

Council Meeting

December 15th, 2021

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Enid led a round table talking about Christmas ornaments that are significant. Pastor opened with a devotion and a prayer.

- 1. **Previous Minutes:** Dave moved that the Nov 15th, 2021 minutes be approved as distributed, Debbie seconded, CARRIED.
- 2. **Finance:** Alison optimistic that we will break even. Decision to include an appeal at the end of the video telling people how to donate. It will run on the 19th and 24th. Benevolence obligation has been met. Alison moved that the Finance report be accepted, seconded by Andy, CARRIED. Alison moved that the Christmas offerings be directed to Current, seconded by Debbie Carried. Discussion around the outreach amount be deferred to the January meeting or the AGM.
- 3. **Unplug** on the 12th had 6 or 7 kids, the birds cooperated. UNPLUG planning in January: Julie Z. and Alison to meet to discuss other farm/forest events more focus on child-directed events.
- 4. **Pastor's report**: Pastor presented her activity report. Blue Christmas pre-recorded with 2 United clergy, for 6 congregations. Pastor on vacation December 26 through January 1.
- 5. COVID Protocols: Andy's suggestion that given no restrictions from Renfrew Health, we continue to plan for Christmas Eve. Seating plan is developed. No singing. Debbie outlined the registrations for Christmas Eve. 35 so far. No singing for the 19th. Contingency is to use the taped 26th service for Christmas Eve if in-person not permitted. Announce near capacity on the 19th. Debbie to call some regulars who have not yet reserved.
- 6. Outreach: Generous donations meant 81 chickens were delivered by Jeff Kargus to the Food Bank
- 7. **Communications:** Enid reported on Facebook activity 940 reaches. January newsletter deadline is Jan 6th. Christmas packages and cards being prepared and delivered to some members mostly confined to homes/residences.
- 8. **Operations resource:** Debbie to circulate the job duties and procedure documents to relevant people for updating.
- 9. **Tech and Property:** A new humidifier was installed.
- 10. Other Business:
 - **AGM timeline.** Planning for AGM date of Sunday 13th of March. Reports in by Feb 13th.
 - Visioning Retreat: Meeting of Task Force was held at end of November. Looking at April / May for the retreat. Task Force will need to meet again to plan for it.
 - **Email vote policy** deferred to January
 - Planning Cycle: was reviewed.
 - **NEXT MEETING:** Jan 16, 2022, 10:00 a.m. Zoom. Budget working session and shortened meeting (update since December meeting).

Message from Bishop Michael regarding COVID

Dear Colleagues,

The COVID-19 situation across our Synod continues to evolve on a near daily basis. Over the Christmas holidays we have seen the tightening of restrictions in all four of our provincial jurisdictions.

Since the beginning of this pandemic, I have urged you to do whatever is necessary to protect one another and safeguard the health and safety of our communities. We have done this as an act of love for, and a gift of service to, our neighbours. Twenty-one months later, this priority still stands.

To that end, and with the information we have today, I feel that it is both prudent and responsible for Eastern Synod congregations to suspend all in-person worship services and other gatherings effective immediately and for a period of at least four weeks. I commit to reviewing this advice and communicating an updated recommendation to you by the end of January 2022. Likewise, a decision regarding the Spiritual Retreats scheduled for the month of February will be made and communicated to you as soon as possible.

I remain encouraged by the resiliency and faithfulness with which our leaders and faith communities continue to engage these challenges. Your actions are a clear proclamation of the gospel that extend far beyond the brick and mortar limits of our physical buildings. I am deeply grateful and inspired by each of you.

Please do not hesitate to reach out to my office if we can offer support to you in these days. In the meantime, please take a moment to check in with one another, support one another, and make use of the Resource Library which is available for your use.

I am praying for you, dear partners in ministry. May God bless and keep you.

"You have, what we in Tech Support call a One D Ten T problem . . . ".


"That's right . . . if you could just write that down: 1 D 1 0 T "

A Christmas message from Bishop Michael Pryse

"The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight." As a child, I was always mystified by this line from the carol, O Little Town of Bethlehem. I understood something of the hope of Christmas. But what role could fear possibly play in the wondrous and beautiful story of the first Christmas?

But in time, I learned. I learned something about the fear of a young mother about to bear her first child, under far from normal circumstances, alone in a cattle shed. I learned about the fear of a poor father unable to provide his family with proper shelter. The fear of simple shepherds startled by the unexpected appearance of heavenly emissaries. The fear of a jealous and vengeful king whose terrors would soon force the young family to flee to a distant land as refugees.

Hope and fear did, indeed, meet on that first Christmas night. And they've been meeting there ever since! And for most of us, that will again be the case this year. But fear cannot get the final word for this Christmas any more than it did for the first! Despite our quite understandable anxieties and fears, it is not a message of fear, but rather one of hope, that we will again proclaim and celebrate this Christmas – and perhaps with a deeper integrity than might be the case under less challenging circumstances.

At Christmas we celebrate a God who loves creation so intensely that he chose to enter into the very heart of our creaturely existences, for good or for ill – not just one day of the year – but for all three hundred and sixty-five!

Fear not, dear friends. The light of Christ's presence still shines bright. It is the light of divine hope, a light that casts out fear and scatters the darkness.

Fear not! Christ the Saviour is born!

Hi my name is Jacob Elliot. I have a brother and his name is Sawyer. My Mom's name is Jessi-






