Minutes of the June 19th, 2023 Council Meeting

Meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm.

1. Pastor opened with a devotion and prayer.

- 2. **Previous Minutes:** Debbie moved that the May 29, 2023 minutes be approved as distributed. Fred seconded. **CARRIED**.
- 3. **Finance**: Enid reported operating budget deficit of \$1,317.00 about ½ of budget deficit at this time last year. Commitments income is now over \$5,000 below budget. Rental/investment income \$2,274 over budget has helped offset our income to expense deficit. Expenses continue to run less than budget, by close to \$2,470.00. Debbie moved that finance report be accepted. Dave seconded, **CARRIED.**
- **4. Property:** Competitive insurance quotes soon to be recommended. Electric sub panel replacement to be scheduled. Assessing kitchen for inspection by Renfrew County District Health Unit, Kitchen Committee to look at the pros and cons of having our kitchen inspected based on a recent course that Cathy and Randy had taken.
- 5. **Pastor's report:** Ministry continues to be busy with visits as well as normal office preps. Holiday coverage and service to be worked out. To contact Pastor Stan if need be but if a death to contact P. Norine.
- 6. **Outreach:** Possibly look at Longer Table concept in the future. Campership was very successful.
- 7. **Technology:** Live Stream for July 2, Red and White day with communion, script posted plus Karen Prince playing. Live stream Aug. 6 with communion. The rest of summer will be no stream. Summer newsletter to be ready for July 2. Dave to sort live streaming difficulty on June 18 service.
- **8. Communications/Rental-Usage:** Camp lunch finally took place on June 18 which was well attended. The Ukelele Group SALC were very entertaining and enjoyed by all. New Muslim agreement for prayer time from May 19-August 25 to be added as named 3rd party in their insurance policy. \$500 expected. Andrea Villarreal will continue with Wednesday dance classes for June from 6-7 p.m. Any July/August dates TBD.

Meeting was called to order at 11:40 am.

A special meeting was called to make a decision on insurance as it is due June 27. Randy Zimmerling had researched other companies for coverage and quotes and the better option would be to go with Robertson Hall in the amount of \$2,304.00 for a year a savings of \$600.00 from Cherry Insurance quote and coverage.

Randy explained that our Abuse Policy needs some minor changes under the Vulnerable Sector Verification (Screening). The Police Check (which is now outsourced) is still free but you have to have a form letter stating if a person is alone 1 on 1 with a vulnerable person/child or not. Andy and Pr. Norine will be meeting June 26 to do some revisions.

Fred motioned that Robertson Hall become our insurer. Enid seconded. CARRIED

We thank Randy for his hard work researching the different insurance companies and his clear presentation to Council.


Summertime! and the Living is Easy ~Note from Council~
