### C 28 (12) 1496

#### ST. JACQUES APOSTLE

##### 1496 C28 (12) One Piece

Question between the city of Hagenau and Soufflenheim; letter sent: the palatine Elector Philippe to Jacques de Felckenstein, under bailiff, asking him to negotiate with the town of Hagenau concerning the grazing and the firewood ; quarrel on the subject between the city and the residents of Soufflenheim, asking namely that he “would release prisoners and give back the mortgaged horses”.

[No people from Soufflenheim in this document.]

### C 50 (5-8) 1539-1606

## **LETTER BY CONRAD DE RECHBERG, UNDER BAILIFF, TO THE PALATINE ELECTOR, LOUIS**

**03 May 1539 C50 (5) Two Pages. Completely Translated.**

To my right honourable, respected Lord, Palatine Elector, this is a request sent by your very faithful servant : concerning the office of provost of Soufflenheim, you wrote some time ago that I should send a report concerning advantage and disadvantage to this ; I can just say that at this time Hans Jacob Knobloch is holding the office of provost of Soufflenheim, and has accepted it ; however in my opinion my function of under bailiff would authorize me to name a provost ; as the former provost Mathis Reinwalt has contested this nomination and pretends to come back to this function ; so this is my request that I am allowed to keep the man I named Hans Jacob Knobloch as a provost, as I am authorized as under bailiff to name him.

As I do not find advantage or disadvantage to this function of provost of Soufflenheim, my request to you is that I can decide about the function of the named Knobloch as provost in Soufflenheim, that his wages would be left at 2 Gulden for his function, and not advise him about this question, this is my humble request to you, written this 3rd May 1539 and signed. Passed in Haguenau 3rd March 1539 : signed Conrad von Rechberg, Under bailiff.

[Letter sent by Conrad de Rechberg, under bailiff to the palatine Elector, Louis, concerning the office of provost in Soufflenheim. Question of whether the provost is named by the Prefecture or by the community of Soufflenheim. Followed: Rights of several communities depending of the Prefecture of Haguenau in Soufflenheim, Kuttolsheim, Surbourg, Wingersheim, right to name the provost; rights and privileges of the Prefecture in this regard.]

## **LETTER BY THE PREFECTURE OF HAGUENAU TO DUKE MAXIMILIAN**

**14 February 1606 C50 (6) Two Pages. Completely Translated.**

Gabriel Müller provost in Soufflenheim requests humbly that his horse that he has lost in the last time, would be replaced, and in consideration of his poor situation, that a sum allowing him to buy another one would be granted as needed for his function. This request has been transmitted by the officers of the bailliffrick of Haguenau to Maximilian of Austria. They add to this that ; in consideration of his good services, and that he was not cause that he lost the horse, but bad people had decided to do harm, on the other side he is a rather poor man, and rather aging, with many children, so it would be fit to think of a better payment of his services, so that the officers suggest that only the horse should be replaced, but a larger sum granted to prove your appreciation and concern ; the officers are confident that your Highness will feel compassion with this good servant, and sign. Haguenau 14 February 1606. The bailiff, and counselors of Under Alsace: Rudolff Graf zu Zultz, Gerg Streinle.

[Letter sent by the court of Ensisheim to the Prefecture : asks permission to restitute a sum of 15 florins to Gabriel Müller, provost in Soufflenheim, to compensate his loss on an injured horse.]

## **DECISION ON GABRIEL MÜLLER**

**06 May 1606 C50 (7) One Page. Completely Translated.**

Letter asking a sum of 15 Gulden for the lost horse of Gabriel Müller, provost in Soufflenheim, addressed to the bailiff and counselors of Haguenau.

As our House has received the letter concerning Gabriel Müller, provost of Soufflenheim, Maximilian of Austria decides that as he Müller is a good obedient person, he has found interest in his letter and decided on the 28th of April to send the necessary amount of 15 Gulden which will authorize him Müller to buy a new horse as the first one has been killed by bad persons ; so the Emperor has followed the decision of the officers and this will be announced in our accounts. Ensisheim 06 May 1606. Heckler. Sent zu bailiff Rütke in Haguenau.

