October 18th, 2021

Meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m. Enid led a round table talking about important people in our lives. Pastor opened with a devotion.

- 1. Previous Minutes:** Debbie moved that the Sept 27, 2021 minutes be approved with as distributed, Cory seconded, CARRIED. Debbie moved and Cory seconded the approval of the minutes of the October 7th, 2021 special meeting on the Constitution, Cory seconded. CARRIED
- 2. Finance:** The deficit increased to -\$7,012, about what was expected. Alison is optimistic that we could come close to breaking even by year end. Recommended that pastor prepare a letter on financial position, and include a Christmas envelope with the letter. Alison moved, Andy seconded that the financial report be accepted: CARRIED.
- 3. Bazaar:** Alison gave a briefing on the bazaar. Date is now Nov 13th. Alison has contacted an Auction and a dealers regarding other mechanisms to dispose of items.
- 5. Brochure:** Alison gave the outline of what we're planning with respect to connecting to new families moving into the area via the builders. Brochure / Unplug Flyer / Camp Lutherlyn Gift Certificate. Cory moved that this approach be approved in principle, Debbie seconded. CARRIED. Alison will follow up with the Camp.
- 6. Children, Youth, Family: UNPLUG:** Alison presented an unplugged report. Feedback has been solicited from families. We have 3 new support resources. The interim report was submitted to the Eastern Synod YAYA (Youth and Young Adult Ministry)
- 7. Pastor's report:** Pastor presented her activity report for the month.
- 8. COVID:** Andy updated the situation regarding singing. At this point, we will not allow singing for the immediate future, with hope that we can resume during Advent.
- 9. Communications:** Brief discussion on outreach and community support. Shoebox was announced at the last service.
- 10. Constitution renewal.** Submitted to Synod. All members have the proposed constitution. Special meeting on the Nov 14th, Synod to review on Nov 19th. Response from Wendall regarding Pastor and voting / council membership.
- 11. Property Update:** Thanks to Gerald for painting both the front and rear church exterior doors. Dave will winterize the A/C and the rain barrels. Walkway will not be replaced.
- 12. Technology:** Jeff is fully trained and comfortable with handling the live service. Dave will continue to do the setup (playlist, photos, etc).

Other Business

- Policy for voting with technology circulated for discussion next meeting.




BOOK STUDY

A Note on the Return to Singing



Church Council will be reviewing the current moratorium on singing during Service and will be announcing the new policy in time for the First Sunday of Advent (November 28th). As bars, restaurants, parades, Sports arenas and other secular venues open up, it is certainly frustrating that there is still no singing at our Church. The good news is that Synod is now very cautiously suggesting that congregations may consider a return to singing provided that there is support form local health agencies and that the local circumstances are appropriate to a safe return. Over the coming days, consultations will be made with the Renfrew County District Health Unit, Choirs Ontario and others.


