Pastor's Message

Nativity or manger scenes are the focus of the spiritual celebrations of Christmas in many places and homes. During the twelve days of Christmas – from Dec 25- Jan 5 - you might introduce the figures of the magi moving closer to the Holy Family, day by day until they arrive on Jan 6 -Epiphany. Among the earliest Christians in the Eastern Church, Epiphany marked the showing off of the baby Jesus to the magi, who represent all of us from other nations who worship Jesus.

This time of Epiphany is our opportunity to celebrate God's gift to us and the hope He brings into a world troubled by unrest, hunger, and darkness. As a Greek word it means *revealing or appearing*. We think of the star which directed the magi to the stable. Its appearance in the sky drew these astrologer priests as they believed that stars announced great events.

This season celebrates Christ's incarnation for all people of the world, who –like most of us – are not the chosen Jewish people, but who long never the less for God to set the world right. Jesus was sent by God, to bring righteousness into our world and to reveal the unimaginable depth of God's love.

The gifts of the magi; gold, frankincense and myrrh point to royalty. The Romans used myrrh as a perfume, medicine and as incense. We present our gifts in the same way. Martin Luther is quoted to have written, "He who gives of his gifts to help the poor, to send children to school, to educate them in God's word and other arts – he is giving to the baby Jesus."



Meeting was called to order at 7:30 and Pastor opened with devotions and a prayer.

Meeting Minutes:

Two changes were noted in the meeting minutes from November. The first was that the current deficit was \$7000, not \$14,000. A second change was made as there was a missing word in the minutes.

Pastor's report:

- 1. Pastor reported that Christmas Cards have been sent to seniors and that she has visited most of our seniors.
- 2. Randy Z noted that the list of our seniors who need pastoral care is growing. Needs tend to be greater at this time of year.
- 3. Pastor will take a few days off (vacation) around Christmas.
- 4. St. James is having their AGM on February 23, 2020.
- 5. The Bishop's Retreat is February 9-12, 2020.
- 6. Bishop Michael is in area on March 16, 2020 with a very busy schedule.

Finance:

- 1. The proposed Budget for 2020 was discussed in detail. We are not projecting any significant changes relative to the current year.
- 2. It was noted that the generosity of our congregation has been incredible, who continue to make giving to the church a priority in their lives.
- 3. Repair of the basement floor needs a plan. The plan should be discussed at the AGM, so it is <u>not</u> included in the budget, as we may need a campaign to raise sufficient funds.
- 4. It was noted that we are projecting a deficit of \$3500 for the current year. Benevolence is behind by \$550. Randy Z will make an announcement to the congregation at the next Sunday service so that everyone has the same information.

Outreach:

- 1. Jeff K suggested that we should do something (e.g., a breakfast) to thank our congregation. Council agreed and a date will be determined in the near future.
- 2. Ryan Z will be producing a year-in-review video for facebook and youtube. Anyone who has pictures of past events should send them to Ryan Z.

Annual General Meeting:

- 1. Our AGM will be February 16, 2020. As per usual, we will have a potluck preceding the AGM
- 2. Council is to provide their reports to Randy Z for the AGM by the last week of January.

Other Business:


Membership for Council – The current council was encouraged to take a couple of weeks to decide on whether they wish to continue serving on council.

All I can say is WOW!!!



Canadian Missions (\$350,000)

In 2018 the Eastern Synod Mission Committee provided more than \$325,000 in grants to 39 congregations and Ministry Areas to support initiatives that are about increasing the vitality of our church, strengthening discipleship in Jesus Christ and engaging those outside our walls.

Potential recipients can apply for grants in three categories:

- **Compassionate Justice Initiatives** (addressing hunger and poverty related issues in the wider community, through CLWR Funds)
- Mission Partnership Support: Short Term and Long Term support that comes via synodical and nation
 - al gifts and endowments. The grants support applications that:
 - a) are exploratory and experimental in nature;
 - b) seek to address a challenge being faced in a particular context in relation to the Church's mission
 - c) seek to develop relationships with others in local communities and neighbourhoods;
 - d) encourage participation in God's mission in local communities and neighbourhoods.
