# A BRIEF HISTORY OF FALLON



Fallon Court House

Fallon can trace its roots back to the California Gold Rush. Settlers making their way West were thankful to have survived the journey across the infamous "40-Mile Desert," the most treacherous stretch along the Emigrant Trail.

These settlers rested along the banks of the Carson River at a place known as Ragtown (so named for the rag and wagon) just down the road from present day Fallon. Ragtown became a trading outpost. The Pony Express skirted the area in the 1860's followed closely by the Overland Telegraph. Some scattered farms and freight stations marked this early area.

At the turn of the century, the Newlands Project, the largest reclamation project in the United States, diverted waters from the Truckee and Carson Rivers to reclaim the land from the desert, giving life to Fallon farms and ranches.

Fallon grew amidst the farms and ranches. The area experienced mining booms and agricultural

**Location:** 25 miles east of Fallon, Nevada on U.S. Highway 50.  
**Size:** 600 feet high and 2.5 miles long.  
**Discovered:** Exact date unknown. The first written description was in 1883. It was first surveyed between 1868 and 1883, however.  
**Fun Fact:** One of the residents of Sand Mountain is the Sand Mountain blue butterfly which feeds on buckwheat.  
**Visitors:** Over 35,000 people visit the mountain annually.

Darrel Daines, Nevada's elected State Controller has served the people of Nevada since 1968, first as the appointed Comptroller of Clark County (Metropolitan Las Vegas) through 1982. Daines was elected Nevada State Controller in November, 1982, and is now in his third four-year term.

As Nevada's first County Comptroller, Daines was not only the Chief Fiscal Officer for Clark County, but directed the development of the data processing department during a critical period of growth.

Described by his associates as a person who works effectively behind the scenes to fulfill the duties of his office, he has been praised as a man of "genuine dedication to his responsibilities." With few exceptions, Daines can always be found behind his desk directing the activities of his office.

resulted in speeding up construction of nine major highway projects. This has not only saved the state millions of dollars, but relieved serious traffic and pollution problems.

Daines has served as President of the National Association of State Controllers and is now President-elect of the National Association of State Auditors, Comptrollers and Treasurers.

He presently serves as a member of Nevada's State Board of Finance and in past years he has served as Chairman of the Board of the State's Public Employees Retirement System, a member of the Advisory Committee to the State Department of Taxation, and a member of a Legislative interim study committee on Local Government Finance.

Daines is a past Chairman of the Board of the Nevada division of the American Cancer Society and is now a member of the National Board of Directors of the American Cancer Society.

## Something about tiny Nevada town keeps people coming back

**GOLDFIELD (AP)** — There is no gas station here, nor a bank, a grocery store, a newspaper, or even an all-night diner. But despite plenty of good reasons to die, this town refuses.

"Goldfield," said Slim Simes, the town's resident folk artist, comedian and all-around eccentric, "the property taxes are low, you can do anything you want within reason, and, well, one thing leads to another."

Simes, who lives in a trailer on the edge of town, will give free tours of what once was the most populous place in Nevada to practically anyone who asks. Along with Chamber of Commerce historian Virginia Ridgway, he'll tell stories about ghosts in the once-opulent Goldfield Hotel, the 1923 fire that nearly flattened the town, and the horrible Melanie Griffith sci-fi flick that was filmed here back in the '80s.

Faded and falling, most of the buildings in Goldfield aren't really buildings anymore; they're artifacts. There's the brothel on Main Street, the remains of the Sideboard Saloon just down the road and the rotting Goldfield High School over on Euclid Avenue.

But the town, which just celebrated its 100th birthday, is home to more than fading history. It is a town rich in characters, such as Simes, a 72-year-old handyman who, on first glance, seems little more than a mop of shaggy gray hair, thick glasses and corny jokes.

He points to the fading Chevrolet pickup in his driveway with three families of ducks waddling across the hood. "People ask what it is. I tell them, 'Oh, it's a '76 Chevy. The '73 didn't come with ducks.'"

The ducks aren't real. Simes

made them out of shredded aluminum cans, a skill he has turned into an accepted art form.

Simes, a registered Libertarian and a folk artist in the sense that he creates art from junk, will tell you if you ask — or even if you don't — that he's been in this tiny town for 25 years and doesn't plan on leaving anytime soon.

Just as Simes became fascinated with the town's history, so have others who find themselves drawn here.

"The more history I read on this place — the whole town — it's unbelievable," said Alan Wheeler, a Las Vegas businessman who owns property in Goldfield.

Goldfield, about 25 miles south of Tonopah on U.S. Highway 95, and halfway between Reno and Las Vegas, was founded in 1902 with the discovery of one of the largest deposits of gold in the United States.

Word spread quickly, drawing miners by the thousands. Prospectors reaped millions of dollars in gold from the ground and by 1909 there were 21,000 registered male voters in town, according to Ridgway.