## **LETTER BY THE PALATINE ELECTOR FRÉDÉRIC, COUNT, TO HENRI DE FLECKENSTEIN**

**December 1551 C50 (8) Two Pages. Completely Translated.**

Fredrich Graf Churfurst, sends his greetings to our dear faithful friend ; I did receive both your two letters concerning the present provost of Soufflenheim and your desire to change him for the one you have chosen for this office, among other requests, concerning the content of these letters after consideration my decision is the following : concerning the levee of troops and guards, that you should receive this amount in a few days, and this we have already ordered and also discussed that you will receive them and that their payment as you have proposed should range between five or six gulden, and concerning this exact amount you will have to contact our accouter (Zinsmeister) so that he also will receive cost and meals that will be needed ; you are also authorized to name a provost in Dangolsheim for a year ; third : you asked me concerning the present provost of Soufflenheim, Bernhart Vester, and that you want him dismissed of his functions. So I authorize you hereby to negotiate with Heinrich Schlupfer concerning his functions, and let known the decision to the Chancellor.

We have also decided that Bernhard Vester provost in Soufflenheim in his office there, as your intention is to have him dismissed ; we can authorize this but the legal way must be respected, and our discussion for the moment not opened to him nor anybody, so that it will only be on the right moment, when you have contacted Heinrich Schlupfer and discussed with him that this can be officialized in front of our Court (Canzlei) and that this will take the form of a decree decided by our authority and the dismissing will precede very soon the installation of the new provost, as from both your letters sent to me and to which I give the best attention and benevolent feeling. Written in Heidelberg, Thursday after Christmas day.

[Letter sent by the palatine Elector Frédéric, count, to Henri de Fleckenstein, concerning the levee of troops ; he also orders him to negotiate with Henri Schlupfer concerning the office of provost in Soufflenheim, and to advise the provost in charge that he is dismissed.]

## **LETTER TO THE PALATINE ELECTOR LUDWIG HERZOG IN BAYERN**

**December 1551 C50 (8) Completely Translated**

Do not give any payment of wages to Hans Jacob Knobloch as provost, and decide yourself if you choose this Hans Jacob Knobloch or someone else as it is your privilege of bailiff to decide ; however I must say that a few days ago Mathis Reinwalt has come here, and has explained that he would not continue to be the provost of Soufflenheim as he feels that there is no advantage to this and has asked me to keep the named Knobloch as a provost in Soufflenheim as he would not that the place in question is not filled by

some man, so I wished to mention this honestly ; you will also see that the new named provost will be a man you can trust and who is able to keep a promise, and be silent when necessary. You may also take contact with Heinrich Schlupfer who could eventually be named if you like. And inform in any case the chancellery of your decision. So that it will be confirmed ; Heidelberg, Thursday after Christmas 1551.

## **C 54 (4) 1608-1610 Thirty-six Pieces**

[No names of people from Soufflenheim in these documents.]

Bundle concerning the suit intended by family Niedheimer de Wassenbourg against the community of Soufflenheim, concerning a district in the forest and ponds on the ban of Soufflenheim, this district has been plundered by the community of Soufflenheim who contests these rights to the family Niedheimer ; the court of Hanau Lichtenberg in Bouxwiller is asked to raise 500 florins on the community of Soufflenheim for the wood taken out and sold by Soufflenheim's community. The family of Niedheimer refuses the proposal of the community of Soufflenheim to offer a caution.

The Niedheimer family endowed with fief in Soufflenheim ; several documents concerning the forest ; the damage to several trees and complaint about "those in Soufflenheim" (no names) signed by Johann Jacob Niedheimer de Wasenbourg.

### **25 November 1608 C54**

The community of Soufflenheim, the farmers there opposed to Dietrich von Schönbourg.

### **14 December 1608 C54**

Letter to Niedheimer concerning his arrest of people in Weitersheim and Soufflenheim : order to free them.

