Message from Council Chair

It is an absolute pleasure and joy, to announce that on Sunday November 3rd 2024 at our congregational meeting, the congregation unanimously voted to call Sylvia Poetschke as our new pastor! We will share Pastor Sylvia with our brothers and sisters at St. James.

I can now tell you that we practically had to knock her out from the start! The new minister came close to not even making the long list!! You see our Synod loves forms, policies, and procedures. And certainly if it were not for forms, policies, and procedures the world as we know it, would be in danger of shutting down.

The candidates had to answer a question on a form that asked: "In 50 words or less describe your passion for ministry". 50 words!! It was quite clear. And yet Sylvia's passion was so great, that it could not be described by her in 50 words – it took her 3 times that.

So, what should be done? An immediate exclusion of someone who cannot follow simple instructions? Perhaps as a child she coloured outside the lines! Will our small little church be able to accommodate someone whose love is so great for her job, that is cannot be contained by a restriction of word count?

I am going to say with full confidence and faith in the Spirit, that we are going to be able to more than just accommodate Pastor Sylvia, and she may well encourage us to reach higher than we thought possible.

For sure it is Sylvia's job to get to know us, but it is our job to get to know her. Over the coming days, weeks, and months, find out for yourself why she could not describe her passion for ministry in only 50 words. Ask about her time she spent as a pastor in our corrections system serving some of the most challenging and vulnerable folks on the planet (because that is a tough gig).

Ask her what it is to be an End-of-Life Doula (because she is one). Ask her what was the goofiest thing she did at her joint calling in St. Paul's Lutheran and Trinity United Churches in Magnetawan Ontario (because I think she has some goofiness in her). Ask her what she really thinks of the Ontario Horticulture Association (because the answer will be interesting).

Sylvia, her husband Graham, and a crew of dogs and cats live across the river in Portage- du-Fort. She loves to snowshoe, so there is no excuse for her to miss a service in a blizzard. She has made a paddle, so that means that she will never be up the creek without one.

We would not even be considering a new Pastor if it were not for the Call Search Committee. Under the joint leadership of Marilyn Kropp (from St. James) and Lorne Rueckwald, Ulla Schilling (St. James), John Stiefelmeyer (St. James), Enid Blackwell, and myself, we were able to make what I am convinced is the right call

Somewhere along the line if you attend church, or even think about attending church, you need to have faith in your understanding of the Holy Spirit. Things lined up for us to call Pastor Sylvia. A pastor serving far on the other side of Algonquin Park decides to move to this area. A pastor ordained in 2001, who has a great skill set that meets the needs of our congregation, shows up. A pastor who likes to colour outside the lines, has the crayon. Sometimes we need to have the faith to fall in the embrace of something more powerful than us. Perhaps this is one of those times.

As delightful as it has been to write these "Message from Council Chair" articles, it is time to close the keyboard on them. The "Message from Council Chair" was largely to replace, on a temporary basis, a message from a real minister. I, like all of you are, am looking forward to the next newsletter with a "Message from the Pastor".

Draft Minutes of October 21st, 2024 Council Meeting Attendance:

Andy Kalnins (Zoom) Debbie Witt Fred Steinke

Meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm. Enid opened with a prayer and welcomed everyone.

- 1. **Previous Minutes:** Debbie moved that the September 16, 2024 minutes be accepted as distributed, with a correction under Property that John McIntyre has to see the church blueprints to provide more feedback on the lift. Seconded by Fred, CARRIED.
- 2. **Ministry Plans for November:** Karen may lead Nov 3 for All Saints, or another Sunday if Michael Hackbusch is available that day. Awaiting word on his availability for the month. Lay services for the rest of the month.
- 3. **Property:** Randy and Jeff discussed 4 property categories and coordination: routine maintenance tasks, projects, communication, and other. Randy prepared to continue with maintenance tasks; projects (e.g. window replacement, flooring, security camera, outdoor grass/snow scheduling) led based upon relevant skills; communication: Andy agreed to be contact person for members with queries/items to be addressed; other (e.g. property budget Randy; other-discussion). Bell replaced all equipment related to our internet problems and refunded us for service interruption. Pastor's office painted thanks to Alison, and the new flooring has been purchased to be installed in November. Curtains to be put in the lounge/large board room. A new printer was donated and installed on the network, presently in pastor's office. Reminder signs to ensure all lights are turned off placed on the exit doors. Two security cameras to be installed in November. Furnace maintenance to be scheduled for November.
- 4. **Health & Safety**: Now that respiratory illness season is upon us, Andy will put a notice in the newsletter reminding everyone to us hand sanitizer and to stay home if you are sick.
- 5. **Pastoral Care:** Visits, home communion, and any other contact, continues one day a month, this month being Oct. 21 with Pastor Leena Jensen. Thanks to Beryl for accompaniment.
- 6. Finances: Ordinary budget: End of September surplus to expenses \$19,264, largely due to pastoral vacancy. Commitments: \$5,102 in September, presently short \$4,749 of being on target with budget to end Sept. We expect bigger bills in October for property projects. Charitus Partnership grant of \$3000 for accessible washroom held in other income; report due Sept. 2025. Christmas appeal planning tabled for Nov. Enid moved that the financial report for the end of September be accepted as presented. Karen seconded, CARRIED
- 7. **Call Process and Church Profile Update:** Andy reported that there will be a ballot vote on November 3 by congregational members for the minister candidate.
- 8. **Outreach:** Andy said plans are going well for the spaghetti dinner with lots of different sauces that have been prepared. Advertising is ongoing on different venues. All proceeds to the Fountain.
- 9. Youth: Sunday School will be on October 27 with Mellissa Watt.

Draft Minutes of November 3rd, 2024 Congregational Meeting

Meeting was called to order at 11:30 pm. Enid opened with a prayer.

- 1. **Confirmation of Quorum:** Debbie confirmed that there are 32 people in attendance to vote which meets requirements for quorum.
- 2. **Appointment of Tellers (counters):** Andy announced the counters are Karen Greening and Maureen Rueckwald.
- 3. **Announcement of Candidate:** Debbie announced that Pastor Sylvia Poetschke is the name of the candidate.
- 4. **Candidate and Selection Rationale**: Lorne Rueckwald (Chair of Call Committee), spoke as to how the selection was made and why this candidate was chosen. He gave a synopsis of her background and experiences which made this a good choice for us.
- 5. **Questions from the Floor:** Andy answered questions from members and that Pastor Sylvia would be starting on December 1 as our Pastor.
- 6. **Call for Vote:** Andy announced a call to vote.
- 7. **Distribution, Collection and Counting of Ballots:** Karen and Maureen
- 8. **Announcement of Results:** Andy announced the results of the vote which is 32 votes for yes out of 32 voting members.
- 9. **Letter of Call:** Andy will be sending a letter of call results to Synod.
- 10. **Motion request to destroy the ballots:** Lynn Rosien made the motion that the ballots be destroyed. Seconded by Keith Richardson, CARRIED
- 11. Meeting Adjourned

On Sunday evening, October 6th a very unusual could formation was seen over the Ottawa area.

The clouds are known as *Undulatus asperitas*, an uncommon and unique cloud so named after the Latin word for roughness, said Geoff Coulson, a warning preparedness meteorologist with Environment and Climate Change Canada.

Meteorologists theorize that the clouds are caused by "pockets" of air rising and sinking in the atmosphere, combined with winds shifting direction quickly, known as wind shear. The World Meteorological Organization officially recognized asperitas clouds in 2015, making it the first new distinct cloud type in more than 50 years. (Ottawa Citizen, October 7th, 2024).




