Minutes of the August 28th, 2023 Council Meeting

Meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm.

Andy welcomed the members at the first meeting since June.

Pastor opened with a devotion and prayer.

- 1. **Previous Minutes:** Debbie moved that the June 19, 2023 draft minutes be approved. As well the E-Vote of June 16 with upgrades to our Abuse Policy for insurance purposes. Also a special meeting on June 25 to approve to go with Robert Hall Insurance, saving \$600.00 a year. Fred seconded, CARRIED.
- 2. **Finance:** The deficit to the end of July is -\$3,513 which is less than half at this time last year. We remain short of desired commitment which is \$7,000 below budget. Rental/investment income is \$2,843 over budget which has helped offset deficit. Expenses still run somewhat under budget, \$1,750. Other income includes campership donations now at \$1,360. \$300 remitted to Food Bank. Newsletter to have a note on where we are at financially. Fred motioned that the finance report be accepted. Debbie Seconded, CARRIED
- 3. **Property:** Fred reported that electrical sub-panel parts to be purchased.
- 4. **Pastor's report:** Ministry continues to be very busy getting caught up after holidays. There will be a baptism on September 3 for baby Eloise Danielle daughter of Ryan and Shannon Kargus.
- **5. Long Range Planning:** Karen Greening will sit on committee, along with Lorne Reuckwald and Dave Burkett. The committee will contact young people to have their input even it not able to attend meetings.
- 6. **Outreach (including Bazaar):** Nothing at this time except bazaar. Maureen and Alison will be contacted to see if willing to organize this. The date suggested is Saturday, November 4.
- 7. **Technology:** Dave said that live stream is considerable work and may only happen during special occasions: i.e., Christmas, Easter, Bishop here (Nov. 19). Andy to train in order to help with the technology.
- 8. **Communication and Rental:** Facebook posts continue. Muslim community rental continues at least to the end of December. IAMAW Union, 3 Mondays afternoons and 1 Tuesday afternoon booked for September and Oct. Community Dance program to Start Sept. 13. Celebration of Life for Bower Litle on Saturday, September 23,9-5 by Ann Smeltzer. involves rental of downstairs, use of kitchen and large screen, signage by walkway. 3 Council members volunteered to cover all hours, including entry, info, setup, take down help.
- 9. Health & Safety: NO REPORT
- 10. Youth and Abuse Prevention Policy: Mellissa's report noted that she and Ryan attempted a matinee/ movie night; few kids but popcorn was delicious. Enid organized an UNPLUG Indigenous drumming event held on Aug. 26 attended by young and older kids alike. Sunday School to resume once a month, September through December for 35 min. while service is taking place. Sunday School Sept. 24 and likely Oct. 15. Mellissa also made some suggestions regarding the Abuse Protection Policy which were noted and will be looked at more closely at Council's next meeting. It was also suggested that this policy should be looked at every year.

- 12. New Business: Long Range Planning, Bazaar, Youth. All covered above.

Financial Update from Council: Second Quarter plus One Month 2023

Thank you all for continuing to participate in financial support of St. John's varied ministries, through regular offerings for our operating budget, whether through envelopes, PAR, e-transfers, and/or Canada Helps. This



support also extends to action for others. Recent Outreach events and donations have raised \$1,360 for Lutherlyn Camperships, and we continue to weekly welcome our Muslim neighbours and occasionally a workers' union who are pleased to rent some of our space.

Our financial details to the end of July now show a deficit to our operating budget of some \$3,500, considerably less than some \$9,000 deficit last year at this time. Our commitments income does not (yet!) meet our budget, but the monthly commitment income deficit to budget was down to \$820/month for April-July, compared to some \$1,300/month for January -March. 



















The UNPLUG event: Circle! Drum, Play & Learn was held on August 26 2023

Six small and eight big kids joined the circle, and drummed and learned and did some playing at this UNPLUG event. A chilly day, so we gathered in the lounge, but the young finished with running outside.

Jessica, BIAK EarlyON program leader, was joined by Kichi Sibi women drummers Nancy, Doreen and Chyvonne. She welcomed all, and encouraged us to choose and pick up a children's drum with care and join in drumming the songs of greeting, busy and quiet day, birthday greetings and goodbye time. Teachings included: all viewed as living - part of the earth, how drum frames are made from certain trees, images on the hide covers, and pictures of and the meaning of the many differing dancer groups who participate in Pow Wows. These were emphasized as being social times of gathering and welcome of old and new friends (including non-Indigenous). We learned about hunter, grass, fancy feather, jingle, shawl and hoop dances, some traditional, and some 'modern', and the symbolism and stories being told.

Each child was given the chance to pick special feathers, representing our relations (eagles) who fly high to Creator, and to choose beads and leather to create a spirit feather to treasure or a friendship feather to give. Selecting 4 beads for the 4 directions, 7 for the 7 grandfather teachings, or 13 for the moons in a year from the many colourful beads took some time and thought! We closed the time together with Phoenix leading the young in a rousing round of the 'Hawk & Mice' game.

Jessica noted with thanks that we were the only Valley church community to invite them and to host their program – so far! Also, we learned that the local library hosts them once a month – at least one child present had been with them in the library, but was happy to be with his grands and siblings and come again. We are very fortunate to have these women share with and welcome us.
