets #87-193 and #MC-4280. Later photos of the prototype cars show these. Dullcoting the cars came next with Testors #1260 Dullcote Spray. Finally I assembled the floors, replacing the plas-

tic wheel sets with NorthWest Shortline 36" nickel silver wheel sets, added brake wheels, Kadee #5 couples and then installed the floors and previously painted doors to the shells. The final results I am quite happy with.


