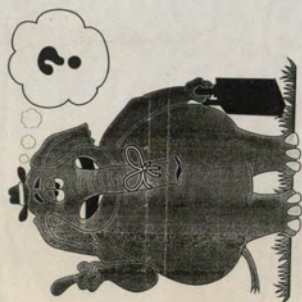

**GENERAL HISTORY**

The Battle Mountain area was the home of the Northern Pacific and Southern Indian tribes in 1824 when James Ogden, a fur trader for the Hudson Bay Company, was one of the first white men to see the potential of the mountain and Battle River. Beginning in 1831, the area was used by trappers and fur traders as a gateway to the west. By 1845 the wagon trail along the foothills of the mountain was well established. Beginning in 1851 the mountain trail was used by pack trains along the mountain trail. A stone cabin was built for the main station at Summitville. This was one of the first buildings in the region, in 1849 and was destroyed at Sutter's Mill in California and the trail along the foothills of the mountain became known as the California Trail. Commerce between 1855 and 1860, there was a market for sheep and the settlement which dates back to the 1850s and the name "Battle Mountain" was born. In 1860 a creek was found through Battle and great wealth accrued.

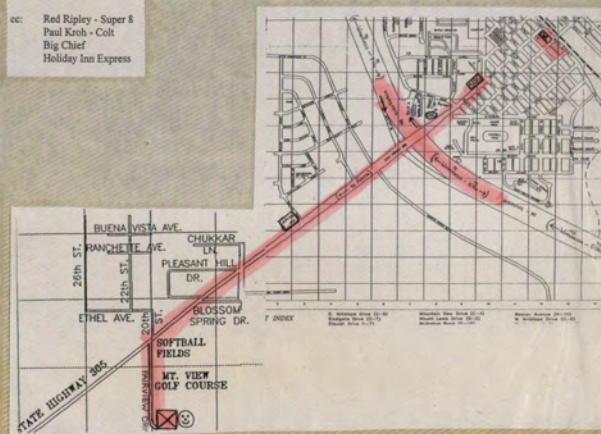
Gold strikes were found in 1862 and were named for Frederick W. Lander, a Civil War hero and leader of a wagon train across Nevada. Lander County originally encompassed the eastern third of the state and was later divided into the counties of Lander, Elko, White Pine, and Esch. The first courts were established in Battleville, and were held at Austin. The courts were moved to Austin in 1863, and to Battle Mountain in 1870.

Nevada became the 30th state of the Union on October 31, 1863. In 1868 gold and silver were discovered in the northeast quadrant of town and the Battle Mountain Mining District was formed. Battleville changed from a small town to the center of Pacific Railroad heading from Virginia over the Nevada River Valley to Austin.

A town site grew at Argenta. The existing Battle Mountain town site was established in the spring of 1870 when people and buildings were moved here from Argenta. In 1880 Battle Mountain had become a regional freight and train center.

In 1877 the Battle Mountain Indian Colony was established on 600 acres west of Battle Mountain. The year 1933 was the year of the opening of the major highways, and the advent of tourism.

Battle Mountain has maintained its reputation over the years due to mining and ranching. At one time Battle Mountain was considered the "Paris of the West". Today, golf, skiing, and battle are the main attractions that are noted in Lander County.

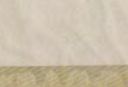

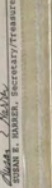

RESOLUTION NO. 96-4

A RESOLUTION SEEKING EQUITABLE AND TIMELY CONSIDERATION IN THE REPORTING OF NET PROCEEDS OF MINES ASSESSED VALUATION PROJECTIONS

WHEREAS, Nevada Counties are currently required to conduct a public hearing on their tentative budget on the 3rd Monday in May, and;

WHEREAS, the Counties' final budget must be adopted by June 1st, and;

WHEREAS, Counties do not receive their final Net Proceeds of Mines Assessed Valuation projections from the Department of Taxation until after June 1st, and;

WHEREAS, the changes experienced by Counties in the Net Proceeds of Mines Assessed Valuation significantly impacts the adopted budget of any County with Net Proceeds of Mines Assessed Valuation, and;

WHEREAS, Counties desire to have all budget information impacting assessed valuation and proposed tax rates available for their May Public Hearing, and to have adequate time to complete their final budgets by June 1st, and to adjust any tax rate as may be necessary due to changes in the Net Proceeds of Mines Assessed Valuation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Fiscal Officers Association of Nevada is most desirous of having the following procedures implemented:

FIRSTLY: All local governments should receive equal consideration in receiving the final Net Proceeds of Mines Assessed Valuation report from the Department of Taxation.

