1. Pastor opened with a prayer.


#### 2. OFFICIAL COUNCIL OFFICERS

- **Secretary:** Deborah Witt has accepted to continue as secretary. Andris Kalnins moved that Deborah Witt continue as secretary, seconded by Fred Steinke: **CARRIED**
- **Financial Secretary:** Cathy Zimmerling has agreed to continue as Financial Secretary. Andris Kalnins moved to have Cathy Zimmerling continue in her appointment as Financial Secretary. Seconded by Deborah Witt: **CARRIED**

### Minutes of the March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2023 Council Meeting

Meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm.

- 1. Andy welcomed the members at the first meeting of the new council.
- 2. Pastor opened with a devotion and prayer.
- **3.** Andy referred to a video "Have More to Share", due to be shown to local municipal councils by the Greater Arnprior Community Council on Poverty and Homelessness, concerning possible 'community table' meals being held and the potential for St. John's involvement in time.
- **4. Previous Minutes:** Debbie moved that the February 27, 2023 minutes be approved. Published minutes were resent with an addition under the Children & Youth report. "Overall feedback has been positive on the program". Enid seconded, CARRIED. Moved by Debbie Witt and Seconded by Fred Steinke that the March 6 draft minutes be approved as distributed: **CARRIED**
- **5. Finance:** No formal report available. Bank statement for the end of February shows an account balance of \$28,380. Discussion ensued on an adjustment to year end statements and CRA submission with respect to correcting recording of a December donation for future use, possibly as an initiation of an 'endowment fund'. Debbie Witt nominated Enid Blackwell as treasurer, who agreed to stand given she has council support through a learning curve. Fred Steinke seconded: **CARRIED**
- **6. Property:** The Report received from property chair, Randy listed current projects planned for 2023 such as: tool shed assembly, electric sub panel replacement, bathroom renovation, flashing and mortar repair over front door, install flashing and paint sills in Pastor's office window and starting storm window replacement. Council agreed: to reinstall pamphlet holder but not hymn board; to sell excess wooden and metal chairs and old lectern. Dave noted Randy started researching building/asset insurance coverage and quotes; recommendation coming to Council in future.
- **7. Children and Youth:** Pr. Norine reported that Camp Lutherlyn still needs 3 lifeguards. May and June Sunday School dates to be determined.
- **8. Pastor's report:** Ministry continues to be very busy. Still continuing with visits and home communion. Zoom confirmation classes begun but not ideal. May 11, OVA Pastors meet at St. John's 9:30-12:00. May 14-19 Pr. Norine on Continuing Education course; Pr. Stan covering. There will be a funeral on May 20 for a St. James member.
- 9. Outreach: Jeff presented by Zoom. Fund raisers, free will donations, for Lutherlyn campership: Easter breakfast, April 9 by men, 8:30-10:15 Ed. Note: This was subsequently deferred to May 13th; in May: Camp Sunday, a camp breakfast or lunch. Anglicans to be invited. All campership donations administered and dispersed by Lutherlyn. We will participate in the June 3 Big Give by supporting Earth Day (April 22) with road/property clean-up on volunteer basis on date TBD. The Angel Tree to return at Christmas for chickens or other need. Support for a local school daily breakfast program suggested; engages members. Jeff to contact Walter Zadow School to determine volunteer and/or gift card needs, and Anglicans for possible joint effort.
- **10. Technology:** Reviewed Dave's schedule for next 7 Sundays with information from P+Norine: March 26<sup>th</sup> through Easter: April 2nd live music, streaming, April 9- live music, streaming. April 16, 23, May 7<sup>th</sup>, no streaming. April 30, streaming. Views showing up on YouTube now about 10, half of what it was when streamed every week.

- 11. Communication and Rental: Enid continues almost daily posts to Facebook; noted recent posting of CLWR recognition of our bowl event. Andy volunteered to do more posts as Enid will be Treasurer. Enid's scheduling work also being reviewed. Rentals: the Muslim community to rent the basement during Ramadan every night from Wednesday, March 22 until about April 20, on top of their regular Friday prayer time, also having a self-contained potluck April 14. To cover added heating/other costs, Andy moved and Fred seconded that we ask an extra \$200 rent. CARRIED Confirmed bookings accepted for IAMAW Union April 3, 17 and May 1 afternoons.

- 15. **New Business: Moving Ahead on Management of SJL Finances** We need a Bookkeeper ASAP as, by May 1, Alison is stepping down from this position. Adam Rueckwald, business admin-accounting graduate, PA Corp operations manager, bookkeeper for St. John's in the past, has indicated he would be willing to be our bookkeeper. He presently handles other church accounts for a moderate monthly fee, and is willing to offer similar to us. We may have to purchase a monthly Quickbooks online license. These items are outside of our 2023 budget and a notice will go in April newsletter, with congregational input sought when required. Moved by Dave, seconded by Fred that Treasurer (Enid) & Chair of Council (Andy) have permission to pursue contacting Adam Rueckwald as bookkeeper and negotiating a monthly fee. Seconded by Fred: **CARRIED**

#### Ramadan Reminder (and more!)




In the March Mustard Seed newsletter, you read how our Muslim neighbours are sharing our building at times, renting some rooms, as they gather for prayers. Here is a reminder about times to be respectful of their worship here, especially during Ramadan evenings March 22 to April 19.

Ramadan, a very sacred and special month, began on Wednesday, March 22 when the prayer group gathered for the first of 30 evenings of special communal prayers called Taraweeh (night prayer). Often, whole families come. Some of the time, the group meets in our downstairs hall for Taraweeh, after nightfall and after breaking fast at sundown with a meal called iftar. The daily fasting is a private act of worship promoting nearness to God, and also a form of spiritual discipline and a means of empathizing with those less fortunate.

The start of Taraweeh varies from 9 to 9:30 p.m., and the group leaves by 10-10:30p.m. When our down-stairs is specially set up for a big Sunday social, the group will do night prayer in the lounge. Final Taraweeh will be April 19. Eid al-Fitr feast then celebrates the breaking of the fast, when gifts are given and special gifts are also given to the poor.

And, Friday prayers continue, for those who can come, at 1-2pm in the lounge. Please know that our Muslim friends have extended an invitation for us to come to prayer time, should we wish. And an invitation to our services has been made to them.

Thanks to everyone who lent us materials. They are available for pick-up if you want them back, in the Church Boardroom/ Office.


