If we are going to follow Jesus to the cross during Lent, then we have to start where he started - where John the Baptist started. We have to start out in the wilderness. Some days it feels like we, in the year 2021, are living in a wilderness.

St. John's Church Council met last night Feb. 22 and have made the hard decision to remain closed for the Lenten season, and to offer scripts and continue with our YouTube services. May God protect and bless you and your families during this Lenten Season.



Council Meeting Minutes

February 22nd 2021

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 and Pastor opened with a reading and a prayer.

Roundtable check-in

1. Previous Minutes

Dave moved that the January 18th, 2021, minutes be approved as circulated, Andy seconded. **CARRIED**

2. **Council Members:** Debbie moved and Andy seconded that Enid be appointed Chair, and Enid moved that Andy be Vice Chair and Andy moved that Dave Burkett be secretary, Debbie seconded. Dave moved that Alison be appointed as Treasurer for a one-year term, seconded by Andy. **CARRIED**

3. **Finance:** Alison presented the P&L Comparison of January 2021 compared with 2020. Givings are up nearly \$2000 compared to same month last year. Alison noted that we have received the cheques (in Feb), for UnPlug and Technology. Debbie moved acceptance of the Finance report, Andy seconded, **CARRIED**.

Alison commented that if we purchase OneLicense (Reprint + Streaming) for \$377, the total technology budget should remain the same. To cover the increased cost of the license we would lower the AV director to 30 weeks.

Alison departed the meeting.

4. Pastor's report:

Pastor presented her report. She provided a status report on St. James building sale. Pastor talked about the evening Lenten services for 5 Wednesday nights at 7:00pm via Zoom – Dave to send out the link.

5. Communications:

Enid presented the facebook activity for February. More than 30 posts since last meeting. Enid presented the numbers of personal contacts and service audio with the congregation. Pastor noted she will contact the Grove and get contact details for Dorothy.

Dave: presented video viewership: the average number of people viewing the service videos completely remains at 43.

Jeff Kargus joined the meeting.

6. Outreach:

Jeff spoke about the CLWR initiative to raise money for solar Panels. Andy talked about the lack of light availability in the developing world. Suggested that we have an appeal for congregational support for Solar Panels (approx. \$100 each). Andy to contact Alison regarding how people should designate their givings. There will be regular communications to the congregation. Andy moved that council endorse this project (through CLWR), and that donations to LENT be directed to this project. Dave seconded, **CARRIED**.

Jeff departed the meeting.

7. Children Youth and family

Cory added to team of Ryan, P+Norine, Alison and Enid; the advisory team met twice. Finalized Outdoor Youth Program Coordinator job description, posting of ad etc. is ongoing, including our email lists. Anticipate mid March selection and next meeting. Planning for 7 activities of the 12 are fairly set, some are still brewing: e.g. community garden, sky, animals, tracks/nature hike/scavenger hunt, baby farm animals, riverbanks. Procedural, procurement, promotion work anticipated.

8. **Vacation Bible School/Vacation Camp:** It was agreed that we would not try to hold a VBS this year.
9. **Property Update:** Gerald monitoring the building every day. Tried to contact re getting the Lift inspected (Note: now scheduled for March 5th). There was some discussion around the town project for Alicia street. Randy has provided contacts at the town, Dave will follow up.
10. **Technology:** Dave moved and Debbie seconded that we purchase the reprint and podcast licenses from OneLicense for a cost of \$377. Carried.
11. **Re-opening:** St. James is already holding in-person worship. Pastor is not available for St. John's for March 14th due to St. James AGM. Dave suggested staying closed until at least the next council meeting. That will give more information regarding case numbers. Andy expressed concern regarding the risk, especially due to the variant, and suggested staying closed longer than that. Council decided to remain closed until at least April 4th. Enid and Andy will experiment with ways for people to call in and listen to the service.
12. **Synod Assembly delegate.** Looking for a delegate to the Synod Assembly June 25 – 26th. Need decision by March 15th.
13. **Council Installation:** Pastor to look at holding a zoom installation in March.

You're not who you think you are: Lent and the New You

The astonishing surprise, often not realized until the end of life, is that you are more than you could imagine, for you emanate from and are sustained by God. ASTRONOMY CORNER with Andy Kalnins

Genesis 2: 6-8


*Then the Lord God formed man from the **dust** of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being.*

The Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground I would suspect because it was pretty darn handy. Dust is ubiquitous, it gets in our hair, it gets in our homes, it seems to want to adhere to every surface. Dust and sand clouds can turn noon into midnight in cities, and can literally shut down the engines of high-altitude aircraft.

