White Pass & Yukon Route No. 97, No. 100 • Alco Road Diesels


The best known portion of the WP&YR runs from sea level, in Skagway, AK, to 2865' at White Pass Summit. The route continues 20.2 miles to Lake Bennett, and originally ran 110 miles to Whitehorse. While the entire trip rates as one of the most breathtaking in the world, a few of the highlights include: Mile 2 — Shops, site of repair facilities. Mile 8.6—Clifton, station served as HQ for a section gang.

Mile 10.4 – Black Cross Rock, 1898
blasting accident buried two workers.

Mile 14 – Glacier Station, once a stopping place for thirsty steam engines.

Mile 16 – Tunnel Mt., train crosses Glacier Gorgethen enters tunnel 1,000 ft. above the chasm floor.

Mile 18.6 – Steel Bridge, built in 1901. Prior to construction, trains followed a harrowing switchback Mile 20.4 - White Pass Summit. TRAIN CARDS SPECIAL

HO Scale T-Trak Module Spacing

The outside track centerline is 83mm (3.25") from the front edge. The track spacing is 60mm.

The length of a single module is 490 mm. The length of a double module is 980 mm. These dimensions allow for the KATO Uni-joiners to overhang the module. KATO track is mandatory at the module interface, but not entirely necessary within the module. You can have turnouts, sidings, etc., but the turnouts must be PECO!

Module availability

We have 6 single modules available at \$19 each, and 1 double module for \$32.

All 4 corners have been sold.

I will start taking orders for the next round after the last of these are sold.

Parts availability

I talked with Peter Florack at ET&H last week and he will be ordering more packs of KATO 2-150 to have them in stock in the future.


