April 2022 - Mission Month at CMC

April brings Easter and the promise of resurrection and new life. It carries with it a reminder that Jesus lived a life of service and love, and calls upon us to do the same. As such, CMC has designated April as a time for you to consider making a financial gift to the mission and service work of CMC.

As is our tradition, two important causes have been identified as deserving of your support at this time, one local and one global.

Acadia Food Pantry: Did you know that some of the communities close to CMC have a high number of people living below the poverty line?

In April 2019, CMC responded to this need arising out of Acadia Place by helping to establish the Acadia Food Pantry to provide free food for our neighbours living with food insecurity. Since then, CMC has been an integral part of this organization and currently ten of our members serve as regular volunteers. In March 2022, the Pantry served 53 households for a total of 151 people.

As a volunteer organization, the Pantry depends fully on donations to operate. In recognition of its third anniversary, we ask you to consider a one time or recurring donation to help the Pantry continue to offer essential food support to families in need. 100% of every donation is used for food and supplies.

Support for Ukraine: Have you been wondering how you can help the people of Ukraine?

Moravian congregations in Europe have answered the call of their Ukrainian neighbours to provide refuge from the devastation of war occurring in their homeland. They have opened their doors and hearts to give sanctuary to those escaping across borders, mostly women, children and the elderly.

One such Moravian congregation in Czech Republic is refurbishing a vacant hotel in their possession in order to house 15 families. Other Moravian congregations in Europe are welcoming families into their homes and putting them up in apartments.

The need within Ukraine is also great. Millions of people are internally displaced and living without adequate food, water and other necessities. Many service agencies are on the ground in Ukraine to help care for those who remain.

The situation in Ukraine is fluid and will have long lasting effects. 100% of donations made to Ukraine through CMC will go towards an area of most need as determined in conjunction with the Moravian Board of World Mission.

Ready to host a Ukrainian refugee family?

Here is what you need to know:

- The Canadian host is expected to:
 - settle a refugee family for free during the period of time the host has initially committed to
 - o meet the refugee family and transport them to the place of their accommodation
 - provide one or two rooms (depending on the host's situation, but in accordance with or exceeding the refugee family's minimal needs)
 - o ensure a dedicated or easily accessible (any time) washroom
 - give access to a sufficiently equipped kitchen to cook their own meals during reasonable periods and at reasonable time during the day
 - o be prepared to provide additional support with meals, if necessary
 - provide a support tour of the community (e.g. buses, how to call a taxi, location of schools, affordable grocery stores, medical services, how to contact emergency services, etc.)
 - o present a clean" police check