## **C 86 (34, 36) 1608-1615**

### **LETTER CONCERNING DAMAGE CAUSED TO THE "HUNDTSHAUS" IN SOUFFLENHEIM**

#### **14 December 1615 C86 (34) One Page. Completely Translated.**

Right honorable respected noble lord ; the undersigned servant in his faithful task brings to your knowledge that after a bad night of thunderstorm the kennel house in Soufflenheim which is on a dominating position and so has been damaged in its upper part especially the roof and one full side with wood and frame, also one part of the window crushed and every kind more of destruction of this type all around, and increased by the important rain fall so that it needs very immediate repairs and that the minimum of protection has been already brought and has cost one pound twenty to avoid more damage. So that we also have immediately ordered the necessary frames, wood, tiles and other material to bring

very early solution and are waiting now for your authorization and more instructions on this matter. Passed in Haguenau the 14 December 1615. Signed Dinckel, renter, Jost Scholl; cashier.

[Letter of receiver Dinkel of the Prefecture sent to the court of Ensisheim concerning damage caused to the "Hundtshaus" or kennel in Soufflenheim by a storm.]

## **LETTER TO THE REGENCY IN INNBRÜCK CONCERNING DAMAGE TO THE KENNEL HOUSE IN SOUFFLENHEIM**

**18 January 1608 C86 (36) Five Pages. Extract**

As the present expense named on page 213a of 160 pounds which makes 320 gulden on purpose of buying the kennel house in Soufflenheim is confirmed, which sum has so been paid immediately by the cashier's to the parties in liquidity, and that sum has been sent by a messenger on horse, riding there to bring this in proper hands, but as part of this has been already spent and prior to our decision of acquisition, for repairs, and we have advised the bailiff to mention the exact expense on this, to be transmitted to the Account's house, by bailiff and counselors, and that we must have this precision on previous expense, to make the proper sale record in good order, to the right knowledge of the landlord authority, so that all the expenses are taken into good consideration and included in the sale document, with order that at earliest occasion the prepaid repairs would be reimbursed. Passed 18 January 1608. Sent to the Austrian Chamber (Kammer). Signed Heckler.

[The above is an extract of a letter sent by the House (Chamber) in Ensisheim (Imperial Regency) to the House or Regency in Innbrück concerning the receipt in Soufflenheim and the storm's damage to the kennel house. No names of people from Soufflenheim listed in this document.]

## **PERMISSION TO RECONSTRUCT KENNEL IN SOUFFLENHEIM**

**24 December 1615 C86 (36)**

Permission granted to reconstruct the damaged kennel in Soufflenheim. One page.

## **C 88 (76-77, 80-81, 84, 85, 88) 1604-1608**

### **LETTER CONCERNING POACHING IN THE FOREST OF SOUFFLENHEIM**

**23 May 1604 C88 (76) One Page. Completely Translated.**

Johann Reinhard Count of Hanau, Zweibrücken, Lord in Lichtenberg, Bitche and Ochsenstein, Upper Bailiff in Strasbourg sends his greetings to our dear respected, honourable and learned friend : we have been advised by letters that there has been a poaching by someone from Gries in our forest of Soufflenheim. As we do not wish to have our provost in Brumath handle this case, and decide on fine or other consequence, we have decided that the court of Haguenau will have to decide, as there have been



several other cases of poaching in the forests of Oberhoffen and Drusenheim, so we believe that the decision will be taken there against the man in question. Passed in Wöerth, 23rd May 1604.

## **LETTER CONCERNING POACHING IN THE FOREST OF SOUFFLENHEIM**

**04 May 1604 C88 (77) One Piece**

Letter written by Christoph Fix de Leunitz, bailiff of Linange Dagsbourg, to the Prefecture, concerning poaching by subjects of Dagsbourg in the forests of Soufflenheim. Written in German.