SECONDLY: The final Net Proceeds of Mines Assessed Valuation report should be provided to all local governments prior to the second Monday in May.



**SPEAKER:** Robert Hadfield, NACO Executive Director, spoke on this legislative session. NACO had 10 bill drafts, one of which was the sales tax bill for landfills which has been included in AB 291. This is out of committee and should be out of assembly by next week. He noted that there are attempts to amend this bill to require a vote of the people before implementing the increased sales tax but this amendment will not be approved. He does feel this bill will pass, however, it is important that entities do not begin arguing on who will and who will not get these funds. If this were to happen, this would just be another tax increase with not enough funds for anyone to do anything.

Mr. Hadfield reported that the long term care bill is on hold. Other bills NACO is working on briefly reviewed by Mr. Hadfield.

Mr. Hadfield pointed out that NACO cannot waste it's bill drafts, and they have to have a consensus from all the counties to put together beneficial legislation in the future.

Public records bills reviewed by Mr. Hadfield. He reported that AB 66 is in a political fight and AB 214 will go in its present format (Secretary of State had stated they will look at all the fees being charged for the various records and this should be watched closely). On AB 289, the subcommittee has completed hearings on this and will be starting work sessions next week. He does not believe bill will be "killed" and does not feel it would be in the best interest to "kill" the bill.

Mr. Hadfield stated that he believes all concerns he has been made aware of have been addressed. If anyone has something that concerns them, they should let NACO know right away.

Mr. Hadfield advised that on Welfare Reform, there is disagreement on whether there was ever any county involvement. He noted that legislation will go through but not rapidly. If legislation is not adopted, the State will lose the federal funding.

Humboldt County Recorder/Auditor Evelyn Harmon questioned how Welfare Reform legislation will work in rural counties where there are no HMO's. Mr. Hadfield stated it is felt there will be HMO's that will be interested in providing this service in the rural counties if this legislation is passed.

AB 410 which deals with a health assurance plan also discussed. Mr. Hadfield advised that the Committee is going to be looking for solutions, and any opposition will be requested to submit a better/alternate plan. He noted that if this legislation is put in place, there will be \$48,000,000 in federal funds available to the State.

Mr. Hadfield also reported that SCR 40 which deals with tax distribution is out of the Senate Committee and will be passed by both the Senate and the Assembly.

The PERS post retirement bill is out of the Assembly Committee and will, no doubt, be passed. County budgets will need to be adjusted by 1% to allow for the increase in PERS.

Mr. Hadfield also discussed SB 308. Carson City Treasurer Al Kramer stated that he testified to this and suggested it be amended to read that check cannot be made out to an individual. It was noted that some form of this bill will pass.

Mr. Hadfield requested everyone to work on communications at the County level between elected officials and between elected officials and Commissioners. Everyone needs to work together to address these problem and find a resolution to same.

I also apologize to you for my disposition during the NACO meeting in Elko. I had met with Buz Allen the opening morning and been given information that was extremely upsetting.

I will do my best to explain what has occurred but not to such a detail that you will be reading for an hour. I will schedule time during our 1998 conference in Fallon to answer any particular questions and outline the specifics missing here.

The financial aspect of the CFOA conference in Mesquite was handled solely by Mark Aston in Clark County. Susan Harrer was unable to obtain any information or documentation from Mark for the conference. We had no idea what the costs were or how much money was contributed. After several unsuccessful attempts to resolve this matter with Mark, Susan called me and I became involved in June. Susan finally did get a letter from Mark with a vague accounting. Susan, Karen Dredge and myself decided I would pursue this matter until we had a satisfactory explanation/accounting for our conference.

Even that was less punishment than his victims believed he deserved for violating his oath of office as the public's trust and their own.

He gave the fiscal officers association \$12,500, pocketed \$21,497 and changed numbers to attend the conference, according to Deputy District Attorney Valerie Ashir.

He said he has borrowed the money to pay back the association, but he has not done so. Under the terms of the plea agreement, Aston, 45, resigned from office March 13.

He has not dealt with all my best friends, but that's what you do at work," Douglas County Clerk-Treasurer Barbara Reed told the judge.

"This is one of the most difficult and disturbing occurrences I have ever had to experience in my career," she said. "I respect you as a man I respect, someone I trust and someone I care about."