And our solar system, from the sun to almost the orbit of Mars, is laden with dust. For those of us that take the strategy that dust is eventually going to go away (and therefore not worth worrying about) we might be comforted by the fact that each particle of this solar system dust has a finite life. There are two problems: 1) The life of each particle is about 10000 years which is a long time not to use the Swiffer Duster, and 2) The dust that is vaporized by the sun, or hits the earth, or is blown away by the solar wind is replaced by the exhaust of visiting comets.

Most of the time this dust cannot ordinarily be seen but the first two weeks of March and the first two weeks of April will be good times to see what is called Zodiacal Light. The ecliptic is the path that the sun appears to follow in the sky as it travels through the year. Technically it is of course the path of the earth, but it looks to us like the path of the sun. At this time of year that line is at a steep angle. If you go outside about half an hour after the end of twilight and look to the west you may see what looks like a massive cone of light. It will be widest at the horizon and the center will straddle the line of the elliptic. It is the reflection of that inter-planetary dust, the stuff that we are made from!

Don't forget: Saturday March 20th is the arrival of spring !!! We get 12 hours and 8 minutes of daylight !!! Can an egg stand up on end that day? No, it cannot. But no matter, summer is on its way.





ONLINE AND SCRIPT WORSHIP

We Continue to Worship, Share and Care Safely

St. John's council decision is to continue with online and script worship services presently, and not resume in person worship until it is considered safe for the faith community to do so, and provincial and public health guidance allows.

Rationale:

- even given our current county 'green zone' category, our local chief Public Health official continues to encourage 'stay at home' as much as possible,
- congregant age and/or vulnerabilities
- vaccination roll out takes time
- COVID variant and 3rd wave concerns,
- recent cases in our area of Renfrew County,
- reluctance to reopen and possibly close again, and
- perspective and plans of national and synodical church leaders on continuance of caution and care.

However, **please keep the phone calls and contact going around St. John's community and beyond**. Who have you not seen for months? A year? How about a chat? A regular phone date? A card? A special treat or needed supply dropped off?

And, remember, **we have Lenten zooms** locally on 'light' and CLWR solar lights and nationally on Wednesday evenings (details elsewhere in newsletter). **Phone in connections can be arranged**, too.


2021 Lenten Offering Focus

On Ash Wednesday there were about ten a half hours of daylight, but by Easter Sunday there will be almost 13 hours. This happens no matter what we do, or do not do, We are careening towards the Summer Equinox when Arnprior and area will have 15 hours and 40 minutes of daylight. The light and the returning sun are welcome and essential to our food supply, our warmth and our very survival.

But in the Western World we are not totally dependent on the sun for light. The modern world is ridiculously awash in artificial light, as any nighttime map of the world will show. We can read, we safely walk about, prepare meals, carry out commerce, and take care of all our needs on the darkest of nights

But much of the world becomes dark as soon as the sun sets. Reading, meal preparation, and just walking become difficult if not impossible. Just think of how highly inconvenient it is when we have a power failure. Just think of how dreadful it would be if this power never returned.

The Church often talks of darkness of the spirit. But we don't often talk of literal light, the light that guides our eye. This Church Council is putting forward that we brighten and enhance the lives of others by providing them with Solar Lights.



CLWR has priced out installed Solar Lights at about \$100 a unit. They would be directed at primarily for use at refugee camps where the night's darkness brings particular dangers to women and children.

So this would be the Lenten Offering Project of our church: Providing Light. We do not have a target of how many units we could provide but one unit would be nice, two would be better, three would be fantastic, and more would be absolutely illuminating. How many lumens can we provide?

Pre-authorized contributions: those are set up for regular monthly donations, not for a special contribution. Please use one of the above methods for special contributions.

There will be three special (and short) Zoom Meetings to talk more about this project: March 4th, 18th, March 25th at 7:00 pm (all Thursdays), led by Jeff, Andy and Pastor. More details will follow later.

We will then start our worship services in the chapel at Trinity St. Andrews United Church. The Shared Ministry Agreement with St John's will remain unchanged.