During its heyday, Ridgway said, Goldfield was home to hundreds of brothels, five banks, several newspapers and a few famous people. One was Virgil Earp, brother of celebrated sheriff Wyatt Earp. The town's notables also included Tex Rickard, who would go on to build the original Madison Square Garden, and Jim Casey, founder of United Parcel Service.

Rickard showed his confidence that Goldfield was destined to become a major metropolis by promoting a prize fight there between Joe Gans and champion Oscar "Battling" Nelson in 1906.

An 8,000-seat arena was built for the fight, and nearly twice

that many turned out. The fans got their money's worth as the bout went 42 rounds, a record that still stands in the Guinness Book of World Records.

Gans won the fight when Nelson was disqualified. Legend has it that Nelson purposely threw a low blow.

The next year, Goldfield was named the seat of Esmeralda County, and a fantastic courthouse was built. It's still there and in use.

The lavish Goldfield Hotel opened in 1908 with 150 rooms, gold-leaf ceilings in the lobby and bar, and electric lights and a telephone in every room. The hotel imported chefs from Europe — "some of them didn't even speak English," Ridgway said — and had one of the only electric elevators west of the Mississippi.

The town was connected to the rest of the country by five railroads, needed to ship out the gold.

But the strength of Goldfield would soon lead to its demise.

When gold became harder to find, miners left for newer strikes in less established places. Mining companies were consolidating, meaning prospectors had little hope of striking it rich on their own.

By 1910, the town had dwindled from more than 20,000 to fewer than 5,000. Only 1,500 were left by 1920.

On July 6, 1923, Goldfield was dealt a near-fatal blow when a moonshine still exploded across the street from the hotel. The wind that day was ferocious, and in the end, 54 blocks burned to the ground, displacing 150 families.

"The town never recovered," Ridgway said.

Fewer than 1,000 people were left by 1930, and a paltry 184 people called Goldfield home in 1960.

The once-booming town had become a ghost.

"There was great massive wealth taken out of there," said Roderick Myers, whose great-uncle, Al Myers, is considered the town's founder. "The people that did it sacked that place and left."

Goldfield today is home to about 300 people. It remains the seat of Esmeralda County, Nevada's least-populated county with 971 residents.

In recent years, something strange has been happening in Goldfield. People are moving here, at least part time.

"There's something that will draw you," said Myers, 69, who spends many weekends here. "Is there a spell on the place? I don't know. I've never seen any ghosts there. But there's definitely something that draws you."

Renovations have begun on the 1907 high school, part of which has started to collapse. The hotel, closed since the 1940s, has been partially renovated but the investor ran out of money.

But don't feel sorry for the people who live here. They're impressed by their town. They'll brag that "Cherry 2000," the 1987 Griffith movie about androids, love and guns, was filmed here, though they might chuckle and admit it wasn't very good.

John Butler, a sheriff's deputy, left his \$60,000-a-year job in Las Vegas for Goldfield and never looked back.

He said he doesn't mind that his paycheck is half what it once was.

"It's like a little piece of heaven," he said.