As a fitting punishment, Reed suggested Aston be made a jail inmate for 30 days in exchange for doing certain duties at the jail so he could learn what it's like to be a inmate. County Clerk Karen Dredge added a personal note: "I hope you can find this whole ordeal less bitter than I recall. I hope you can find it a recalled friend," she told the judge.

After hearing from former Clark County Treasurer Mark Aston's betrayed colleagues, a judge on Thursday handed down the expected sentence of probation and restitution and added an unsuspected term of house arrest and an additional \$5,000 fine he suggested be donated to an institution that studies and promotes ethics.

Aston, who took office in 1986, pleaded guilty in January to a single count of theft for soliciting money from private donors for a conference of the state's County Fiscal Officers Association then keeping the money for himself.

"It's beyond me how you remained in office and collected your salary for the two months since you pleaded guilty," District Judge Joseph Bonaventure said, explaining his decision to levy the fine.

Aston also was ordered to perform community service. He also was ordered to perform community service. He also was ordered to perform community service.

Now she said she realizes she was "used to set up this scam." Aston, 45, was charged with conspiracy to commit theft. We were easy targets," she added.

Mills told the judge Aston had used the association's community service, which was supposed to be something that doesn't belong to him when he was in office.

The judge interrupted him to ask why, if it was so out of character, did he do such a thing. He said he was starting college and he was under financial pressure.

Aston choked back tears as he pleaded guilty. He said that the money he took did not come from the association.

"As far as the treasurer's office is concerned, I served that office humbly. I left that office in excellent standing. I was a member at the center of ethics questions and investigations. A county internal audit found that I had personally spent \$40,000 that should have gone into the county's general fund. Most of that money has not been returned."

Six years later, a new audit alleged he used interest from probate taxes for personal expenses.

After the hearing, Aston took out his wallet and tried to pay the \$25 fine. The judge said the fine was declined. He then tried to apologize to the judge personally but she stopped him. She said she had only one question: "Why did you do that?"

Your Honor. I am Barbara Reed, President of County Fiscal Officers Association of the State of Nevada and Douglas County Clerk-Treasurer. I have with me today, Karen Dredge, Immediate Past President of the County Fiscal Officers Association and Elko County Clerk and Alan Glover, 1st Vice President of the County Fiscal Officers Association and Carson City Clerk-Recorder.

County Fiscal Officers Association of Nevada (CFOA) has about 120 members, made up of the elected County Clerks, Recorder/Auditors, Treasurers and the appointed Comptrollers, Fiscal Officers, Registrar of Voters and our appointed deputies. Our association has been in existence since 1946.

This has been one of the most difficult and disturbing occurrence I have ever had to experience in my professional life. I can not remember any incident that has impacted me more than this one has.

I am not standing here before you today because of the money. The significance of this issue is of much greater importance than the dollars that were embezzled. Mr. Aston used his position as the Clark County Treasurer and as a past president of County Fiscal Officers Association for his own benefit. This is not just a Clark County issue nor is it just an issue involving the State of Nevada. Contributions were also solicited from California, New York, Pennsylvania and Texas.

I believe with all my heart this was a pre-meditated act. Mr. Aston opened a separate checking account in February, 1997 under the name of County Fiscal Officers Association. He used his home mailing address and was the sole signer on this account. This was done without the knowledge or consent of any other officer or member of CFOA. Almost immediately after opening this checking account Mr. Aston started to withdraw funds.

Mr. Aston solicited in excess of \$32,000 from over 30 businesses that trusted and believed in him. Why would he do this when the cost of our conferences in the past have been between \$16,000 and \$20,000 unless it was a premeditated act? How greedy was Mr. Aston? Well, in addition, he charged the members of CFOA and representatives from various companies \$45.00 each (totaling approx. \$2,000) for a golf tournament that had already been sponsored. He also lied and misrepresented information to our Treasurer to obtain additional funds from our organization in excess of \$3,000.00. When our Treasurer asked for an accounting and then when I asked for an accounting he blatantly lied and attempted to cover-up the truth.

Your Honor, I have experienced almost every emotion possible. First, I believed there had to be some reasonable explanation, then it went to disbelief, dismay, hurt, anger, embarrassment, frustration, outrage and insult. How could a man I respected, a man I felt was a friend, someone that I trusted and admired embezzle, lie and cheat? I have now worked my way through most of the emotional upheaval, I now can look at this issue in black and white. Time has allowed me to evaluate this incident in it's entirety. And that, your Honor, is why I am here today - to address what I believe is the true impact of this whole unfortunate occurrence.

