Greetings Friends in Christ:

Adult **Resource Sheet 1**

Focus on John 21:1-19

WHAT is important to know?

- From "Exegetical Perspective," Lewis R. Donelson The meal that Jesus has ready and offers to the disciples serves as the focal point of the encounter. The symbolism and purpose of this meal are not made explicit in the story. There are two somewhat distinct meal trajectories in early Christianity that employ fish and bread. Both Jewish and Christian accounts of eschatological banquets have fish as the main meal. In addition, early Christian iconography tended to picture the Eucharist with images of fish and bread rather than with cup and bread. Whatever the precise symbolism, this is a sacred meal in which Jesus feeds his disciples. Read this way, the story, for all its awkwardness, becomes quite classical in its theology. In the midst of our labor, Jesus calls us and feeds

gathered from our own labor and are given by God.

WHERE is God in these words? - From "Theological Perspective," Joseph A. Bessler If the Beloved Disciple is the first to understand, recognize, or hear the Lord (v. 7)—something that is utterly necessary for faith—such recognition is not yet manifest in action. If Peter is the first to act—which symbolizes for these classic interpreters the human response of committed faith—such action must always be grounded in authentic recognition. Neither understanding nor action alone constitutes authentic faith, and thus one needs to unite the best of Peter and the best of the Beloved Disciple if one is to be a person of true faith.

Jones Surely there is a Beloved Disciple and an overactive Peter in each of us, and this Gospel passage gives us some guidance in surviving, and even overcoming, circumstances that threaten to overwhelm us. NOW WHAT is God's word calling us to do?

The epilogue awakens memories of the darkness—the darkness of our hunger, the darkness of our failure to recognize Christ, the darkness of our denial—but at the same time it reminds us that none of this darkness has overcome the light. For the risen Christ still calls, still feeds, still empowers even doubters and deniers for the ministry. The epilogue tells us: the curtain may have come down on John's narrative, but the real-life drama of Christ is continuing. Everything John has shown you continues past the last scene into the present moment and beyond.

Ready to host a Ukrainian refugee family?

Here is what you need to know:

- The Canadian host is expected to:
 - settle a refugee family for free during the period of time the host has initially committed to
 - o meet the refugee family and transport them to the place of their accommodation
 - provide one or two rooms (depending on the host's situation, but in accordance with or exceeding the refugee family's minimal needs)
 - o ensure a dedicated or easily accessible (any time) washroom
 - give access to a sufficiently equipped kitchen to cook their own meals during reasonable periods and at reasonable time during the day
 - o be prepared to provide additional support with meals, if necessary
 - provide a support tour of the community (e.g. buses, how to call a taxi, location of schools, affordable grocery stores, medical services, how to contact emergency services, etc.)
 - o present a clean" police check