## **REPORT CONCERNING POACHING IN THE FOREST OF SOUFFLENHEIM**

**24 May 1604 (Monday) C88 (80) Five pages. First page completely translated. Pages 2-5 an extract.**

Wilhelm Schelling as forester after his oath tells about facts occurred Friday 14th May, and reported to the town scribe, that on this day he had been in the forest of Soufflenheim on horseback, with companions, as they had heard that a man from Gries had been seen in the forest, so that he was accompanied by Hans Stáb and Simon in the forest ; on Saturday they went to a place named Remelshaus in the forest, where the named Meybeck told them he would be surprised that they would be there unguilty and so spoke the man from Gries ; and Hans Meybeck started to fight with them ; so that he Wilhelm has also started fighting and the other foresters ran after them. Hans Vetsch carried two deer's that had without doubt been shot in the forest of Soufflenheim. [End of First Page].

So we here mention what we know about this event of poaching in the forest of Soufflenheim and our behavior on this occasion.

[Report of the Receiver of the Prefecture concerning problem of poaching in the forest of Soufflenheim.]

[Regarding this letter and who wrote it, Marie Peres says "This is not clear. I think the scribe wrote the letter in place of Willhelm Schelling. I made a complete transcription of the first page, and read the rest of the document without a complete transcription and translation. I have added the signature at the end when present. There is an extreme difficulty in reading and analyzing these letters, some of them very discouraging, and I am not a chartist by training.]

[This document was checked a second time to determine if Wilhelm Schelling, Hans Stab, Simon, Hans Meybeck, and Hans Vetsch were residents of Soufflenheim. After additional research, it was the opinion of the researcher that they all lived in Soufflenheim.]

## **REPORT BY HANS STÄB AND SIMON, FORESTERS**

**03 January 1604 C88 (81) One Page. Completely Translated.**

Hans Stüb and Simon, foresters, by oath have been asked how it happened on occasion when they accompanied Hans Meybeck, and that Claus the town guard was shot in the forest of Soufflenheim. Follows declaration by Hans Stüb: He says he saw Claus there. Simon Bieber: He says he saw Claus.

[Regarding this letter and who wrote it, Marie Peres says "The entire page was translated. This is a report by a scribe, in name of Hans Stüb and Simon, foresters, the authors of letter but who addressed themselves to a scribe to write down in their name. No signature."]

[This document was checked a second time to determine if Hans Stab, Simon Bieber, Hans Maybeck, and Claus (town guard) were residents of Soufflenheim. After additional research, it was the opinion of the researcher that all of them lived in Soufflenheim and that Claus was the town guard of Soufflenheim.]

### **LETTER BY JOHANNES MEYBECK, FORESTER**

**07 September 1605 C88 (84) Three pages. First page completely translated. Pages 2-3 an extract.**

Letter to the count : written by Bernhard Katelshoffer, former forest-guard in Soufflenheim, concerning my payment as such in this function ; as the receiver Johann Georg Mahler has refused to pay me ten gulden on the proposed wages but declared that my function was that of a wood forester and paid at this rate by the receiver ; and this has been told this way to my wife by Dr. Misterspach, receiver of rents. I swear that I have been taken by oath as a forest guard and game guard, and not as a wood surveyor, so that I ask the proper payment and clothing of your Highness, and be maintained in the position in which I have been installed and not retrograded to the position the receiver pretends I am now standing.

[J. Meybeck, forester in Soufflenheim. letter to the Prefecture of Haguenau : Complains against the receiver of the Prefecture for nonpayment of wages. Written in German.]

[Regarding this letter, Marie Peres says "I just translated page one, and read the others. There was no major information nor names of residents of Soufflenheim in any of the other two pages." The index in the archives describes the letter as : "Letter by Johannes Meybeck, forester". When I read the record, I see that it has been signed by Johannes Meybeck indeed, but starts with joined testimony in form of letter with words : Bernhard Katelshoffer "former forester" so prior to Johannes Meybeck to confirm what the position of forester in Soufflenheim really is, and that Johannes Meybeck is now denied, reason of his protest. As I did not translate the full 3 pages, I suppose it is made clearer in pages 2 and 3.]