Mr. Aston was an elected official. When he took office he took an Official Oath of the State of Nevada. That Oath, the same one you and I also took, states:

"I do solemnly swear that I will support, protect and defend the Constitution and government of the United States, and the Constitution and government of the State of Nevada, against all enemies, whether domestic or foreign, and that I will bear true faith, allegiance and loyalty to the same, any ordinance, resolution or law of any State notwithstanding, and that I will well and faithfully perform all the duties of the office of - - - on which I am about to enter, so help me God; under the pains and penalties of perjury."


You Honor, Mr. Aston took that Official Oath and violated it as far as I am concerned. He not only showed disrespect for the oath he took he abused the trust placed in him by the people of Clark County. When someone is elected to public office they should be held to a higher standard of accountability, they should be expected and held to a higher level of integrity and honesty, they should be the positive role models for future generations. That truly is what this issue is all about - an elected official violating the law, breaking public trust and defacing his office, his position, the association he belonged to. He used banking institutions, financial agencies, businesses, companies and friends for his own personal gain. An elected officer is to serve the public, not that the public is to serve that elected officer. This conduct is an insult to every elected officer in the State of Nevada and to every public employee. Mr. Aston's actions showed he has no respect for the law, for the office he was elected to hold, for his employees, his county or state and certainly no respect for his family.

To date I have yet to hear why Mr. Aston did what he did. I have heard only excuses, speculation and not any plausible explanation. Mr. Aston needs to be held accountable for his actions. Your Honor, you have it within your power to assist Mr. Aston in learning the lesson of his conduct. Public service, in my opinion, means - you are to serve the public in the highest standards and most beneficial means for the public.

As President of CFOA and on behalf of our membership I respectfully request the Court to sentence Mr. Aston to a minimum of 6 months county jail time, to serve as a trustee - maybe then Mr. Aston would find some of the truth in what public service means.

24 hours of community service each month of his probation — twice the usual amount handed down.

That was less punishment, though, for a man believed to be dishonest for receiving his wealth of oil, the public's trust and more.

He gave the fiscal officers association \$25,000, paid out \$25,000 and made up the difference by charging members to attend the conference, according to Deputy District Attorney Victoria Adams. His attorney, Leonard Mills, said he has borrowed the money to pay back the association, which he will do immediately.

Under the terms of the plea agreement, Aston, 41, resigned from office March 15. "I believe with all my heart that this was a premeditated act," Douglas County Clerk-Treasurer Barbara Olsen told the judge of Aston's scheme.

"This is one of the most difficult and disturbing occurrences I have ever had to experience in my professional life. How could a man I respected, someone I treated as an employer, be so dishonest?" asked Olsen, who is the association's president.

As a firing purchase, Olsen suggested Aston be made a jail convict, an inmate with certain privileges, in exchange for being charged with the jail so he could serve the public.

Clark County Clerk Warren Stegwe added a personal note: "I see the one person through this whole ordeal being betrayed as his ex-employer," she told the judge.

Now she said she realizes she was "used to set up this scam." In Aston, "we were family, country-foreigner in clerks. We were very much," she added.

Mills said the judge Aston had a long history of community service. "It is an act of desperation that he would take something that doesn't belong to him when he gives so much of his time." The judge instructed Olsen to ask why, if it was an act of desperation, did he do the work. Olsen responded that Aston's duties were starting to pile up and he was under financial pressure.

Aston checked back here as he apologized "humbly" to the association, then stressed that the money he took did not come from taxpayers.

"As far as the treasurer's office is concerned, I retired that office in 1980. I never did any of the (today's) good things," he said. Since 1980, Aston has been at the center of ethics questions and controversies. A county internal audit in 1980 showed he improperly spent \$40,000 that should have gone into the county's general fund. Most of that money has not been accounted for.

Misled associates of a former county treasurer think he deserves a more severe penalty for theft.

After hearing from former Clark County Treasurer Mark Aston's interested colleagues, a judge on Thursday handed down the expected sentence of probation and restitution and added an unanticipated term of house arrest and an additional \$1,000 fine he suggested be donated to an institution that studies and promotes ethics.

Aston, who took office in 1980, pleaded guilty in January to a single count of theft for skimming money from general funds for a multitude of the state's County Fiscal Officers Association then helping the money for himself.

"I've heard we have you mentioned in office and collected your salary for the two months since you pleaded guilty," District Judge Joseph B. Boushara said, explaining his decision to levy the fine. Aston also was ordered to perform
