The Town Accounts are the general ledgers of Soufflenheim, listing all sources of income and expense for each year beginning in 1664. Thirty-one people from Soufflenheim are mentioned in 1667. Money is listed in gulden, shilling, and denier. Twelve deniers equal one shilling. Ten shillings equal one gulden.

The accounts were typically reviewed towards the end of the following year. The 1667 account was attested and ratified in Soufflenheim on 20 December 1668.