[This document was checked a second time to determine if J. Meybeck, was a forester in the forest of Soufflenheim or the village of Soufflenheim. After additional research, it was the opinion of the researcher that Johannes Meybeck was definitely a forester of the forest of Soufflenheim.]

### **LETTER BY PROVOST OF SOUFFLENHEIM CONCERNING HANS MEYBECK, FORESTER**

**19 June 1606 C88 (85) Four pages. First page completely translated. Pages 2-4 an extract.**

To the Council and House of Austria. Sent by the provost of Soufflenheim. Concerning several persons of Haguenau who have mentioned that Hans Meyenbeck, our named game surveyor complains about his not having received the proper payment, and that he asks to be treated as on time of his engagement by the authority, and receive so the same payment, and so the provost of Soufflenheim has received a word that the named Hans Meyenbeck should receive this as normally.

[Copy of a letter addressed by the provost of Soufflenheim to the Prefecture concerning Jean Meybeck, forester. German.]

[Regarding this letter and who wrote it, Marie Peres says "The letter is sent by the provost, not named, of Soufflenheim, who does not sign, giving only his title of provost. I translated the entire first page but not the three others."]

[This document was checked a second time to determine if Jean Meybeck is a resident of Soufflenheim. As it is the responsibility of the Provost (mayor) of Soufflenheim to pay Meybeck, and as the Provost is writing a letter on behalf of Meybeck, it would appear that Meybeck lived in Soufflenheim. After additional research, it was the opinion of the researcher that Johannes Meybeck was definitely a resident of Soufflenheim.]

## **LETTER CONCERNING THE KENNEL HOUSE IN SOUFFLENHEIM**

**17 July 1608 C88 (88) One Page. Extract**

Extract of a letter by the Regence of Innsbruck to the Regence of Ensisheim concerning the kennel house in Soufflenheim. Permission granted that the house can be acquired by Soufflenheim to the use of foresters and their dogs. No names of people from Soufflenheim listed in this document.

## **C 186 (17-26) 1757-1789 COMMUNITY OF SOUFFLENHEIM**

**1757 C186 (17)**

Repairing of bridges of the ban of Soufflenheim. Two pages.

**1781 C186 (18)**

Authorization given to cede a place in the communal to build. Three pages.

**1781 C186 (19)**

Providing land in the commune on which to build.

**1781 C186 (20)**

Sebastien Stall asks for a place in the communal to build. Three pages.

**1783 C186 (21)**

Place on the common ban granted to Michel Roth with condition of payment of a land rent. One page.

**1783 C186 (22) Two Pieces**

Jean Endres asks for a place in the common ban to build, different from the one that has been assigned to him, under condition of a rent.

**1783 C186 (23) Sixteen Pieces**

Jean Endres requests land on which to build.

**1783 C186 (24)**

Authorization to Joseph Fuchs and Michel Roth to build on a place in the common ban under condition of a rent. Three pages.

**1783 C186 (25) Two Pieces**

Anton Biff and Charles Dahn ask for a place to build on the common ban in Soufflenheim.

**1789 C186 (26)**

Places assigned to seven persons to build there under condition of a rent

**C 274 (111-117) 1471-1759: (111-112 DIME / HÜFFEL FIEF) (113-117 HÜFFEL FIEF)**

All of the documents in C 274 have been check for the names of people from Soufflenheim. All of the documents mentioned in C 274 and concerning the dime in Soufflenheim, and the fief granted to the Hüffel, have the same names : the Hüffel, and the administration of the Emperor. There are no names of any people in Soufflenheim, nor any description of property with names of those on both sides. No documents name the provost, mayor, or any other official in Soufflenheim.

**06 August 1471 Friday Before St. Laurent C274 One Piece**

Frédéric III, German Emperor, confers to Herrmann Gass and Paul Hüffel the dime (church rent) as fief, in Sessenheim, Soufflenheim, Dahlunden ... [other places]. Signed by the mandator of the Emperor : Luca Seitzer and Tergo.

