## **JOSEPH KIRCHDOERFER & CATHERINE MEINZ**

17 August 1883 Cape Giardeau, Missouri, Marriage

Joseph Kirchdoerfer, born 15 November 1853 in Soufflenheim, son of Clement Kirchdoerfer (born 18 November 1813 in Soufflenheim) and Madelaine Felder (born 1819 in Baden), and Catherine Meinz, born in Cape Giardeau Missouri. Joseph Kirchdoerfer emigrated to New York, New York on 19 May 1880 abord the St. Laurent, departing Le Havre and Brest to New York, New York (he did not travel with siblings but other surnames on manifest are familiar). Joseph and Catherine Meintz continued to live in Cape Giardeau, where he passed away in 1930. Source: Kelly Cooper.

## State of Louisiana, Parish of Orleans, Recorder of Births and Deaths Office.

BE it remembered that on this day to wit; the 28<sup>th</sup> of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven and the sixty-second of the Independence of the United States of America, before me Vincent Ramos duly commissioned and sworn Recorder of Births and Deaths in and for the City and Parish of Orleans, personally appeared. Lorant Vollmer a native of Bavaria in Germany near Landow, aged 23 years, a shoemaker residing in this city at the corner of St. Peter and Bourbon Streets. Who by these present doth declare that Mr. Bruno Ernewein a native of SOUFFLENHEIM Department of the Lower Rhin in the Kingdom of France, aged twenty-seven years old and six months, a musician by profession, residing in this City, died therein on the eighth of this present month of September at about 3:00 am at the Charity Hospital, situated in the second municipality. The said late Ernewein was not married, his parents residing in Alsace.

THUS done at New Orleans, in the presence of the aforsaid Lorant Vollmer as also in that of Messrs. Charles Blache and Amades Morel both of this City witnesses by me requested to be, who have hereunto

set their hands together with me after due reading hereof, the day, month and year first abo e written. Singed: Lorant Vollmer, Chs. Blache, Amades Morel, Vincent Ramos Recorder.

I DO CERTIFY the foregoing to be a true and faithful copy from the original Recorded in book marked, D. of W - P. F.O 303.

IN testimony whereof I have set my hand and affixed the seal of my office at the city of New Orleans this twenty-eighth day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven and the sixty-second of the Independence of the United States of America. Signed: Vincent Ramos, Recorder of Births and Deaths.

Certificate of Death filed October 20, 1837. Signature (?)

Let the Registry of Wills takes possession of the property and effects belonging to this deceased, collect the debts due to the same and make sale of said effects and property for cash without the forms of inventory, appraisement or advertising in order to pay for the debts due by the deceased according to their rank and privilege. Signed 20<sup>th</sup> October 1837. Name and signature (?)

## Henry, Francis, John and Joseph Voegele

The following Voegele brothers went to the California Gold Rush. There were three of them.

- Henry Voegele (1827-?)
- Francis Xavier Voegele (1830-1904)
- John Voegele (1834-?)

All born in Soufflenheim and immigrated to Lancaster, New York in the 1840's. The Voegele brothers were still in Erie County in 1855 according to the census. Records of them in California:

- 1860 U.S. census in Gibsonville, Sierra County, California: John and Francis
- 1863-1864 Civil War Registrations in Gibsonville: Henry and John
- 1880 U.S. census in La Porte, Plumas County, California: Henry

Francis returned from California to Lancaster and married there in 1864. Family lore says that John disappeared in California and was never heard from again, and that his brother Joseph (1823-1890) traveled to California to search for him. John was never found and Joseph returned to Lancaster. Nor did Henry return. It's not known why Joseph wasn't worried about Henry. Source: Brian Smith.


I am unable to determine who this Martin GOETZ is. Since his name appears next to the HUSS family, and GOETZ was the maiden name of Madeline HUSS, it could be that Martin GOETZ is related to Madeline. Madeline's father Mathias GOETZ died in 1836, the same year she was born. Madeline had no surviving uncles in 1866. The Soufflenheim birth records show only one Martin GOETZ of this approximate age: Jean Martin GOETZ, born 10-Nov-1806, son of Joseph Goetz & Marie Anne Haertel, but he died in Soufflenheim on 03-Jul-1870.

## **TOWN ACCOUNTS**

The town accounts are the general ledgers of Soufflenheim, listing all sources of income and expense for each year beginning in 1664. Accounts from 1674-1679, 1686-1689 and 1700-1708 are missing. Although listed in the index, there is no account for 1674, a duplicate of 1673, presented in 1674 has been mistaken for this account. The accounts are kept in the archives at Strasbourg, which is where the town halls, with the exception of some large towns, are required to send their archives.

The oldest town accounts are found in series:

1E3.158, 1 and 2: 1664 to 1765
1E3.158, 4 and 5: 1766 to 1792

Town Accounts after 1792 are organized into "archives communales" or "administration" in series M etc.

All accounts from 1664 through 1765 were searched for tax records. Only the 1680 and 1701 accounts contain a list of taxpayers, confirming research in the book *Soufflenheim un cite*.

The names of mayors (Schultheiss, Heimburger, Burgermeister) are listed in each account. With the exception of tax records in 1680 and 1701, the earliest accounts do not list groups of people. They typically mention 50-80 names in the 17<sup>th</sup> century, some multiple times. After removing duplicate names, 25-35 residents of the village are found in each account.
