Pastor's Message

King George VI gave the Christmas message of December 25, 1939. The Christmas message tradition had been started by his father, George V in 1932, but it was WWII that embedded it as an annual tradition in British hearts and minds.

George's wife Elizabeth, grandmother to King Charles, brought him a poem that had deeply touched her. George VI excerpted the first lines of the poem, "God Knows" (aka "The Gate of the Year") by Minnie Louise Haskins to illuminate the spiritual comfort he believed his subjects might seek." c - [From the National WWII Museum – New Orleans- USA- website – the King's Christmas Speech 1939.](#)

I recently found these same lines amidst my father's WWII memorabilia this past year.

"And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown." And he replied: "Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way." So I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night. And He led me towards the hills and the breaking of day in the lone East."

The point is no one knows what lies ahead except God, and God's not telling. I don't want to get into a discussion about premeditation, but I believe that God reveals his will for our lives in small increments, one day at a time.

We stand at the threshold of a new calendar year. Who knows what lies ahead and what effect anything will have on our personal lives or the life of our faith communities? We can't predict the future, but we can choose how we'll respond to it – we can worry about what's going to happen next, but why bother - as you can be confident and trust in God to lead the way. **MAY GOD BLESS YOU & YOURS IN 2023! 


Minutes of the December 19th, 2022 Council Meeting

Meeting was called to order at 2:00 pm.

- Pastor opened with a devotion and prayer.
- Previous Minutes:** Debbie moved that the November 28, 2022 minutes be approved as distributed. Andy seconded, **CARRIED**.
- Treasurer:** Recommended that a Treasurer elected by Council from membership have voice on all financial matters. Moved by Debbie, Seconded by Dave, **CARRIED**
- Finance:** Randy reported that year to date deficit has improved to \$7,863 as there are no large outstanding bills and continued increase in Dec. donations. Bazaar and Christmas appeal help significantly in reducing the deficit. We have had great support from our congregation. To keep members updated it was suggested to have quarterly statements in the newsletter. Report was accepted. Moved by Andy, Seconded Fred, **CARRIED**
- Property:** Vent drains installed in furnace pipes by Fred, installed insulation for large hot water tank, pipe organ tuned, stained glass windows just need silicone on cracks. Randy getting quotes to fix/replace windows in the back & pastor's office. Wood rotting etc. Plans/Upgrades: basement electrical sub panel; quotes on replacing red carpet & Pastor's office flooring and furnaces. Plan for handicap accessible washroom. Discussion of accessibility and rental:


Accessibility proposal:, 2 sources of grants: Trillium Foundation Capital Grands and Federal Enabling Accessibility Fund. Both will fund a significant part of the cost. Access to accessible washroom and space welcome to all is mandatory to get funding. Trillium application starts in July and federal in Sept/Oct. Ongoing research for different lifts, contractors etc.

Rental Income Proposal: Rental income plan proposed has been modified to a Studio Apartment which can be created from the Lounge and half of the Alicia St. entrance-way. There would be no zoning change. Council discussed possible rental and also Emergency Housing (EH) usage. With EH the government pays all costs and any damage while a client uses the space. There is need; helping people in crisis discussed as good use of space as well.
- Outreach:** Jeff joined by Zoom. 26 chickens were donated to Food Bank at a cost of \$449.(instead of projected \$1125 for chickens). Leaves \$775, originally allocated to Food Bank. Some \$900 for Food Bank from individual members, and \$1,000 grant coming from Synod for the FB Snack Pack program. Since the Food Bank is in good standing this year, Jeff suggested that the \$775 go to Canadian Lutheran World Relief, to be matched 4x, for Emergency Food needed in more urgent areas globally. In future we might consider donating to Hospice for Renfrew. Motion for \$775 to CLWR moved by Fred, Seconded by Rachel, **CARRIED** Jeff and Randy left meeting.
- Children and Youth:** Sunday School to start in January some time, projected 1x/month, and Christmas pageant planned.
- Pastor's report:** Ministry continues with home visits, calls, etc. Jan.15 Pastor will be off as well as Feb. 12, St. James AGM. Few attending Blue Christmas this year.
- Health & Safety:** COVID/Flu/RSV Protocols. No government requirements for masking. To leave it up to individuals. Socials can return in January. We need to adapt to the needs of those we serve and put the responsibility on the individuals.
- Operations matters:** Some uncovered historic records may be photographed by Dave before going to church Special Collections Archives, held and managed at Wilfrid Laurier University.

Council Minutes continued,

- 11. Communications:** Steady Facebook presence, Pastoral Care/Deliveries continue for 11 households. PC team meets December 20 to prepare Christmas plate gifts and deliver. The ad for the Chronicle-Guide for Christmas Eve Service has gone in. Fellowship for Dec. cancelled and January will resume. Visioning & Planning 'Renewal Team' formed from membership and from council to gather and study some qualitative and mostly quantitative information in order to bring basic "stay" "leave" option (s) to congregation, likely at Annual Meeting time. Team: Jeff Kargus, Mellissa Watt, Beryl Richardson, Debbie Witt, Andy Kalnins, Enid Blackwell, P+ Norine.
- 12. Technology:** Dave stated it takes at least 2 ½ hours to prepare the service for streaming, plus P+Norine spends considerable time in prior preparation related to online availability. Discussion on reducing/stopping streaming, as we are one of the few doing so. Dave will bring other options to our next meeting.

Patricia Tait (A/Manager) and Karen Graham (Board Member) were very pleased to accept the chickens from the “good people of St. John’s Lutheran Church.”






