Since T-Trak is a table top module, all modules are the same height, 70 mm to 100 mm or $2^3/_4$ inches to 4 inches regardless of scale. Therefore if you use $^3/_8$ inch Baltic birch plywood, your sides should be $2^3/_8$ tall. To provide greater structural integrity for HO scale, $^1/_2$ inch plywood is recommended for double modules or larger, sides would then be cut $2^1/_4$ inches tall.

To adjust the height of the modules, four 1/4 x20 x2 inch socket set screws are used, with holes in the top of the module to allow adjustment from above with a hex wrench. These are mounted in a wood block that is in each corner of the module. The wood block also is a structural element of the



module sides. Module seams are glued and nail-gunned. The support blocks are also glued on the top and two sides and nail-gunned through the sides. The cost of the legs and support blocks are roughly \$1 each. (\$4 per module.)

For HO, a single module is 490 mm long (19 $^{9}/_{32}$ inches). Depth can be a minimum of 490 mm to a maximum of 711 mm (28 inches), however a depth of 600 mm is suggested to allow for access to the cables behind the module. Corner modules are 711 mm x 711 mm (28 inches by 28 inches). Based on $^{3}/_{8}$ inch (9 mm) Baltic birch plywood, a single module costs \$19 while a corner would cost \$19.30 and a double (982 mm x 711)would cost \$25.10.

Corner modules have an outer track radius of 610 mm (or 24 inches), and an inner track radius of 550 mm (21 $^{2}/_{3}$ inches).

Most of the modules we use in our shows are the property of 3 individuals; Roger Fegles, Gary Schwieger, and Mike Larson. The yard and our corners are the property of the club. With two of our team members out for medical reasons that leaves us with just one set of modules.

We need members to help by building a module. You don't need to build a set (unless you really want to), just one. And you can ask for help. There are many of us that can help you with construction, or wiring, or ballasting, or

even landscaping. What kind of help do you need?

Hey, you want to hear something really neat? You don't need to have it completed to enter it in a show. As long as the mainlines and back track are installed and correctly wired, your module can be used! That's right it doesn't have to be fully landscaped. There is a provision in our show rules that allows for an incomplete module to be included in a show at the module committee's / show chairman's discretion.

The complete guidelines are posted on our website at *wcmrrc.com/clubresources* Scroll down, the module specs are the third item down.

This is a great opportunity for father/son or father/daughter teams to contribute to the club and learn and teach the next generation of modelers.

What can you make? What industry can you model? Can you add a spur or create a siding that can be switched? Can you model an autumn or winter scene? Maybe a valley farm scene? Let's see what we can come up with. It would be nice to have some news modules for inclusion in our next round of shows; Valley River, Logging Conference, Lane or Benton county fairs.


