Sunday June 29th 2025 Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul

(ACTS 12:1-11, 2TIM 4:6-8,17-18, MT 16:13-19)

THEME: THE TRIUMPH OF GRACE

Conquered for Victory: Peter was untutored by human rating, but the grace of divine illumination gave him superior knowledge. He was the first to acknowledge the true identity of Christ, Son of the living God. A man of questionable academic credentials was under the power of divine grace in possession of superior knowledge. A mere weakling that denied his master before a slave girl but later stood before nobles in defense of the gospel. His human weaknesses before the power of grace gives way to bravery. Simon is overpowered that Peter the rock may emerge. This explains why we take up a new name at confirmation, yielding our natural selves to the power of the Holy Spirit to produce in us a new image.


Likewise, Saul was fanatical in his beliefs in Judaism and avid in his convictions. In terms of natural and social credentials, he was high-ranking. In his cause of persecution of the church, he had the elite approval and conviction of conscience. However, at the illumination of the heavenly light, he was overpowered. He counted everything he earlier cherished as a mere thrash: "I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ" (Phil. 3:8). In his new life, the former persecutor of the faith becomes a vigorous preacher of the gospel.



The duo of Peter and Paul were conquered by the power of God's grace that they may become instruments of victory in the hands of God. The first victory

lies in conquering the self. This is the fruit of grace but demands our cooperation. We have our individual weaknesses, temperamental dispositions and natural biases like Soul and Simon. When, however, they surrendered to the power of God and his will, they became completely new persons: saints Peter and Paul.