[There is just a mention of the receipt of the dime, it is not precisely stated that a dime record is included with the names of those who paid the dime. This is an instance in which the "dîme" is the fief.]

**1674 C274**

The Hüffel fief in Soufflenheim and other places ; signed by Philipp Jacques Hüffel, father, and Léopold Wilhelm, count, and Wilhelm Schröder, mandator.

**07 July 1716 C274**

Philipp Jacques Huffel and Frédéric Jean his brother ; extract of the same fief.

**17 September 1744 C274**

Adolphe Jules Buschard baron Hüffel, extract and avow concerning the same fief, part of it is the dime in Soufflenheim. Repeated in Colmar 22 September 1744 signed : de Walcourt.

**22 July 1756 C274**

Memory on the Hüffel fief ; signed Jean Frédéric Lobtein, notary.

**25 July 1540 C274 (112) One Piece**

The Hüffel fief - the dime (church rent), in Sessenheim, Soufflenheim, Dahlundun .... [This may just give the total amount of the dime raised. It is not necessarily a list of those who paid it.]

**1759 C274 (113)**

The Hüffel fief. Fief of Baron Hüffel with productions of titles, letters, genealogical chart ; copy dated 1759.

According to Marie Peres "This may have been intentional in order to be as general as possible, and assure the perennity of the record ; as any precision might have been attacked when a person named would have died, and so the right to a fief eventually refused because situation has changed in some item."

In front of Wölfel Drutmann, magistrate in Haguenau, has come Heinze, forest guard of Soufflenheim, who declared that he sold for himself and his children, also his wife the daughter of deceased Freidrich in Soufflenheim, to Nicolas vicar of Soufflenheim, after discussion has taken place, one house, barn, yard, with all rights and dependencies, in the village of Soufflenheim, one side Heinze Roppenheim, provost, the other side the street named Pfaffengasse. So that he can now own the house as a property and I will pay to him a loan to continue to live in it.

We both promise that this will be in good form of law, never attacked in its form or conditions, that the terms will be respected. We also promise to behave as honorable persons in this house and this letter will be in form of a record to prove our decision. As further proof the seal of the bailiff has been added. Thursday after St. Michael's day 1368.

### **SALE OF GARDEN**

#### **1373 Thursday after St. Lucas G5772 (12) One Page**

In front of me Diemer, provost in Haguenau, have come two persons who wish that a record be precisely made, by which Rule Karcher has decided to sell for himself and for his heirs, after discussion, with all rights attached to this, a garden in Soufflenheim which is in the village between Hensel and the common property, this for 7 schillings pound of Strasbourg money, to Cremer of Haguenau.

The named persons declare that this contract is valid and will not be attacked in any jurisdiction, with prevention of any damage, and respect of the local law.

### **SALE OF HOUSE**

#### **1379 Thursday Before Candlemas G5572 (13) Two Pages**

In front of me, Johannes Dantz, magistrate in Haguenau, has come Vogelmann Pfefferer of Soufflenheim, and declares that he sells a house to Cunzel Cremer, burgher of Haguenau, for him and his heirs in money of schilling and pfenning of Strasbourg currency, on St. Johannes Day. This house contains a farming house, barn, garden, and all dependencies and rights attached to it, and is placed near the heirs of deceased Wernher.

This has been passed, as I recognize with this, in all good form of right and excluding any device. The money has been received with condition of payment of yearly 5 schilling of Strasbourg currency to be paid to the Holy congregation in Soufflenheim, with mortgage in case of no payment of this same right.

Cunzel has declared to be satisfied with all the above mention of rights and obligations, cost and eventually loss, and so will his heirs, as the right is in this land, and for better security the seal has been attached to this letter. On Thursday before Candlemas in year 1379.

Seal is attached to this. Thursday before St. John 1382.