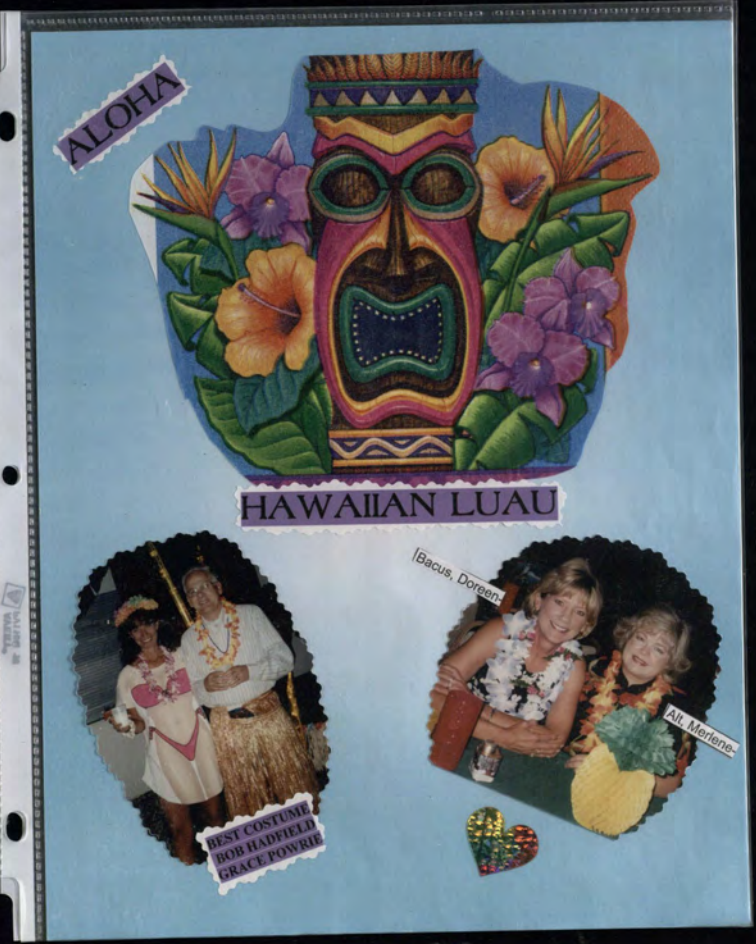

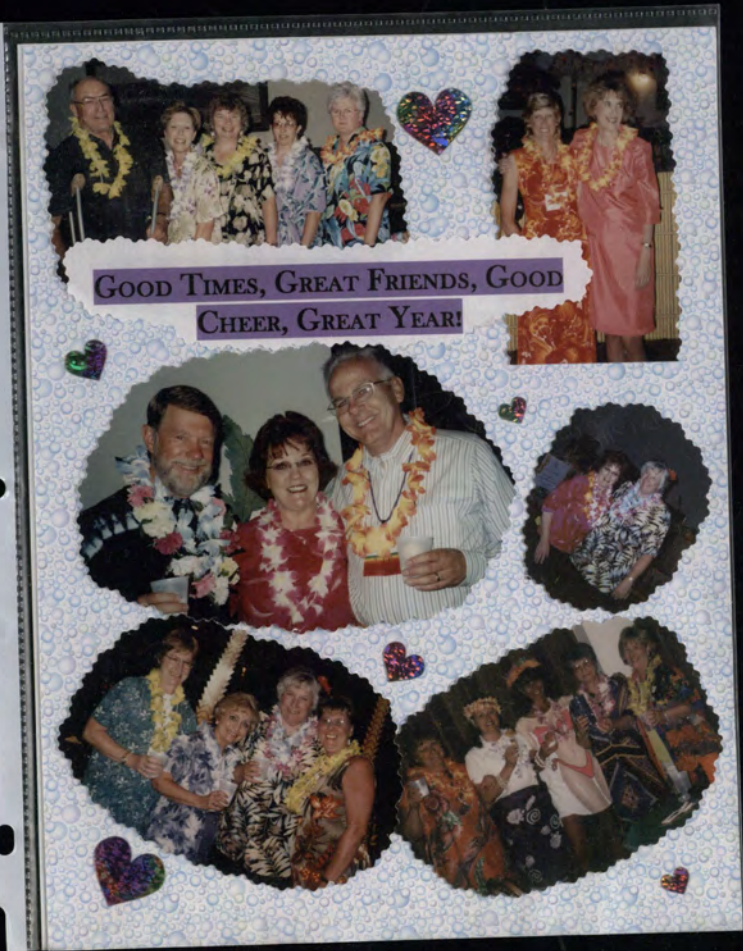
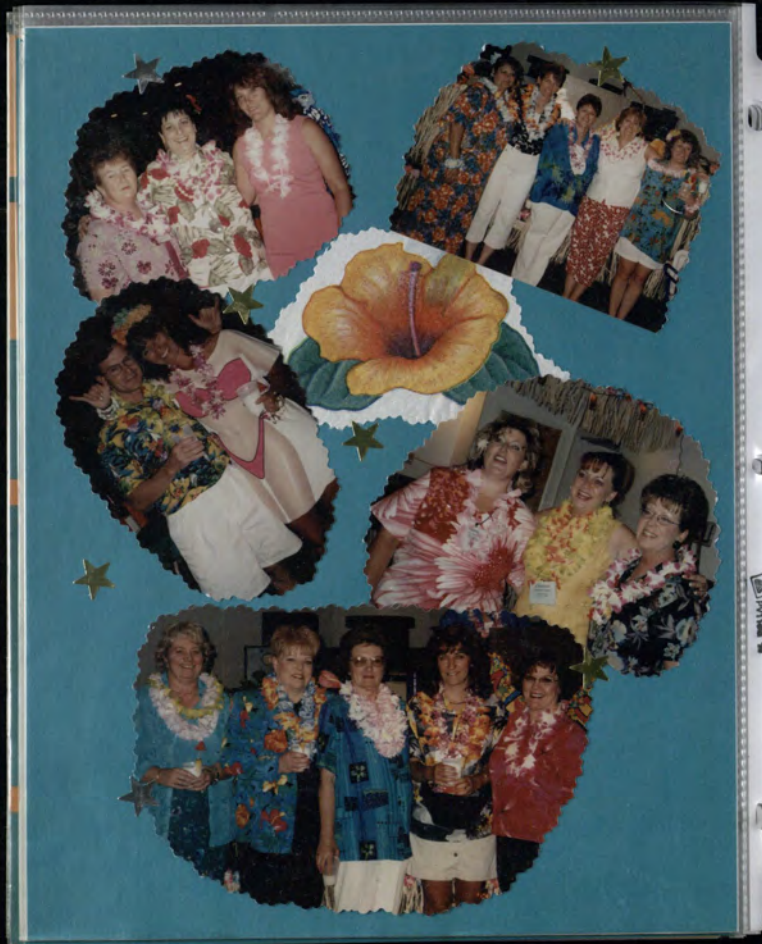
