Minutes of the October 26th, 2022 Council Meeting

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm.

- 1. Pastor opened with a prayer.
- 2. **Previous Minutes:** M by Debbie, S by Andy, that the September 26, 2022 minutes be approved as distributed. **CARRIED**.
- 3. **Finance:** The Treasurer's report indicated a deficit to end of September of \$10,145, a further decrease from August's deficit of \$9,323. Commitments are \$3,500 under budget, investment return is \$4,200 below budget, utilities \$325 over budget. Basement renovations -\$8,301.56 to date, final bill will be \$8,554.80 drawn from reserves, for which congregation had approved up to \$10,000 from reserves. (\$770 Memoriam fund for Bill Koops plus \$50.00 which was on books previously also go for these renovations). November appeals and special Christmas Eve envelopes will be forthcoming to go towards operation costs. Approval of report M by Andy, S by Fred. **CARRIED**
- 4. **Children and Youth:** The Youth Planning Team are focusing on getting Sunday School (SS) restarted by Nov. 27, using the Rocky Railway VBS curriculum which engages both elementary and pre-school children. Input from families with children is planned via a brief survey, including their preference for SS 1 Sunday a month or 3 Sundays, plus 1 youth-led service. Some leaders confirmed, more being sought; SS support people identified already. A float in Nov. 26 Santa Claus parade is planned as well as a Christmas Eve pageant, in which all kids attending can be involved. UNPLUG Dates Nov. 6 Wild Bird Rehabilitation & Owl Pellet Dissection (Fitzroy V. Pk)
- 5. **Upcoming Sunday Plans/Information Sessions:** Set plans for: Oct. 30 basement floor reopening, information sessions on renovation-accessibility/rental ideas (Nov. 6-Dave and Alison), worship ideas (Nov. 20- P+Norine); youth group ideas session projected January.
- 6. **Pastor's report:** Pastor's report was presented. Extras included: area Pastors meeting in Quebec, sick leave time. Prayer team and pastoral care work/meetings going well. Continuing Ed week Nov 6-11, Kargus wedding Nov.25-27, Andy to lead worship.
- 7. Outreach/(COVID): No Outreach report. People can choose to wear a mask or not for COVID.
- 8. **Communications:** Ongoing deliveries for 11 households & pastoral care visits/calls. Enid to coordinate Bill Koops kitchen plaque/dedication, probably Nov. Volunteer recognition, council succession planning tabled. Monitoring federal & provincial accessibility build grants availability. Shared Ministry to sort Christmas Eve James/John service times. No service Dec.25.
- 9. Operations matters: No Report
- 10. Property: Phase I of the basement is completed with thanks to Dave, Randy, Cathy, Jeff, Fred, Kevin, Greg, Rex, Cory, Gerald, Frank and Lorne R. Also thank you to the cleaning crew who handled the kitchen clean up. Gerald has completed the painting. There are a few baseboard detail items remaining which will be done in Phase 2 (front hall and washrooms). Decided to keep the chairs with curved legs, and cull those with 4 straight legs and some other damaged ones. Beryl and Keith are clearing the leaves, Fred is storing lawn tractor, Jeff is storing rain barrels. Technology: No issues or plans.



MY PARENTS CAN BE SO RUDE.







Indigo is a live American Kestrel who can't be released into the wild. Patty also uses taxidermy to keep the presentation as hands-on as possible. Participants will get to touch and explore many different wings, feet, and beaks during the presentation to help them with their understanding and identification of birds. Kids then can dissect real owl pellets to see what the owls have recently eaten — a very popular activity. Binoculars will be available for anyone arriving early.