## **SALE OF FARM**

### **1382 Thursday After St. Margaretha's Day G5772 (15) One Page**

Is brought to attention that Johannes Pfaff from Soufflenheim, Claus Zürn the tailor, his brother in law, and Cunegonde his wife have, with named Hans Pfaff's sister, in their possession a garden and farm in the village of Soufflenheim, one side the river, the old Eberbach, other side the Bitergraben, behind is the barn of Claus Scheuer, the Church Landlords, and this garden. It has been decided that the place that lays between the house and, in front, the named Zürn, has one side between the fence and the house and barn, which must be managed by Johannes Pfaff or who has it, alone, the fence should remain.

Also has been agreed and decided that Johannes Pfaff sold to Herr Claus, bedell, and his heirs, with all rights he has on the named a garden and farm and place with all dependencies and rights as mentioned and placed one side near the old Eberbach, the other side the named Zürn.

Claus Zürn or his wife or their heirs or who will own it in the future, acting for himself, will respect what has here been agreed by the named Claus and heirs, when this comes in any way to the Holy congregation or on justice, so they would have to pay to the provost of Haguenau one pound in Strasbourg money, and to the provost of Soufflenheim 5 schilling and to the justice court of Soufflenheim one pound, and accept this with right knowledge of all parts in presence of the justice members of the local justice court of Soufflenheim named:

Gotzo Trutmann, Luzo Bridensohn, Heinzo Bennwart, Luzo Stumpff, Eberhart Friderich, Ruhlmann Hänsel, and other right honorable persons: Volkwin Zimmermann, Claus Stumpff, Johannes Linder. Passed on Thursday after St. Margaret's Day 1382

## **SALE OF GARDEN**

### **1366 Calendes of December G5772 (16) One Page**

Bertsch of Rimsheim, in the Officiality Court of Justice of Strasbourg, burgher of the city of Haguenau, came here for himself and for his heirs, has declared that he acquired from the Prior of the Monastery of Steige, who accounted publicly of this, a garden in the village of Soufflenheim,

This has been granted to him and to his heirs, by the named convent, for the future. A rent is due on this and will be paid by the named Bertsch, who received it from his legatory, and in consequence his name is here apposed as testimony that he now can enter into possession of this property, and that no one will contest this in any way, on the contrary the perfect legality of this donation.

The rent of two deniers due on this yearly will be paid with no exception by the above named promising again for himself and his heirs and never to ask judicial decision from any court on the terms of present text. 1366 Calendes of December.

## **LAND LEGAL JUDGMENT**

### **December 1396 G5772 One Page Latin Text**

It has been legally decided in front of the Justice court of Strasbourg acting also for Boersch of Rumsheim village, in town of Haguenau, that for him and his heirs has been confessed in presence of brothers Heinrich named Kolin, prior of the monastery of Upper Steigen (Obersteigen) in the Order of Saint Augustin, diocese of Strasbourg, that a garden contiguous to a farm (or villa) in Soufflenheim has been granted to the prior and convent of this monastery for himself and for his heirs ; it has been considered that the sale took place ; but it appeared then that the vicar of Soufflenheim received a yearly loan of 2 denaries in Strasbourg money for this property, paid legally to the vicar of the church of Soufflenheim, and that so the named prior of Boersch will send this same amount to him as usual ; under these terms this will we accepted, with no fear of any damage, and solves the situation that has been imposed to him by this continued payment of rent ; the buyer so renounces to any further complaint or judicial quest and accepts this, same the prior on his side and his heirs with no exceptions of any kind or defense. As witness of validity is apposed the seal of the Justice Court of Strasbourg in answer to petition from Boersch and the named above. Record passed in December 1396.

## **SALE OF HOUSE**

### **23 February 1559 G5772 (17) Four Pages**

By me Melcher von Sesselsheim, provost in Haguenau, is brought to public knowledge that Diebold von Bruckheim in Soufflenheim and Catharina his wife have sold for themselves and their heirs to Bader Hansen in Soufflenheim, for himself and his heirs, for 1 pound pfenning value of Strasbourg, a yearly right paid on St. Mathew's day to the seller and heirs in Haguenau, a house in which they can now enter without any hindrance.

