Tacoma Rail History:

Tacoma Municipal Street Railway was started in 1917 as a trolley line to move factory workers to and from the tide flats. Freight operations began in October 1917.

Eventually, with support from mill owner Earnest Dodge, this became the Tacoma Municipal Belt Line (TMBL). Freight service grew and passenger service became a financial drain resulting in replacing trolleys with busses, and the eventual turning over to Tacoma Transit. In 1925 a Tacoma City Charter amendment transferred control from General City management to Tacoma Public Utilities

By 1942, the Belt Line had 13 miles of track serving 27 industries. Input from the Union Pacific, Northern Pacific, Great Northern, and Milwaukee Road led to the extension of sidings and the

building of a classification yard in the Tide Flats.

Today Tacoma Rail services all four of the Port's intermodal terminals, the break bulk facilities, and over 40 industrial customers with 16 locomotives over 43 miles of track.

MT. RAINIER SCENIC RAILROAD

The Mt. Rainier Scenic Railroad is back. Running from Elbe, WA to Mineral, WA and back, the railroad is currently using Polson Logging #70, a 2-8-2 "Mikado" built by Baldwin in 1922.



Back in 1993, I got to ride with family on this excursion. It was two



parts back then, not roundtrip like currently. And it used a different logging locomotive. #91 "West Coast Edition" 3 truck Heisler had previously operated for Kinzua Pine Mils of Kinzua, Oregon.

The round trip scenic excur-

sion is \$34 for adults, \$15 for youth (ages 6 to 18). The line also operates dinner trains for the whole family, Halloween, and Polar Express runs. For the 21+ crowd there is wine, whiskey, and beer, tasting excursions.

HIGH SPEED RAIL

The Seattle Times has reported Microsoft and government officials are working to clear the way for 300-mile high-speed rail line in the Cascadia Innovation Corridor. The corridor runs from Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada to Portland, Oregon. Microsoft employs more than 50,000 people in Washington State, and has invested in sustainable transportation previously, with 23 bus routes in Washington that move 4,300 people per day.

Imagine Portland to Seattle (174 miles) in about an hour, or Seattle to Vancouver, B.C. (143 miles) in less than that.

UNION PACIFIC BIG BOY

"Union Pacific's legendary <u>Big Boy No. 4014</u>, the world's largest operating steam locomotive built to conquer mountains, will make 19 whistle-stops in five states this summer during its 2024 Westward Bound Tour from Wyoming to California. In addition, this mighty steam locomotive will be on public display for two days each in Roseville, California, July 12-13, and Ogden, Utah, July 20-21.

Big Boy will leave its home base in Cheyenne, Wyoming, on June 30, traveling across Wyoming, Utah, Nevada, California and Idaho during July. Display days in Roseville and Ogden offer an up-close look at the 1.1-million-pound marvel along with the "Experience the Union Pacific" rail car, a captivating walk-through exhibition that provides a unique glimpse into the rich history of railroading."


