
1869. 1859 was purchased in May by the City

The logo says it all, Trams, Trolleys, Trains, Two Track, Table

Top. T-Trak got its start in Japan near the turn of the century. It is highly popular in N Scale, but there are standards for most every scale from T to G. As a result, all measurements are in the metric system. (BTW, KATO UniTrack is measured in mm's as well.)


The system is designed to be displayed on banquet tables. Modules have a built –in levelling screw in each corner to make adjustments based on table height. Trackage is KATO's UNITRACK. And it is the secure connection of the UniJoiner that insures that the modules are locked together. Track dimensions are always 2 mm longer than the module width. This is so the UniJoiners over hang the edge insuring that modules securely interlock together.




In N Scale, a single straight module is 308 mm wide and the track length is 310 mm. In HO Scale, a single straight module is 490 mm wide and the track length is 492 mm.



The assured connection between modules includes buss wiring on the underside connected to the rails and pigtails with Anderson Power Pole connectors. This along with the Uni-Joiners between modules makes a sure fire electrical connection.









New MAX Type 6 trains, made by Siemens. 96 feet, 11 inches long; 8 feet, 8 inches wide; 186 passenger capacity. New LED lights indicate available doors for boarding and getting off trains. The lights will display in green when a door is available, red when not available and flash yellow when the doors are operating to provide better visual aids for riders. Updated digital signs inside the trains show the next MAX station and dynamically change when approaching stations. Better temperature control for heating to keep trains warm in cold weather. 26 to replace the aging first generation trains, plus an additional 4 for a total of 30.