It consists of a house, with yard, stable, garden and dependencies, with all rights and obligations attached in Soufflenheim near Premfter Wendling, the other side the common property, behind Jacob Beck, in front the common property, gives 20 pfennings to the church of Soufflenheim and the half schilling pfenning to the honorable Mathis Gebet there, former Marschalk of Haguenau, as rent on plot.

The sale took place for a sum of 20 pounds pfenning in Strasbourg currency, that has been received in hands, and this has been accounted totally by the sellers in front of me, expressing so and for all their heirs, with acceptation of the named yearly payment.

The house is not submitted to any mortgage. For better security were present to this Claus Schartenberger and Augustin Niclaus' son, all of Schirrhein, who also declare that this is accepted by all of them. In case the yearly payment would not take place, they could ask this property back. The justice court of Haguenau would be relevant for this case.

In case the receivers would have placed someone else in their name or their heirs, they should first give information of this and in a way that no damage should be caused. No one could speak against this or

write against this, and as all have accepted this legally in form of acceptance, this sale has been considered as passed in the perfect form for 6 pounds 13 schilling pfenning currency of Strasbourg, the money and rent will be received by the seller. Passed by the named provost, with apposed seal on Thursday 23rd February in year 1559.

## **HOUSE TAX**

### **06 March 1659 G5772 (18) Two Pages**

Extract: Herr Petter, administrator of the College of Saverne complains in name of the College that Ruprecht Vögelein did not pay a sum of 2 pfennig, 6 d tax on a house in Soufflenheim ; the named Ruprecht Vögelin explains that he paid the amount to the heirs of a Marschalk who presented themselves as legal owners of this rent.

Extract from Hr. Bailiff's decision: The named Ruprecht Vögelin is asked to pay the named proposed amount until it happens that the heirs of the named Marschalk would come back here, confirm that the 2 schilling 6 d had been paid to them, and that they had asked this from him legally. Passed in Haguenau the 6th March 1659.

18th century. Church administration in Soufflenheim and accounts of the church administration from 1751 to 1783.

### Understanding the Index

The records in the index are grouped together in series - from A to H. These series are the same in all archives in France prior to 1792. Each series begins with bundle number one and continues upward.

The first entry in the index is: C 28(12) (1496): C is the series number, 28 is a bundle of records, (12) is the document inside the bundle that mentions or is concerned with Soufflenheim, (1496) is the year the document was written. The second entry in the index is: C 50(5-8) (1539-1606): C is the series number, 50 is a bundle of records, (5-8) are four documents within the bundle that mention or are concerned with Soufflenheim, (1539-1606) is the range of years inside the bundle

It is often difficult to know exactly what is contained in each document in the index without checking the document itself. These series often have documents related to fiefs and renewals of fiefs, which vary in length from 1-10 pages. Some of the documents are categorized as:

- Dime: A tax due to the church.
- Ecoutete: Mayor of the village.
- Fabrique: Administration of the church's property by an elected group of citizens of the place - the "council of fabrique". The name is the same in France today ("conseil de fabrique").

- Forêt: Forests or woods. Concerns boundaries and uses, such as conflicts concerning grazing inside the woods, rights to cut wood, hunting, fines, etc.

Records from the *Table générale* list all documents relating to Soufflenheim. All records were viewed. Some mention Soufflenheim but do not give names. Others provide short lists. There are no complete lists of citizens. Some documents are fiefs or renewals of fiefs, which often list people who cultivated land on the boundaries of the fief, similar to land records in the inventories. Fiefs are not always related to the ownership of land. They can also be a right to income from a function, such as provost of Soufflenheim (Schultheiss), or an amount of money due on a tax, such as the “dîme” church tax. All fief documents were viewed and no land records listing adjacent land owners were found.

### Index to the Ancient Archives

All records relating to Soufflenheim in the index to the Ancient Archives are listed below, including year, description, and length. Documents described as a "piece" can be more than one page. Documents described as two or more pages could also be two or more pieces. One page may be a letter and the second page a reply to the letter. Document length is typically what is listed in the official archives, occasionally what was counted when searching for names.
