

Quick Picks: Activities for Kids and Stretched Parents

August 1-7, 2020

WINGED WONDERS!

This morning I watched a mother pigeon fly from a ledge to spikes along an eave t to feed her hungry chick. Ouch! Her body may be soothed when her chick fledges and learns to fly. Right now, it's possible to watch the magic of flight happening all around us.

Who lives where? *3-11* Most of us have seen a robin's nest and know that one of their favorite nesting spots is above an outdoor light so their chicks will stay warm. But what about other birds in our area? Take a look at this video from the Inglewood Bird Sanctuary which asks you to match birds with their eggs and then shows where their nests might be found: https://www.calgary.ca/csps/athome/learning/eggs-and-nests-video.html.

Search out nests in your neighbourhood and along pathways in wooded and water areas of our city. *3-adult* Take pictures, but don't touch. If you're lucky, you might find a bird hatching a second clutch. You may notice hungry chicks. Here's a useful *teen to adult site* that might guide your search: <u>https://nestwatch.org/learn/how-to-nestwatch/how-to-find-nests/</u> Take pictures and sketches, but don't disturb!

See if you can tell what they eat. Do all baby birds eat the same thing?

Discover the peregrine falcon's nest at Craigie Hall or other tall buildings at the University of Calgary. In other years, they have fledged in the first week of August. There are often peregrine nests at the South Calgary Campus, downtown, and at the Foothills Hospital. A sighting is special: Peregrines are endangered. *5-adult*

How do birds fly? : 3-5 <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=djDsm_VOB1Y</u> This video offers a very simple explanation of how birds fly. **3-adult:** Right now, you might just see that happening around us as birds try their wings. Watch a nest containing chicks over several days and see if you can catch their first attempts and first flight. (Some robins are hatching a second clutch right now). I recently watched a young magpie being encouraged to fly by a parent. As dusk approached and the fledgling still hadn't taken flight he was left alone. He must have made it, though. He was gone in the morning.

Caterpillar to Butterfly *9-adult* Enjoy this lively commentary and video of how a caterpillar becomes a butterfly. The caterpillar-to- goo part could be used in a horror flick! <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=euuCrnqEoeU</u> <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=euuCrnqEoeU</u> Fascinating! **Go Butterfly Watching:** *3-adult* I've been seeing a lot of butterflies in gardens and parks lately. Become a butterfly sleuth and track down these common butterflies of Alberta: Google *Common Alberta Butterflies* to access beautiful photos of these insects. It's possible to print the image so you can tick them off when you find them. Here are some pointers: <u>https://www.popsci.com/beginners-guide-butterfly-watching/</u> The best tip is *Don't get up early!*

Save the Monarch! Monarch butterflies can be found in Alberta, mainly on the prairies. Plant milkweed and they may come. You can create your own monarch waystation or simply note where you have observed them. Register your discovery: <u>https://monarchwatch.org/waystations/</u>

Bird bath? Bee Fountain? How about a Butterfly Bath?: 5-adult Build a butterfly bath

Many of our native butterflies are known as puddlers. These butterflies feed on salts and minerals from mud puddles and other water sources.

Bee a polli-neighbour and help our local butterflies by adding a butterfly bath to your yard.



Add a layer of sand and course dirt to a shallow bowl and fill with water until the sand is damp. Add rocks or pebbles for butterflies to land on. Do not overfill your bath, as butterflies cannot land in open water. <u>https://www.calgary.ca/csps/parks/planning-and-operations/all-about-butterflies.html</u>

Butterfly readalong: *3-7* <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=kBi_RoXKVo0</u> The big message is, *Be happy as you are.*" Rhyming and playing with combinations of numbers adding to 10, *Ten Magic Butterflies* may have your child puzzling it out. I would divide up the story for our littlest ones.
